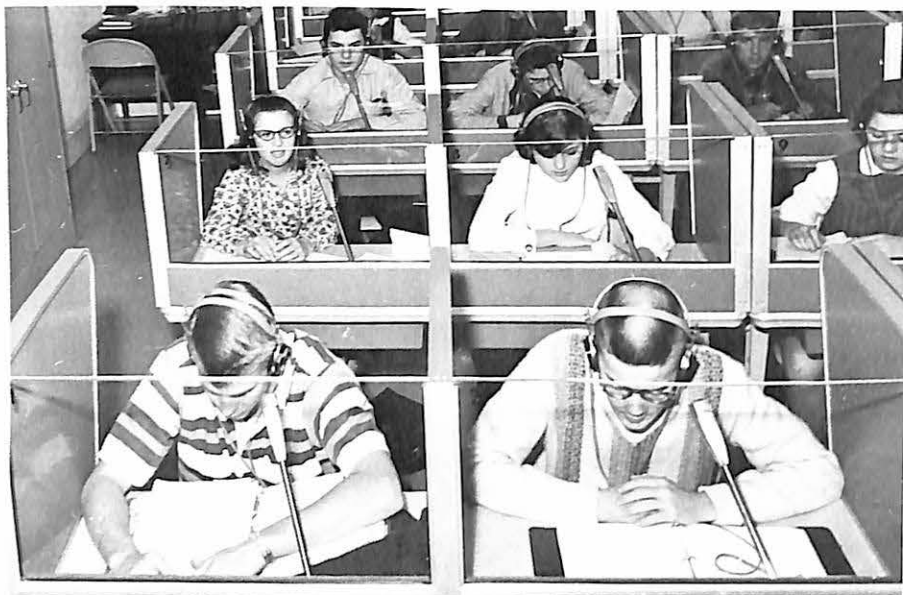

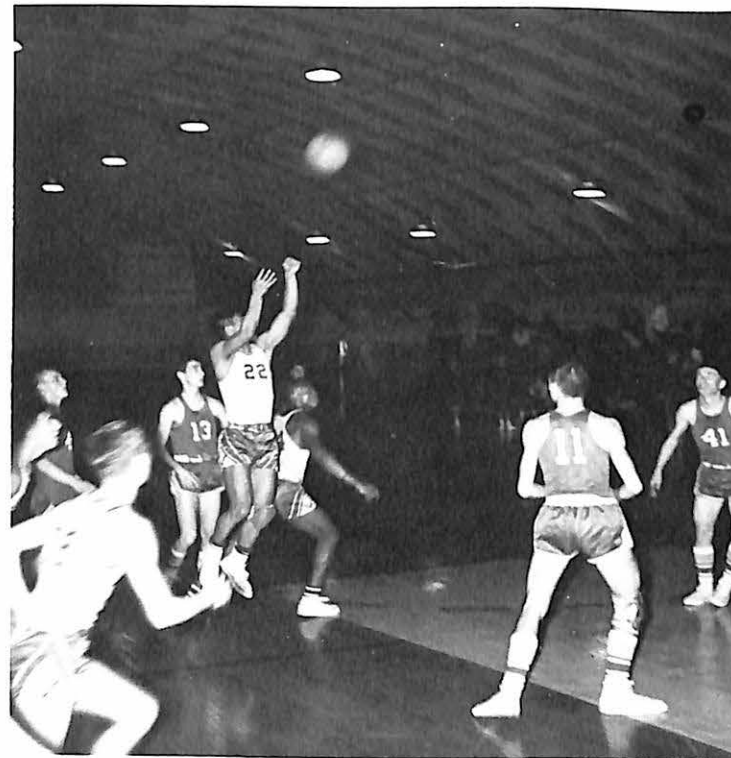
Foreword

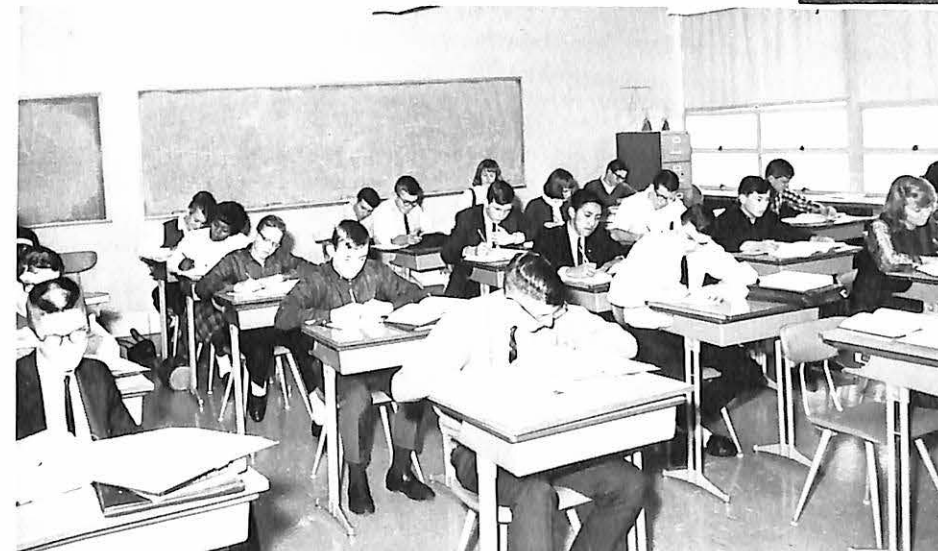
Some mysterious worker beats out an intricate design for a young lady's bag in leather crafts. Many students are given the opportunity to create high