
The D.A.R.E. Officers conducted a good program again this year. Each week the fifth graders were instructed on the importance of obstaining from drugs, alcohal, and violence.















































#### PTO IN A FLASH





#### Hurricane Katrina Strikes with a Vengeance

Hurricane Katrina slammed into the Gulf Coast with 140 mile-per-hour winds on the morning of August 29. Katrina is reputed to be the most destructive and costliest natural disaster in United States history. Estimated costs are in the billions.

#### First Lady of Civil Rights Movement is Revered

Coretta Scott King, the widow of Martin Luther King Jr., died on January 31 at the age of 78. Coretta was a champion for civil rights, disability rights, women's rights and many other causes. As for bringing about great change, she has said, "You must change yourself so that you're prepared to lead people in the direction they should go."



#### Nazi Hunter Wiesenthal Dies

Holocaust survivor Simon Wiesenthal, who helped bring more than 1,100 Nazi war criminals to justice after World War II, died on September 20 at the age of 96. The United Nations declared January 27 as the first International Holocaust Remembrance Day. The date is significant in Holocaust history because it commemorates the liberation anniversary of Auschwitz, the Nazi death camp, in 1945.

#### Subway Blasts Rock London

Three explosions on London subway trains and a fourth explosion on a bus killed at least 52 and injured 700 people on July 7. Prime Minister Tony Blair suspected terrorists were responsible for the attacks.




#### **G8 Pledges Relief**

The group of eight industrialized nations (68) comprised of Canada, France, Germany, Japan Italy, United Kingdom, United States, and Russia, agreed to full cancellation of debt owed by 18 poor countries. In addition, G8 pledged to double its aid to Africa by donating \$50 billion by the year 2010.

#### Taking a Stand Meant Keeping a Seat

Rosa Parks, whose act of civil disobedience in 1955 sparked the modern civil rights movement, died October 24 at the age of 92. Parks was arrested after refusing to give up her bus seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama.



#### West Virginia Miners Remembered

Early on the morning of January 2, 2006, an explosion at the Sago Mine in West Virginia trapped 13 coal miners. The miners were 260 feet underground when the accident occurred. Twenty-seven-year-old Randal McCloy was the sole survivor.



#### Iraqis Cast Historic Votes

In December, the United Iraqi Alliance won the country's general elections, although it failed to gain an absolute majority in parliament. A coalition is likely to be formed with other ethnic groups including the Kurdish alliance. Sunni Arabs also gained seats over the previous balloting. U.S. officials hope that favorable results from the elections will strengthen Iraq's government and help to move along the withdrawal of U.S. troops



#### Change is the Verdict for Supreme Court

On September 3, Supreme Court chief justice William Rehnquist died of thyroid cancer. Judge John Roberts was named as his startless of thyroid cancer. Judge John Roberts was named as his replacement on September 30. Sandra Day O'Connor, who had announced her retirement in July, agreed to stay until another justice was appointed.

#### The World Says Goodbye to Pope John Paul II

Pope John Paul II is credited with leading the world's approximately 1 billion Catholics for 26 years. Known as a champion for human freedom, the well-respected Pope died April 2 at the age of 84. On April 24, former Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger of Germany was installed as Pope Benedict XVI.



#### Palestinians Regain Gaza Strip

Despite some resistance, most of the 17 Jewish settlements in the Gaza Strip were evacuated peacefully in mid-August. Israel plans to return control of the Gaza Strip to the Palestinians after an occupation that has lasted since the 1967 Six-Day War.



### Gasoline Prices Caught Up in Hurricane Turmoil

Damage caused by Hurricane Katrina reduced oil production for many facilities. Gas prices soared across the country and averaged about \$2.60 nationwide. In the last year, gas prices increased 40 percent.



#### Mission: Successful

With the touchdown of the Space Shuttle Discovery on August 9, NASA completed its first shuttle mission since Columbia broke apart during re-entry in February 2003. The mission was deemed successful, although Astronaut Steve Robinson made some repairs to the shuttle's exterior while in orbit.



#### Americans Among Nobel Prize Winners

Two Americans and a German won the Nobel Prize in physics for pioneering research involving the behavior of light and its use for creating precise measuring techniques. Also, two Americans and a French scientist won the prize for chemistry with the development of a process that causes molecules to swap atoms. This molecular reaction is used to create medicines, plastics, and other products with more efficiency and less environmental hazard.



#### Women in Power

Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, a Harvard-trained banker and survivor of Liberia's brutal politics, took the oath of office to become Africa's first woman to be elected female head of state. In Chile, Michelle Bachelet was elected as the country's first female president. Her first fulfilled campaign promise was splitting the Cabinet down the middle to equally represent both genders, and women were appointed to half of the 20 seats.

