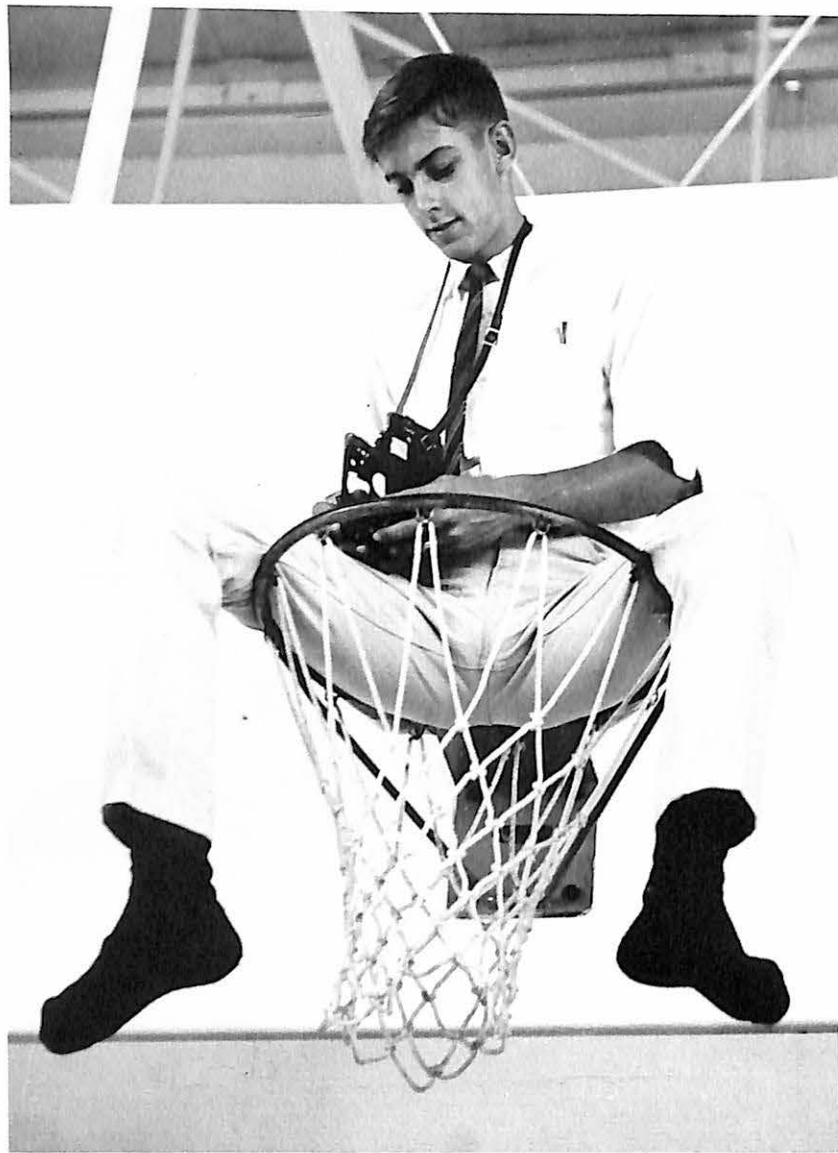

FCHS at Work

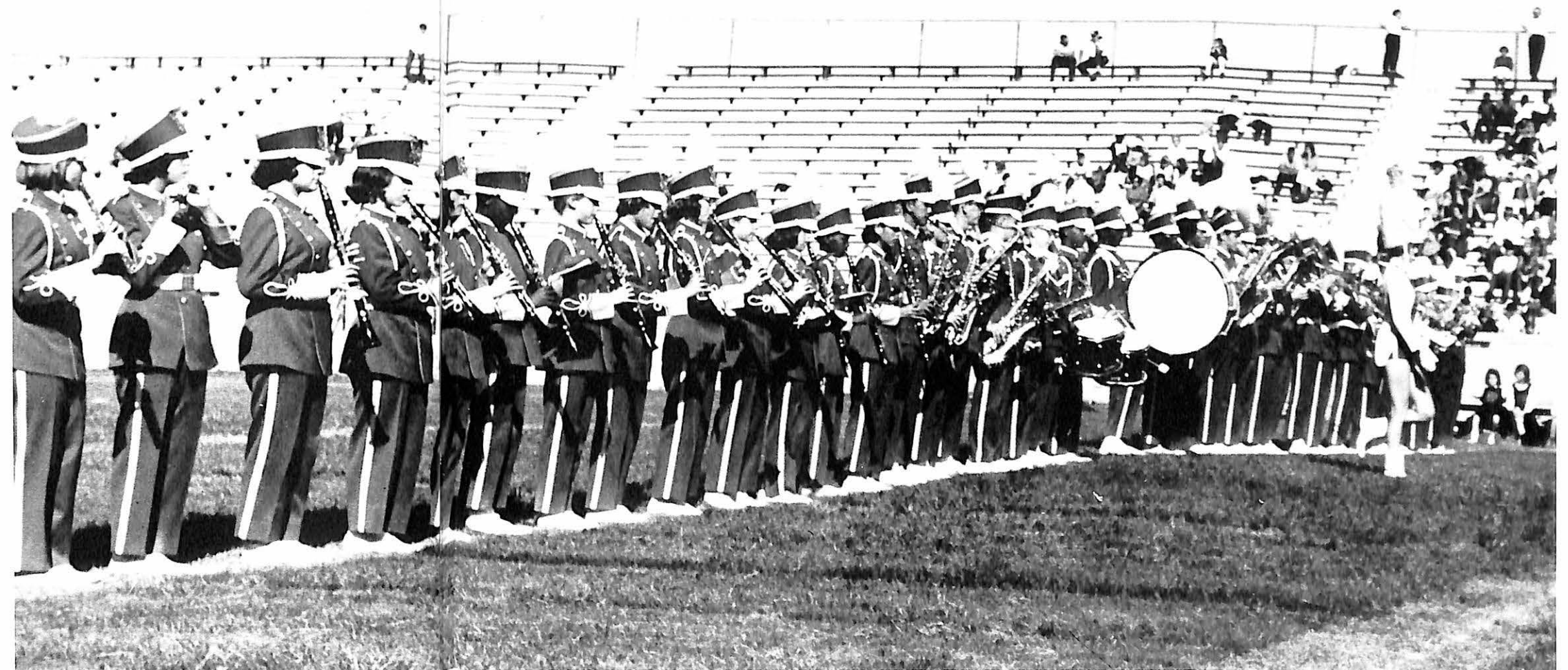

One of the most constructive outlets for activity is school spirit. These posters show the superb school spirit of the FCHS elite: the Senior Class of 1966!



