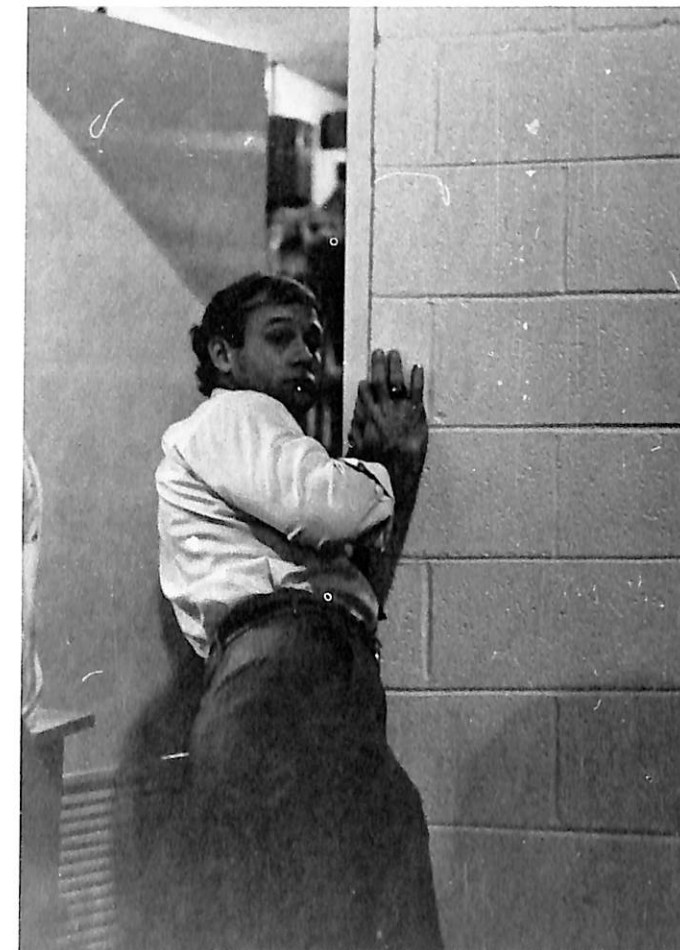


The serious side of Mr. Stewart prevails as he supervises classroom activities. He can be found in various classes during the day, lending a hand when necessary.

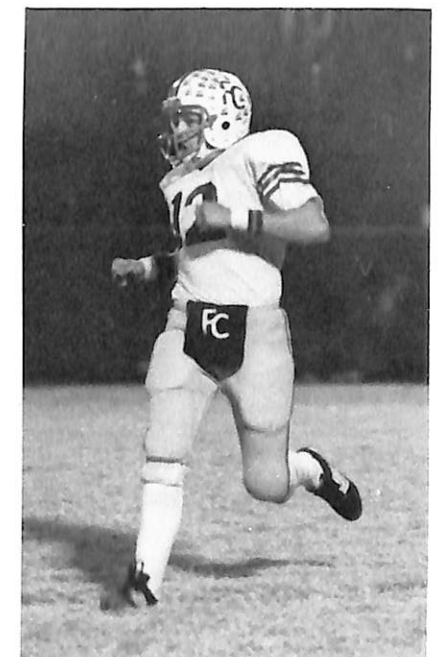
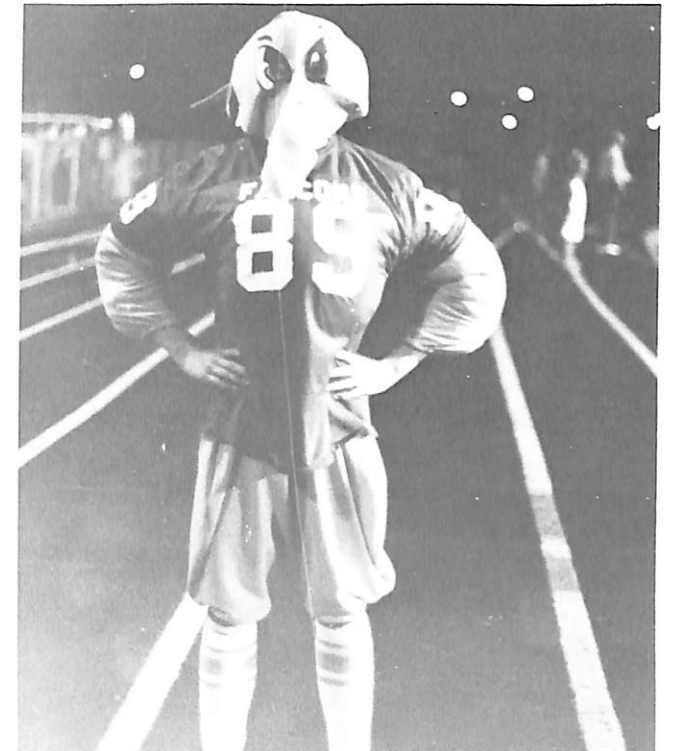


