### Former President Wins the Prize for Peace

Former U.S. President Jimmy Carter won the 2002 Nobel Peace Prize for his dedication and tireless work seeking peaceful solutions and promoting social justice. Mr. Carter heads up the Carter Center in Atlanta, Georgia, an organization devoted to global peace.

#### Whistleblowers Heard Loud and Clear

Cynthia Cooper of WorldCom, Coleen Rowley of the FBI, and Sherron Watkins of Enron were chosen *Time* magazine's "Persons of the Year" for their role in revealing deceit in corporate and federal American institutions.



#### First Lady Tours with Sniper Victim

First Lady Laura Bush visited a hospital in Washington, DC with 13-year-old sniper victim Iran Brown. Ten other victims were killed and another two were wounded.



### Senate Majority Shift

In the landmark November elections, U.S. Senate control shifted to the Republican party. This marks the first time since Dwight Eisenhower was President that a President's party held a seat majority in both the House and the Senate.



#### Around the World in 19,250 Miles

After 6 unsuccessful attempts, balloonist Steve Fossett became the first person to complete a solo journey around the world in a balloon. In addition, Fossett broke the duration record for one person by staying aloft for 14 days and 20 hours.

#### Trailblazers Remembered

The bicentennial of the Lewis and Clark expedition officially kicked off in Virginia. Accompanied by Sacagawea, their



interpreter, Lewis and Clark blazed a trail from St. Louis to the Pacific coast from 1803 to 1806.



#### Corporate Wrongdoers: Take Note!

U.S. President George Bush signed into law the monumental Accounting Industry Reform Act. This law created a special board to monitor the accounting industry in hopes of preventing foul play in the boardroom.

#### **Looking for Weapons**

During U.S. President Bush's 2003 State of the Union address, he stated to the country, "If Saddam Hussein does not fully disarm, for the safety of our people, and for the peace of the world, we will lead a coalition to disarm him."

#### With Help from Above

After spending 77 hours trapped 240 feet below the surface, 9 Pennsylvania coal miners were brought safely to the surface by heroic rescue workers.



#### **Beloved Brits**

Britain's 101-year-old Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother of England, died peacefully in her sleep on March 30.



#### Pledge of Allegiance Silenced

In a 2-1 decision, the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that the Pledge of Allegiance cannot be recited in public schools due to the potential violation of the constitutional separation of church and state. Opponents plan to appeal the decision.




#### **Ground Zero** Remembered

After 9 months of excruciating clean-up efforts, the site of the 9-11 terrorists attacks was cleared. In a May 30 ceremony, officials marked the end of search and rescue efforts and the beginning of a National Memorial to be constructed at the New York site.




#### On the Waterfront

U.S. President Bush invoked the Taft-Hartley Act for the first time in 24 years to end a crippling 10-day dock workers' strike on the west coast. More than \$300 billion in goods pass through the ports each year.

#### A Tragic Loss

On February 1, 2003 the U.S. space shuttle Columbia broke apart while reentering the Earth's atmosphere on its way to Florida for landing, leaving no survivors. The seven-member crew personified the shuttle program's ideal of the modern NASA astronaut.

#### Chipping In

VeriChip, a microchip containing personal identification information, is injected under the skin. Virtually undetectable, the chip may be used for financial and transportation security, building access, as well as military and government security purposes.

#### Mosquito Bite Turns Deadly

Spread by ticks and mosquitoes, the West Nile Virus outbreak of 2002 killed more than 200 Americans and infected about 3,400 more with viral encephalitis, a deadly disease of the brain.




#### A New Wrinkle

BOTOX®, a purified form of the toxin that causes botulism, was approved by the Food and Drug Administration as a cosmetic. When injected, BOTOX temporarily reduces wrinkles in the face by paralyzing muscles in the forehead and around the eyes.



#### Chinese Poised to Take Giant Leap for Mankind

After the successful launch of its fourth unmanned space capsule, China prepares to launch its first person into space. The Chinese Taikonaut would join the ranks of U.S. Astronauts and Russian Cosmonauts.



#### **RNA** Has its Day

The huge, newly discovered role of ribonucleic acid (RNA) in determining genetics led to its being named the number one Scientific Breakthrough of the Year by Science magazine.



#### Scram Jet

A revolutionary new jet plane flew above the South Australian Desert at seven times the speed of sound... without using a drop of jet fuel! Powered by oxygen that it scoops out of the air, the HyShot scramjet could some day fly from Tokyo to New York City in just two hours!



#### Food for Thought

New guidelines were issued to animal drug makers by the Food and Drug Administration addressing concerns that animal antibiotics are being passed to people through food. Scientists fear that through the overuse of antibiotics in animals, bacteria harmful to people could result in humans developing immunity to treatment.



A federal bill banning all forms of human cloning, including efforts used for promising stem cell research, was passed in the House but defeated by Democrats in the Senate.



#### Another International Space Station Visitor

South African millionaire Mark Shuttleworth became the world's second-paying space passenger when the Russian *Soyuz TM-33* spacecraft landed May 5 near the Kazakh town of Arkalyk.





Dinosaurs from Space?!

Iridium, a mineral plentiful in asteroids. was recently discovered in sediments that are 200 million years old. That's just when the dinosaurs started to evolve rapidly and began to dominate the planet. It makes you wonder if dinosaurs were really from around here.



#### A Real Lightweight

Used by NASA to trap tiny airborne particles in space, Aerogel (which looks like frozen smoke) has been certified as the lightest solid in the world.



Two British researchers have developed a prototype "phone tooth" that, when implanted into a molar, translates phone messages into vibrations. These vibrations travel from your tooth to your inner ear where only you can hear them.




#### Armstrong is "Touriffic"



#### **Black Tide of Death**

The aging single-hull oil tanker Prestige broke in two and sank off the coast of Spain, flooding nearly 200 miles of shoreline with nearly three million gallons of oil. If the leak isn't stopped, it has the potential to be twice the size of the 1989 Exxon Valdez disaster.



For the first time in over 60 years, Jupiter, Mars, Saturn, Mercury, and Venus formed what appeared to be a nearly straight line in the night sky of 2002. The next time this happens will be in 2040!



#### More Monkeys in the Barrel

Two new species of monkeys were discovered in Brazil's Amazon rainforest-the Callicebus bernhardi and the Callicebus stephennashi. The discovery of these kitten-sized creatures brings Brazil's total number of unique primate species to 95, more than any other country.

#### A Reoccurring Tragedy of Huge Proportions

Dozens of whales repeatedly beached themselves on the sand of Cape Cod where shallow waters and shifting sands are especially treacherous for whales, which use echolocation navigating systems. Many were saved but others weren't so lucky.

In January 2003. while most of the states east of the Rockies saw temperatures well below normal, it