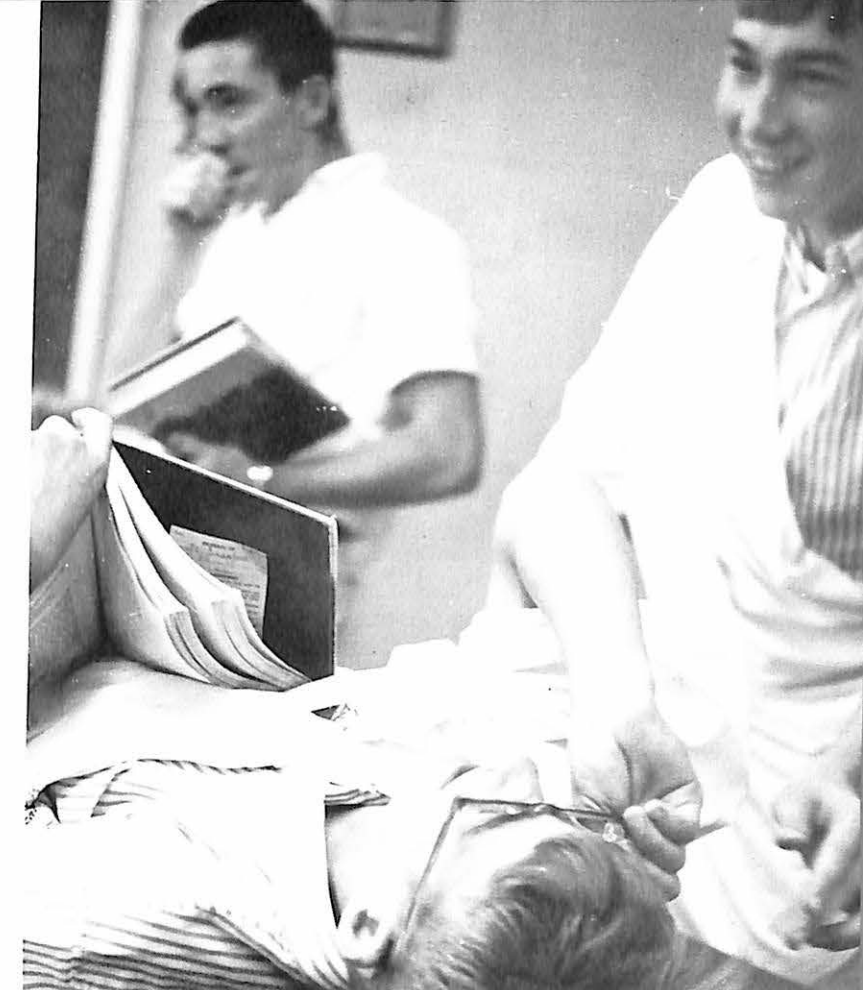