# Keeps Moving Along!!

Peter Salter's brilliant running paved the way for the squad's first state championship.

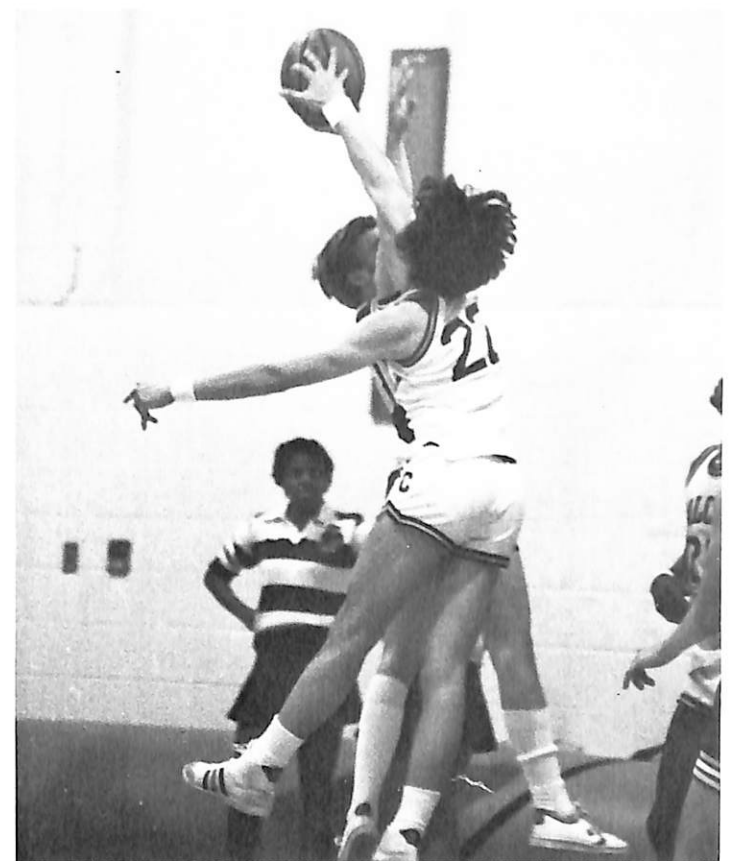
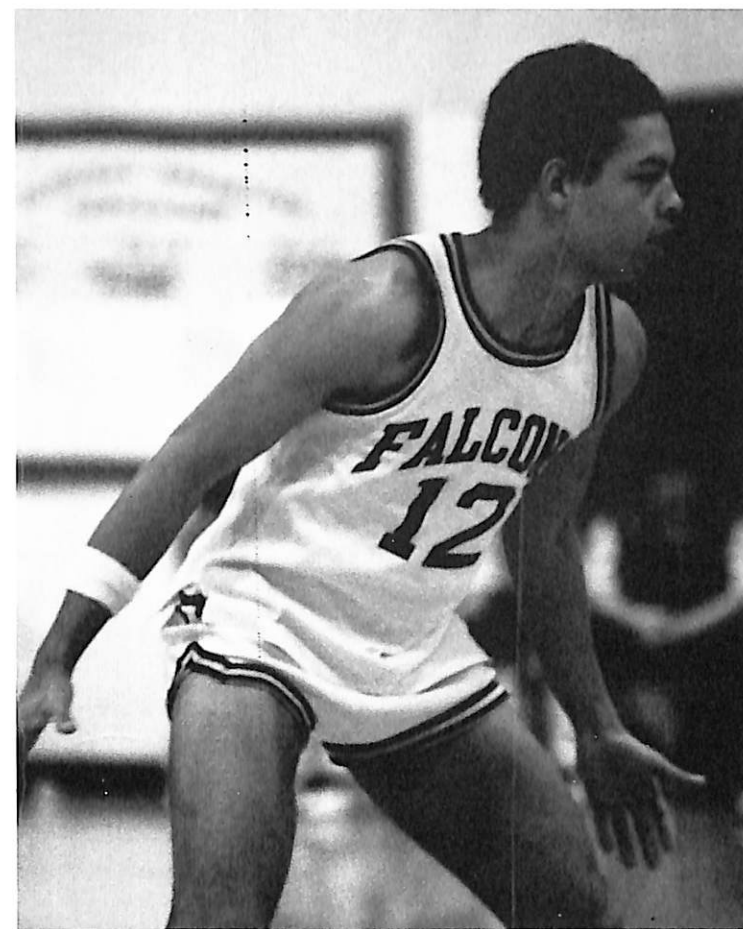