# america \* responds to katrina victims



Through agencies including the American Red Cross, U.S. citizens responded to the needs of Hurricane Katrina victims. More than 2,500 truckloads of food, 4,500 health professionals and 220,000 volunteers made their way to the gulf coast. The Red Cross mounted the largest relief effort in its 125-year history to provide food, shelter, health care and relief supplies as well as to reconnect loved ones.



Kids from all over the U.S. pulled together to aid victims in the gulf coast. By collecting money, food and supplies, kids sent much needed relief to families devastated by the hurricanes. Once again, kids have shown how much they care by taking amazing steps to make a difference.



Hurricane Katrina caused many people to lose track of their loved ones—including their pets. When owners were forced to rapidly evacuate their homes, many pets were stranded or left behind. Organizations from all over the country sent volunteers to rescue animals and provided needed care before reuniting them with their families. The Humane Society of the United States donated over \$4 million in grants to gulf coast animal welfare organizations. The grants were distributed to groups directly affected by Hurricane Katrina.



#### A Really Old Story

Archaeologists revealed the final section of the earliest known Mayan mural. It dates back to 100 B.C. and tells the story of kings and their right to the royal title. The room-sized mural was discovered in 2001 in northeastern Guatemala and was finally completed for viewing in December 2005.



#### It's For the Birds

The Avian Flu (bird flu) has generated worldwide concern about its potential for spreading to humans. To date, the H5N1 virus strain has significantly affected more birds than humans, and millions of chickens and ducks have been killed in an attempt to prevent the virus from spreading. Although there has been concern about the flu reaching North America from Southeast Asia and sparking a pandemic, experts conclude that the virus has difficulty transmitting between people.

#### Up Close and Personal With a Comet

NASA's Deep Impact space probe smashed into a comet half the size of Manhattan on July 4 in an effort to reveal secrets of the solar system to scientists. The historic mission allowed scientists to take photos of the comet's surface. Information gathered may some day help scientists stop a comet if the Earth were ever threatened.



#### In the Fast Train

A new contender for the title of fastest train in the world is being tested by the East Japan Railway. The Fastech 360 is expected to carry passengers at a speed of 224 miles per hour, topping the French TGV train's speeds by nearly 40 miles per hour. #### The Battle Against Malaria

Microsoft founder Bill Gates and his wife Melinda established a \$35 million grant to launch Zambia's first nationwide effort to curb malaria. Zambia is a country located in southern Africa with a population suffering from malaria. The three-year plan, aimed at reducing malaria deaths by 75 percent, is designed to get bed nets, medicines and indoor insecticides to 80 percent of Zambia's population. It is hoped that this model will help other African countries develop national malaria control plans.



#### To a Long Life

The life expectancy in the U.S. hit another all-time high at 77.6 years. When you compare this number to the 46.8-year expectancy of the early 1900s, you can see we've come a long way. Worldwide, the current life expectancy rate is 64.3 years. Areas with the highest life expectancies are Andorra, 83.5 years: San Marino, 82.1 years; Singapore, 81.6 years; and Japan, 81.1 years.

#### One Size Doesn't Fit All

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has come up with a revised version of the food pyramid called MyPyramid. This model for personal nutrition is based on your age, gender, and activity level. It allows for a more customized nutritional plan for each person. The USDA hopes the changed nutritional guidelines will address the growing obesity epidemic in the U.S.—1/3 of adults in this country are considered obese.



On July 18, archaeologists displayed an ancient Roman dining set that had been hidden for two millennia in the volcanic ash of Pompeii, Italy. The decorated cups and fine silver platters were found in 2000. Experts have spent the last five years restoring the pieces that were left behind by their owners as they fled the eruption of the volcano Vesuvius.



#### \$100 Million Field Trip to the Moon

Space Adventures, one of several privately funded companies in the space race, is selling around-the-moon jaunts for \$100 million. Moon tourists could begin making trips as soon as 2008. SpaceShipOne, the world's first private space ship built last year to encourage space tourism, was donated to the Smithsonian Museum.



#### Stardust Space Probe Returns Home

It left seven years ago, traveled 2.88 billion miles and circled the sun twice. In January, NASA's Stardust space probe dropped a 100-pound capsule back to Earth with a tiny payload of comet and interstellar dust. Scientists believe the particles within the Stardust are remains from the formation of our solar system.



#### Still the Best Medicine

Go ahead and laugh...it's good for you! Researchers showed a group of moviegoers both funny and distressing clips, and then tested the physical effects of each. Laughter increased blood flow 22 percent in test subjects, and their blood flow decreased 35 percent while stressed.




