United States Goes to War in Iraq

Leading a coalition of forces, the United States and Great Britain invaded Iraq and captured Saddam Hussein. Resistance continued after the capture amid continuing questions about weapons of mass destruction. President Bush surprised troops with a Thanksgiving visit and the United States soldier was named Time Magazine's Person of the Year. Back home, security alert levels were raised and international flights cancelled due to suspected terrorist threats.


Queen Mary 2 Sets Sail Four football fields long and 23





After a seven-month voyage, "Spirit," NASA's Mars Exploration rover, successfully landed on the Red Planet. Its primary mission - to search for answers about the history of water, and possibly life, on Mars.

Concorde Grounded

After more than three decades of luxury travel, the supersonic Concorde airliners were grounded for good citing failing revenues and rising costs. Cruising at around 1,350 mph at an altitude of up to 60,000 ft. (11 miles), the Concorde carried jet setters, celebrities and royalty from Europe to New York in less than three-anda-half hours.


Chinese in Orbit Over First Manned Space Flight

Chinese astronaut, Lt. Col. Yang Liwei orbited Earth 14 times before the 38-year-old former fighter pilot brought his spacecraft in for a near-perfect landing just five kilometers (three miles) from his target. The flight makes China only the third country in the world to launch a manned spacecraft into orbit.



Super Trio Share Nobel Physics Prize ▶

Alexei Abrikosov, Anthony Leggett and Vitaly Ginzburg won the 2003 Nobel Prize in physics for their work in superconductivity and superfluidity – two areas of quantum physics that study the bizarre activity of matter at extremely low temperatures.



The Oldest Planet Yet

Astronomers have detected the most ancient planet yet known orbiting a binary system thousands of light-years away. The new discovery indicates that planet formation in the Milky Way may have started sooner and been more widespread than previously believed.

Chip Has a Long Memory

A prototype computer memory chip could store information using hundreds of billions of nanotubes. Once fully developed, the nanoscale random access memory (NRAM) could hold 10 gigabits of data and would be non-volatile, meaning data would not be lost when the power is turned off.



Turning Off the Light

Physicists say they have brought light — which travels at a speed of 186,000 miles per second — to a complete halt for a fraction of a second and then sent it on its way. It's possible this achievement could someday help scientists develop powerful new computers.



Oldest Marsupial Fossil Found in China

Amateur fossil hunters helped discover a near complete skeletal fossil of the oldest known ancestor to kangaroos, koalas, possums and wombats. The remains of the chipmunk-size marsupial ancestor were dug up from 125-million-year-old shales in northeastern China.


Galileo Ends its Jupiter Voyage with a Big Bang




San Antonio Spurs Ride Away with the NBA Championship



Deadly European Heat Wave

Heads Up!

Record temperatures around Europe during August claimed over 35,000 lives. France suffered the most casualties as temperatures broke the 100 degree mark for the first time in several decades. United Kingdom fatalities were estimated to be over 2,000, with London registering its first-ever 100 degree plus temperature.

The biggest hailstone ever recorded in the United States fell in Aurora, Nebraska. About the size of a soccer ball, the record-setting hailstone measured over seven inches in diameter - even after losing nearly half of its mass upon landing on the rain gutter of a house. Hail causes nearly one billion

dollars in damage to property and crops annually.



The Big Squeeze

Villagers on the Indonesian island of Java caught a live reticulated python that measured 49 ft. long and weighed in at 985 pounds according to a local government official. Prior to this, the Guinness Book of World Records lists the longest snake ever captured to be 32 ft.



Flying Sharks!

Near Cape Town, South Africa, giant sharks including Great White sharks and Orcas can be seen hurtling through the air as they rocket with great velocity from murky depths to catch seals near the surface. The phenomenon is best seen near Seal Island, when seals cross deep water to approach or leave their island sanctuary.



Killer Fires Burn Through California A

Over a dozen wildfires raged through California from Simi Valley to San Diego, charring more than 1,000,000 acres and killing at least 22 people. Fueled by dry conditions and fanned by fierce Santa Ana winds of 50-60 mph, the fires were the worst in the past 10 years.



Census of Marine Life A

The Census of Marine Life is a multinational research program seeking to assess the diversity, distribution and abundance of ocean life and discover how it changes over time. The Census has been underway for three years and is scheduled to run until 2010. So far, researchers have found hundreds of new species of fish, plants and animals.



The Red Planet




Iran Hit by Massive Quake


New Dinosaur Species Found



CDs play from the center to the edge, rotating at a speed varying from 400 times a minute at the beginning to 250 times a minute at the end. Read by a red light laser that makes over 44,000 arithmetical calculations every second, the music on a CD is imprinted in the form of "pits" (small depressions of varying length) on a spiral track 3.52 miles long. Average CDs contain approximately 16,000,000,000 pits, each one about 700 times smaller than a pinprick!



The New Color of Money

The most secure currency in United States history was introduced into the economy as a newly redesigned, colorful \$20 bill was issued by the Federal Reserve System to help protect against counterfeiting. It was the first time in modern history that United States currency featured background colors other than black and green.