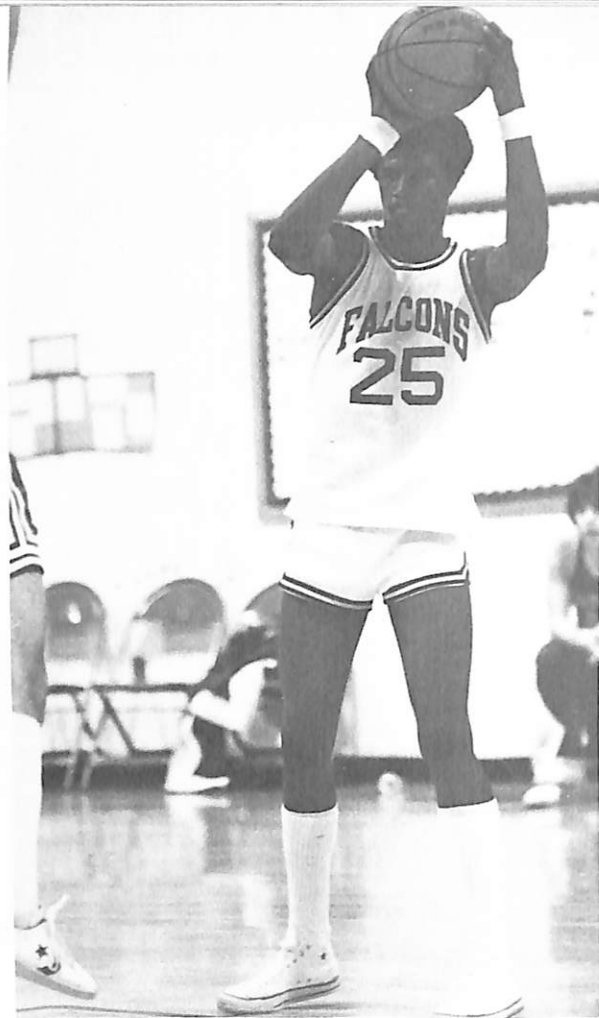

Through this winter season, under the supervision of the new head coach Kent Parrent, the Falcon wrestling squad put forth their