quality produce through their own efforts.

Here we see our dynamic Falcons practicing during the hot summer months. Paul Lampru and John Bianchini run through a few practice plays with Attucks High.

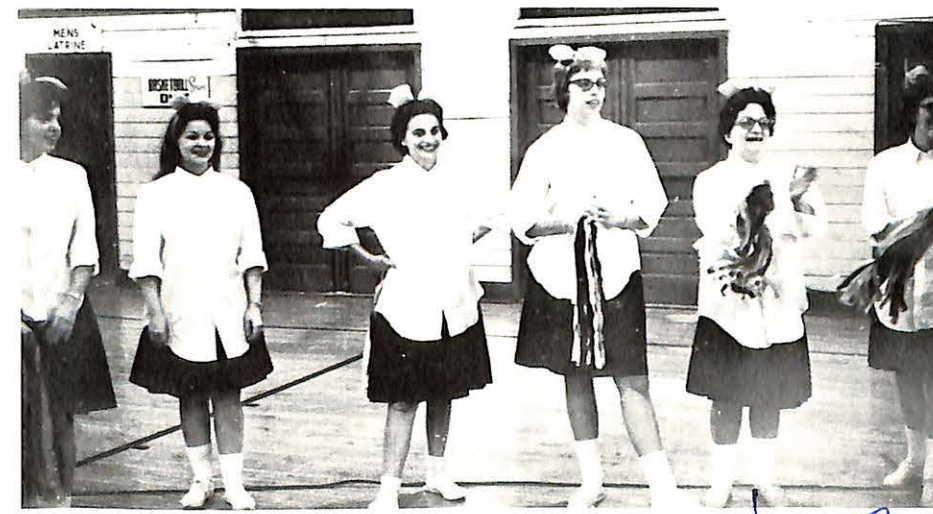

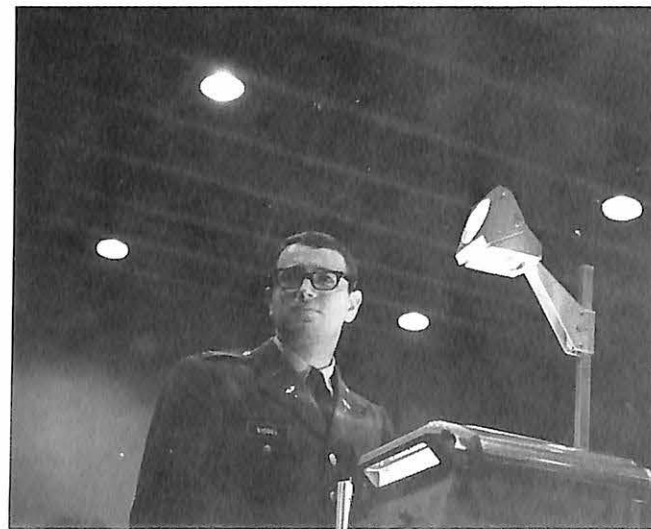