#### Mummy, My Eyes are Dry

In an effort to study ancient diseases, a team of scientists in California restored the eyes of two Chilean mummies. One eye came from a 2-year-old boy who died 1,000 years ago. The other eye belonged to a 23-year-old woman who died about 750 years ago. Both bodies were naturally preserved in Chile's arid Atacama Desert.



#### World Health Organization Confirms New Polio Case

In July 2005, a 15-month-old girl from the east African nation of Somalia was diagnosed with polio, a paralyzing disease. Previously, polio had been wiped out of Somalia since 2002. The return of the disease in 12 African countries has been linked to the failure of the Nigerian authorities to complete an immunization program in 2003.



#### Mending a Broken Heart

Johns Hopkins University researchers studied stress cardiomyopathy, often mistaken for a heart attack. Known as broken heart syndrome and associated with the loss of a loved one, researchers found that it's caused by a surge of adrenaline and other stress hormones that temporarily stun the heart.


#### 88 Years in the Making

#### Danica Tears Up the Track

At the age of 23, Danica Patrick stole the show at the Indianapolis 500 and nearly grabbed the biggest purse in auto racing. Although she ended up finishing fourth, she claimed the best finish by a female driver and she also was the first female to lead a lap. Englishman Dan Wheldon won over \$1.5 million in the May 31 race.



#### Monarchs Take the Sun

After sweeping the first two rounds of the playoffs, the Sacramento Monarchs faced the only team to sweep them in the regular season, the Connecticut Sun. The difference came down to the relentless defensive pressure the Monarchs applied, which forced many turnovers from the Sun. The Monarchs claimed the champion title, three games to one.

#### Olympic Hopefuls Spark Excitement

Torino, Italy, was full of talented athletes determined to bring home the gold during the 2006 Winter Olympics. Speed skater Chad Hedrick, skier Jeret "Speedy" Peterson, and figure skaters Michelle Kwan and Sasha Cohen all excelled in their sports to earn their places in Italy. Nineteen-year-old Hannah Teter also seeked the gold in snowboarding's Women's Halfpipe event. Although Torino was only the third Olympic appearance for snowboarding events, the sport was a popular one to watch.







#### 302 for Lilly

U.S. Women's National Soccer Team captain, Kristine Lilly, reached an impressive milestone when she played in her 302nd international game in January. The game was played in Guangzhou, China, and the U.S. Women gained a victory over China. Lilly was also a member of the 1996 and 2004 Olympic gold medal teams.



### Williams Tops Davenport at Wimbledon

In a career comeback, Venus Williams beat top-ranked Lindsay Davenport on July 2, for her fifth major title—and her first in nearly four years. Williams won Wimbledon in 2000 and 2001, and was runner-up to sister Serena in 2002 and 2003



#### Spurs Dethrone Pistons

The San Antonio Spurs defeated the Detroit Pistons on June 23 with an 81-74 win to claim the NBA championship. Tim Duncan earned his third Finals MVP and San Antonio picked up its third title in seven years, denying Detroit a chance to repeat its win from last year.



#### The Yellow Jersey Rides Again

Lance Armstrong made Tour de France history by winning the world's toughest race for a record-setting seventh year in a row. He was also awarded the AP Male Athlete of the Year honor for the fourth consecutive year. Armstrong, a cancer survivor, founded the Lance Armstrong Foundation in 1997. The foundation's mission is to inspire and empower people with cancer to LIVE STRONG through education, advocacy, public health and research programs.

#### Annika Wraps Up a Dynamite Season

Annika Sorenstam was the top LPGA golfer with 10 wins out of 20 starts. She was the first woman in 19 years to capture the first two legs of the Grand Slam by winning 10 times on the LPGA Tour. Annika was also selected to be the AP Female Athlete of the Year for the third year in a row.



#### Teen Phenom

Sixteen-year-old Michelle Wie's phenomenal career as an amateur golfer ended in October when she turned pro. In her first act as an LPGA member, she donated \$500,000 to the U.S. Golf Hurricane Relief Fund.



#### Steelers Win Fifth Super Bowl Title

The Pittsburgh Steelers beat the Seattle Seahawks 21-10 to win Super Bowl XL. An average of 45.85 million homes tuned into the game to make it the most-watched Super Bowl since 1996. The Super Bowl MVP title was awarded to Hines Ward, who caught five passes for 123 yards and completed a touchdown pass for the Steelers. In only two months' time, the Pittsburgh Steelers went from playoff long shots to Super Bowl Champions.