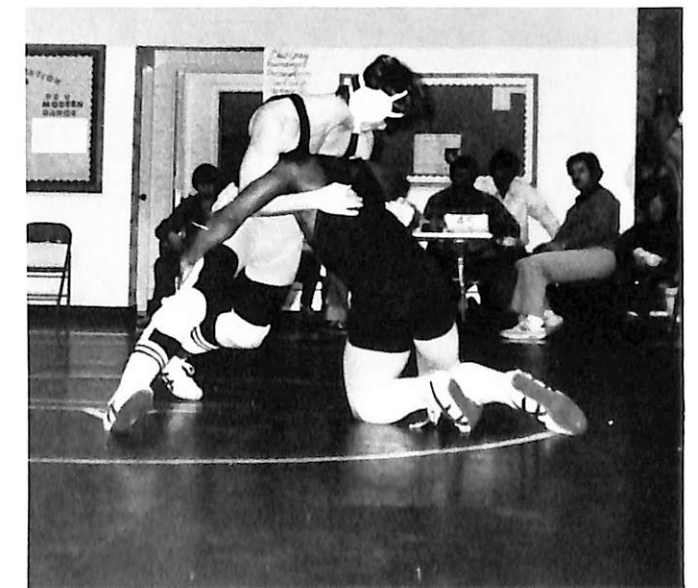
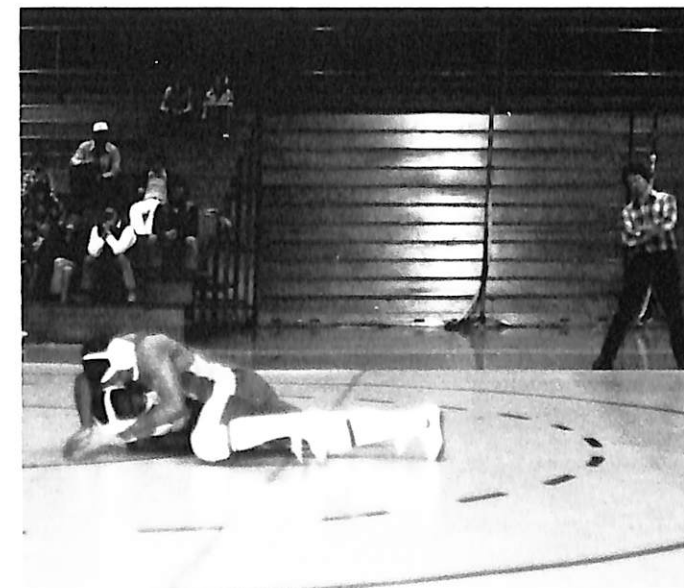
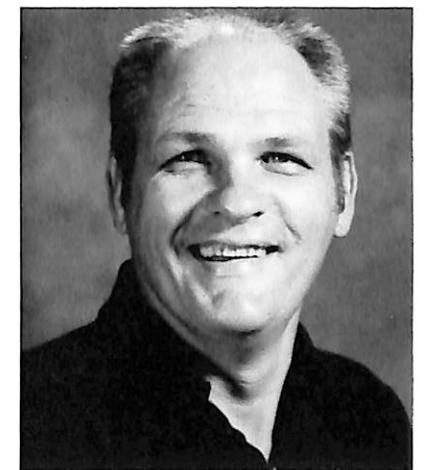
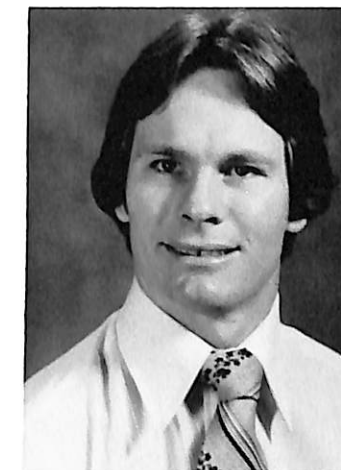
best efforts and the results were amazingly great.

Working along with the administration has been Mrs. Allensworth and Mr. Lane. They devote a lot of their time to guiding and solving the problems of the students.

