FOREWORD

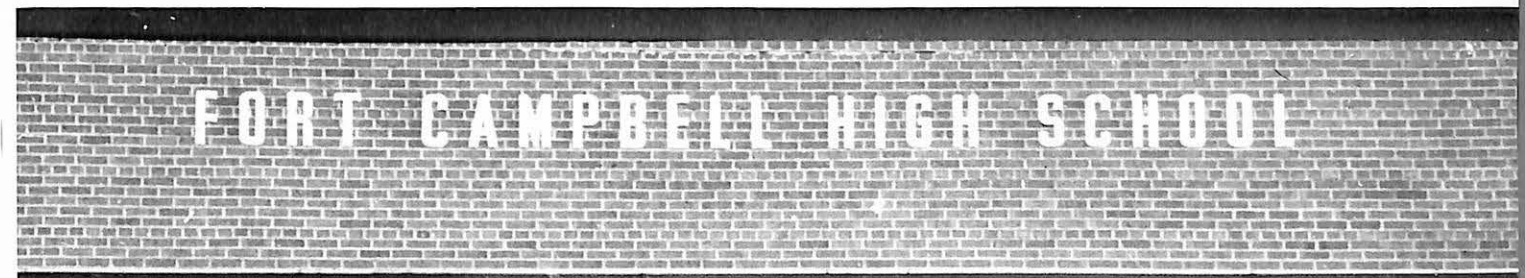

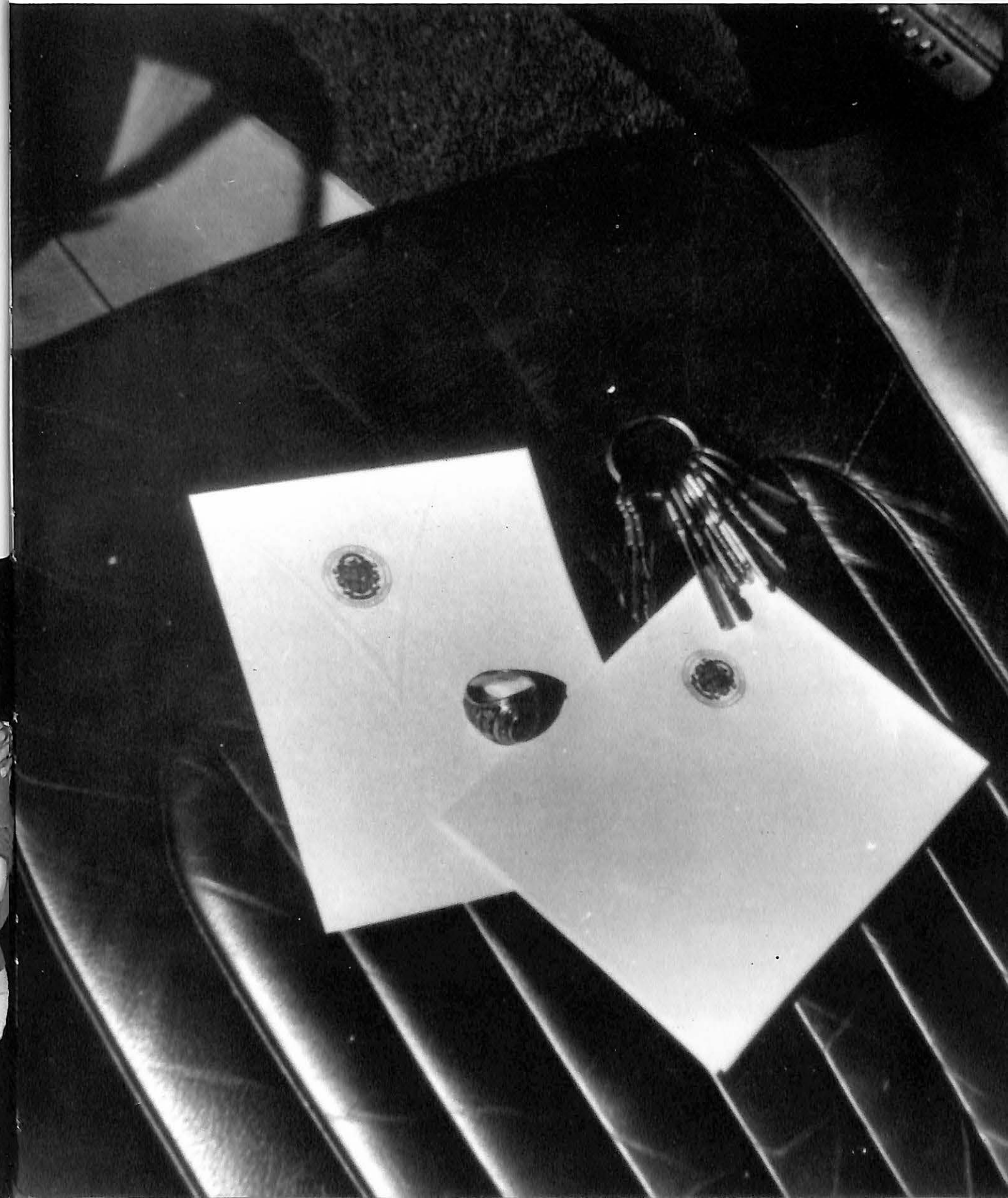