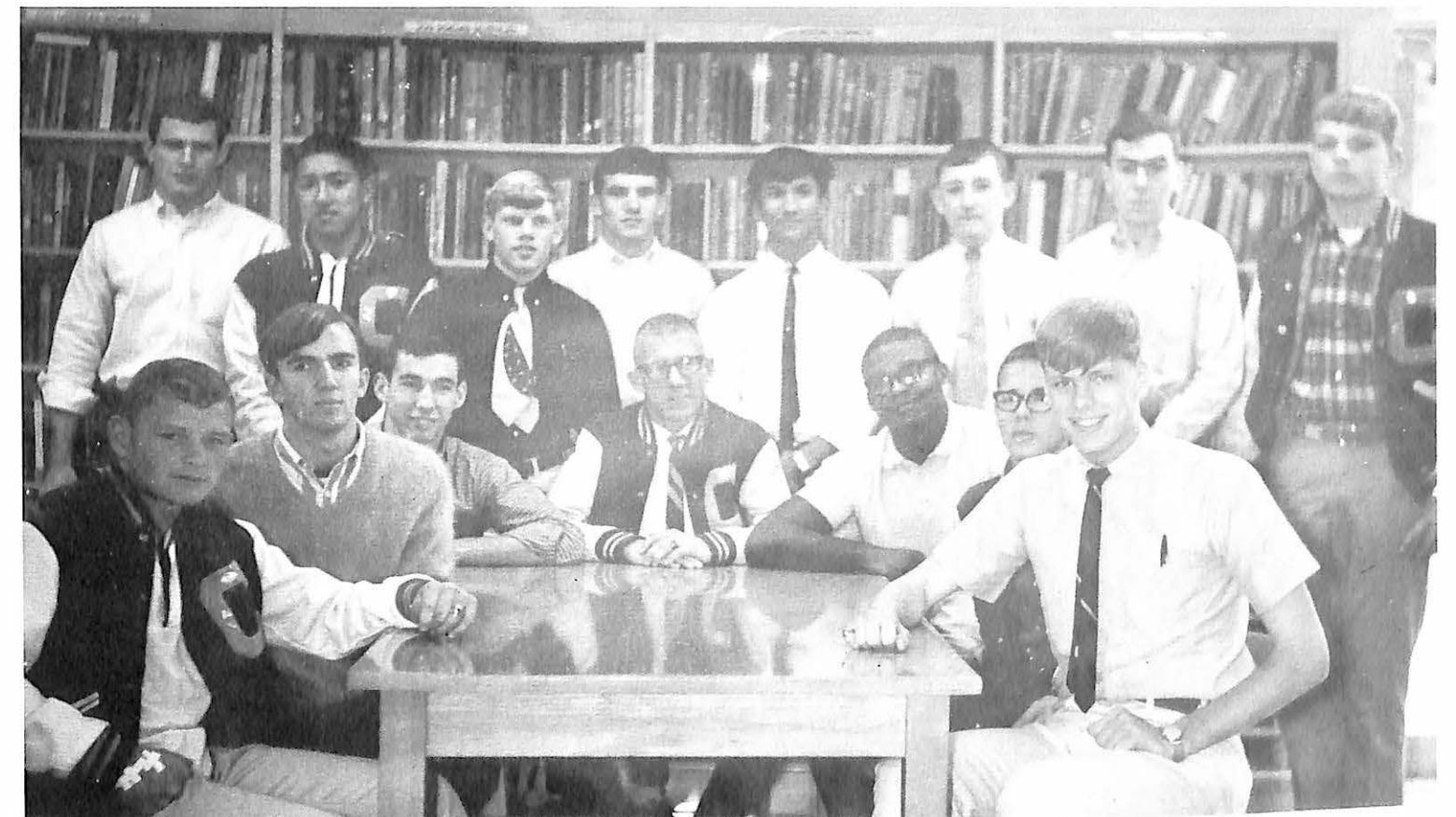

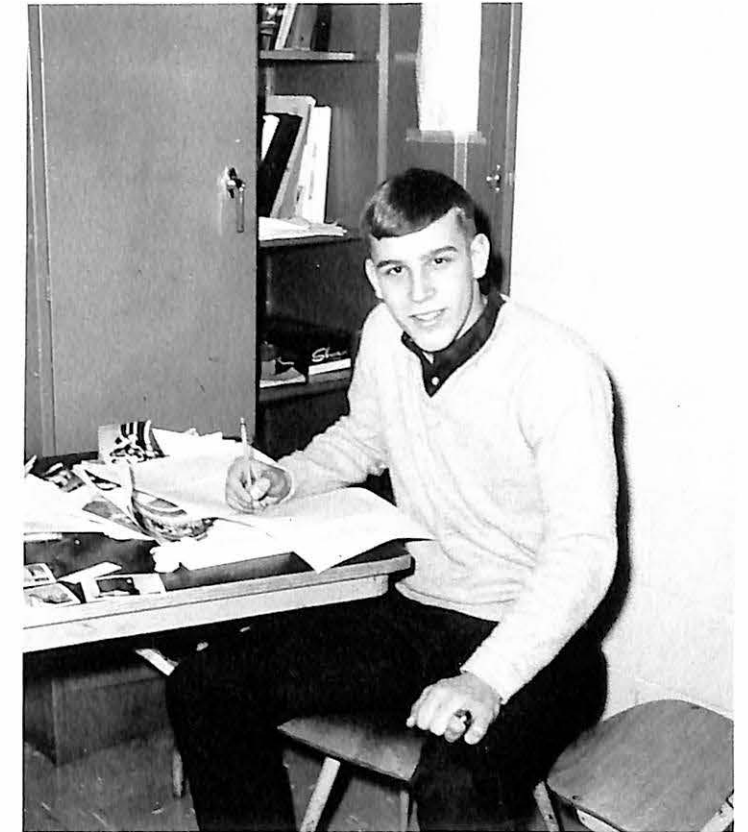