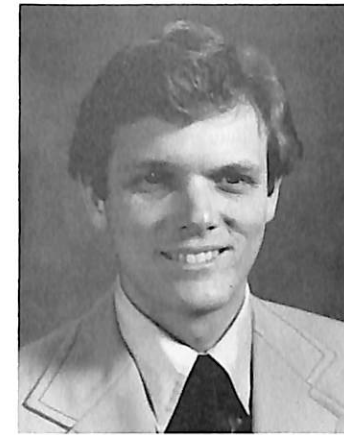




# Behind The Scenes

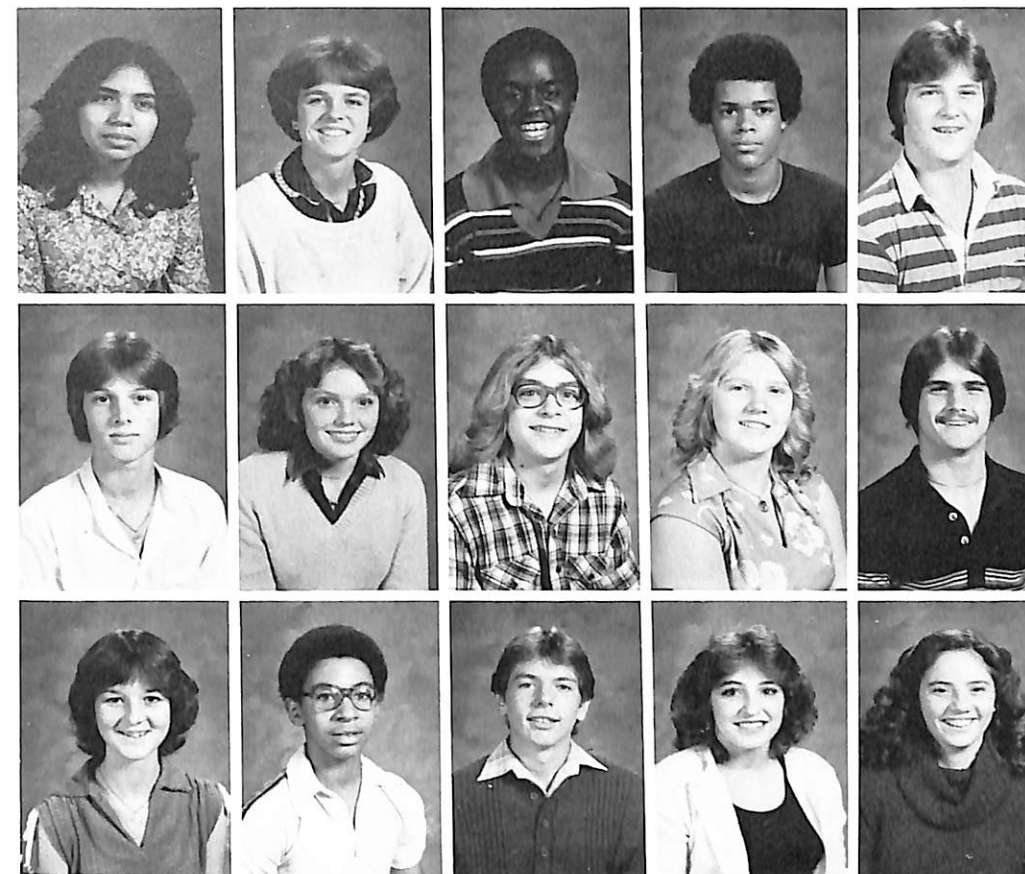


