

#### Foreword






Some mysterious worker beats out an intricate design for a young lady's bag in leather crafts. Many students are given the opportunity to create high quality produce through their own efforts.




The sophomore officers are: President, Robby Visitacion; Vice-President, Rick Haines; and Secretary-Treasurer, Sharon Stanley.






#### Freshman Officers