A powerful, magnitude 7.6 earthquake shook the Pakistan-India border region on October 8 and triggered massive landslides that buried mountainside villages. This earthquake originated only about 6.2 miles beneath the earth's surface, which is shallow compared to most earthquakes. The earthquake's shallow nature caused the ground to shake far more violently compared to similar earthquakes that occur deeper in the earth's crust. Over 80,000 died and millions were left homeless as a result.



#### Dynamic Dinosaur Discoveries

Scientists are using fossils and new technology to learn how dinosaurs lived and died 77 million years ago. The fossil of a duck-billed dinosaur, nicknamed "Leonardo," was discovered in Montana almost completely intact about four years ago. Now researchers can use the latest tools. such as CT scans and supercomputers, to learn how dinosaurs stood, moved and ate.

#### Dogs Sniff Out Sickness

A new study reported that dogs can detect if a person has cancer by smelling his or her breath. With only a few weeks of training, the dogs could distinguish between patients with lung or breast cancer and healthy patients. Researchers are hopeful that the dogs could help with early detection, which greatly improves survival chances for cancer patients.

#### Feeling the Heat

On October 6, crews battled a 6,000-acre wildfire that was fanned by the dry Santa Ana winds in California. The blaze had threatened about 100 homes in a sparsely populated area about 60 miles east of Los Angeles. In Oklahoma, drought conditions added to the fire problems as more than 400,000 acres were charred along with 250 homes and businesses



#### Tsunami Shield

Scientists working in southeastern India after last year's tsunami found that mangrove trees seem to protect villages from damage. Villages on the ocean that were surrounded by the trees suffered far less damage compared to neighboring villages without protective areas.

#### Rare Crab Find

An extremely rare type of crab pulled from the Chesapeake Bay in late spring was found to be part male and part female. Crabbers know that male crabs have blue claws and female crabs have red claws. This male-female crab had one claw of each color, along with all of the characteristics of both genders. The last report of a male-female crab was in 1979.



The spectacular ivory-billed woodpecker, long believed to be extinct, was spotted in the Big Woods region of eastern Arkansas. With a wingspan that is nearly 3 feet wide, it is one of the world's largest woodpeckers. The last previous

confirmed sighting of this big bird was in 1944.



#### World War II Airman Found in Glacier

Two climbers discovered an ice-encased body while hiking 13,710-foot Mount Mendel in California on October 16. The man's body, found within the Sierra Nevada glacier, is believed to an airman whose plane

crashed in 1942. The man was found wearing a World War II-era parachute The wreckage from the plane and four other bodies were discovered in 1947.

#### A New Mammal in Borneo?

Scientists investigated whether a red-furred mammal, about the size of a house cat, is in fact a new species. A nighttime camera trap captured an image of the creature in Borneo's rainforest. If it is a new species, it would be the first new mammal species found on the Southeast Asia island in over a century.






#### The Tenth Planet

Astronomers have found a new planet beyond Pluto, in the outer reaches of our solar system. The yet-unnamed planet is thought to be 1.5 times bigger than Pluto and about 2 billion miles further away. Other planet-like objects in our system have been found by the same astronomers, but to date none of them have been defined as planets.

#### Great Apes in Danger

As few as 350,000 apes remain in the wild and the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP) believes they could become extinct within 50 years due to poverty, disease, hunting and logging in the areas where apes live. The UNEP also reported that almost half of the apes' habitat in Malaysia is expected to disappear within 5 years if current building trends continue.





#### The Name Game

The Washington, D.C. National Zoo's giant panda cub was given the name Tai Shan, meaning peaceful mountain, 100 days after his birth on July 9. As part of Chinese custom, panda bears are not named until after their first 100 days of life. Tai Shan's name was decided by popular vote—the winning name received 44 percent of 200,000 votes cast on the zoo's Web site.



#### Window to the Sea

In November, the world's largest indoor aquarium opened in Atlanta, Georgia.
The Georgia Aquarium includes interactive stations and touch tanks for visitors to enjoy.
This aquarium holds over 8 million gallons of water and more than 100,000 animals representing 500 species. It's a huge leap in size over the next largest aquarium—Chicago's Shedd Aquarium has 21,000 animals and 5 million gallons of water.



#### **Dwindling Tigers**

In a countrywide census, India launched its biggest survey ever to count the tiger population. The effort focused on national parks and reserves where scores of tigers have gone missing due to poachers and illegal fur traders. Experts estimate that there are only 3,500 tigers left, compared with a count of 40,000 tigers roaming around 100 years ago.



#### Brave Honey Bees

Researchers from several U.S. universities have trained honey bees to locate the vapors of buried land mines. The bees follow the vapor plume of mines until the source is reached. The bees are also light enough not to set off the mines, and bee training is usually completed in only one or two days.

#### The New Xbox