## Our Officers Lead The Way

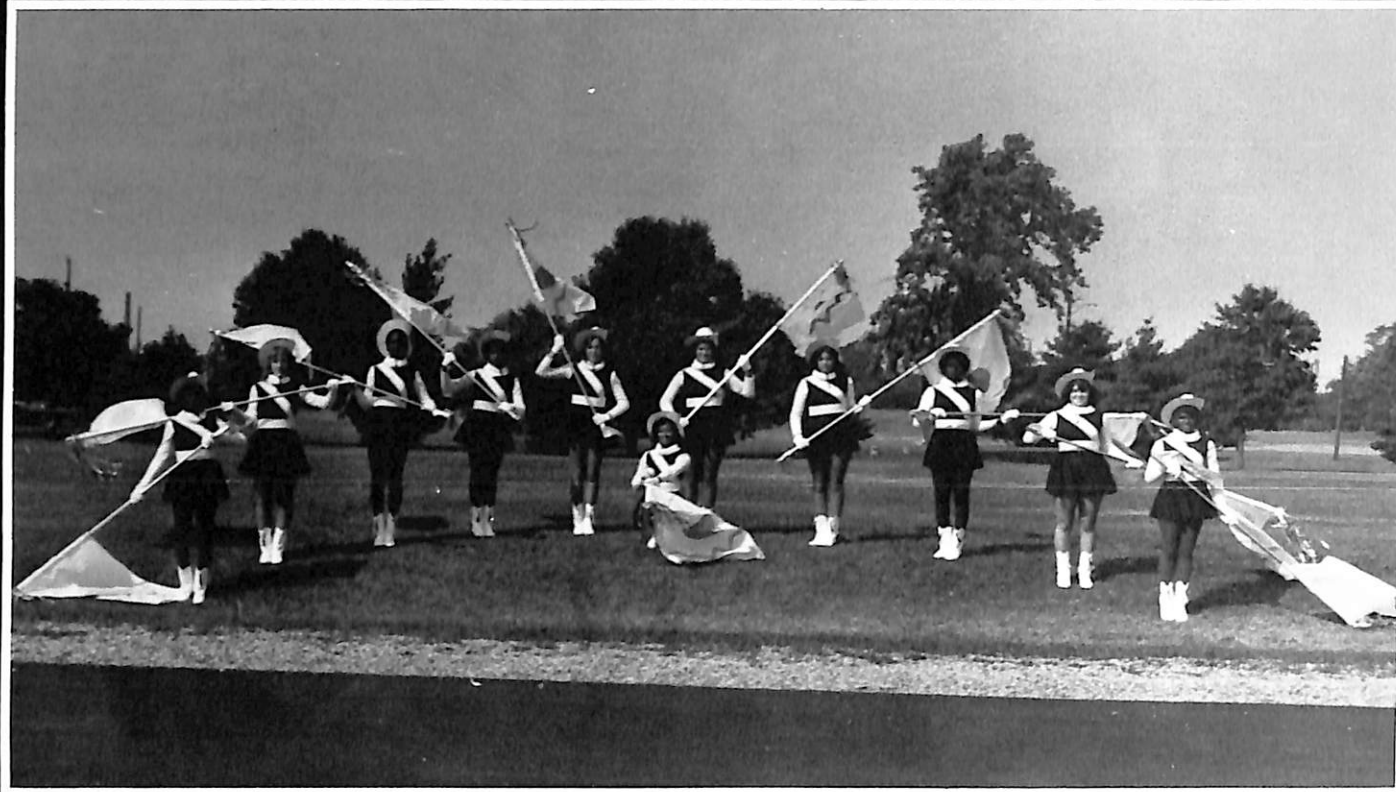
## Reserve Officers Training Corp

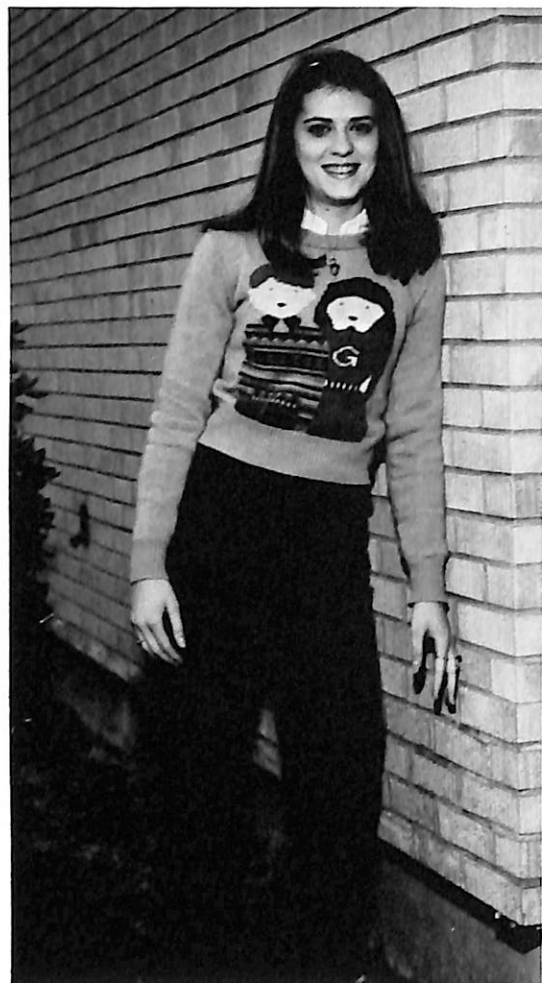
# Valedictorian

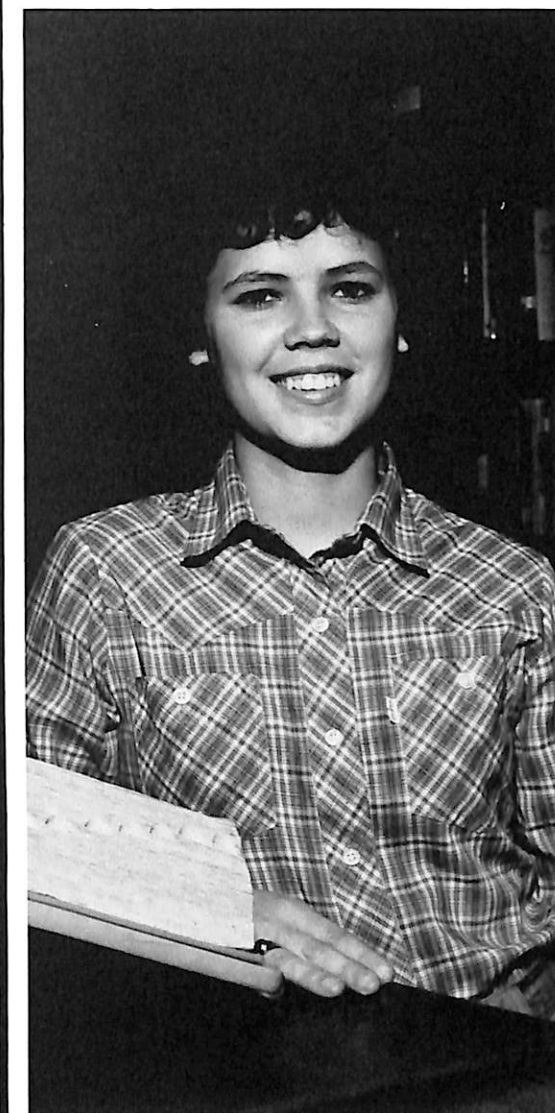


## Mike Statler

## Kathryn Donham

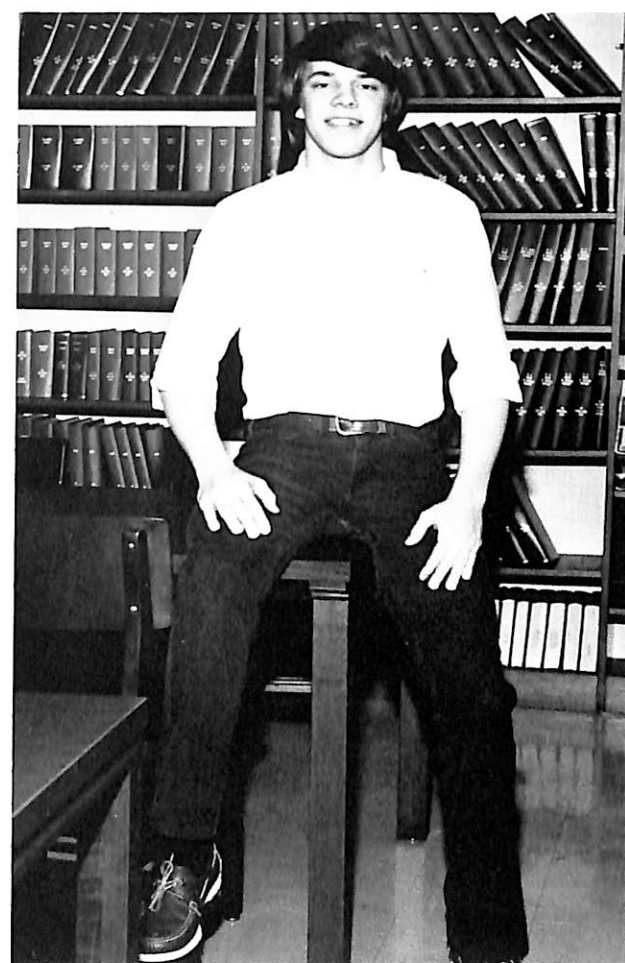

## Carla Tademy

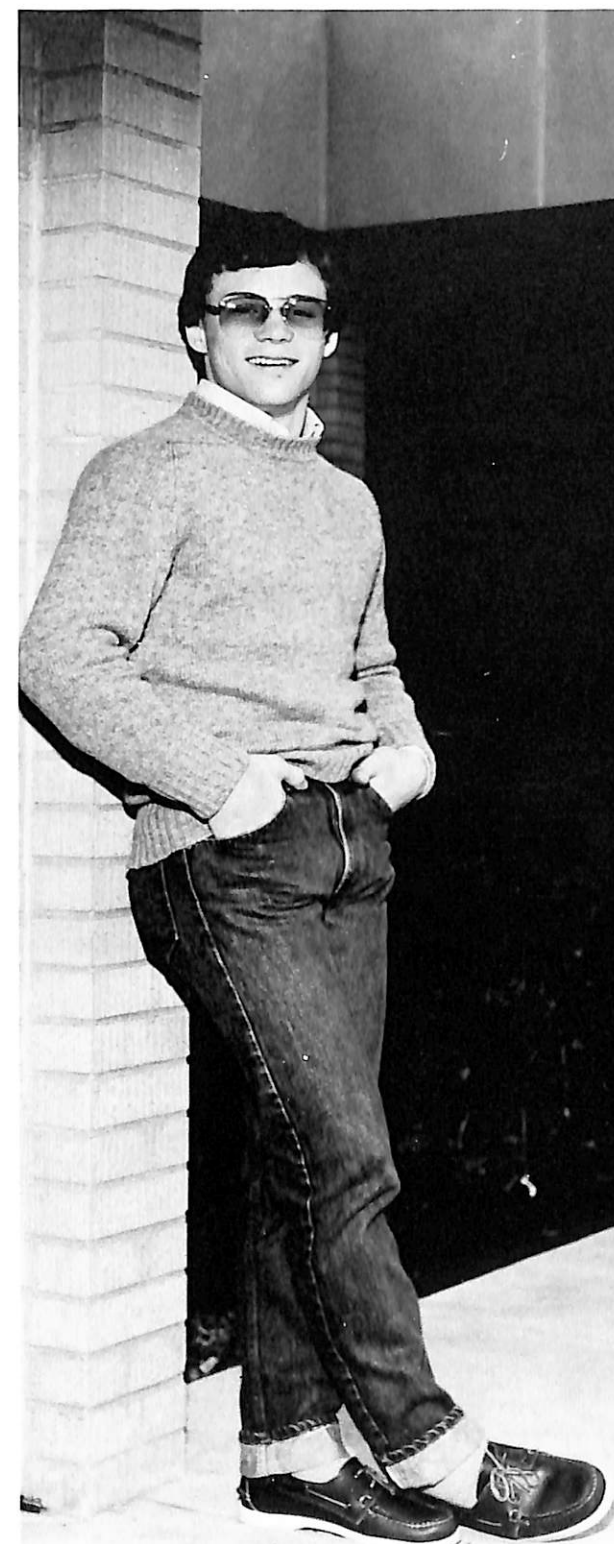

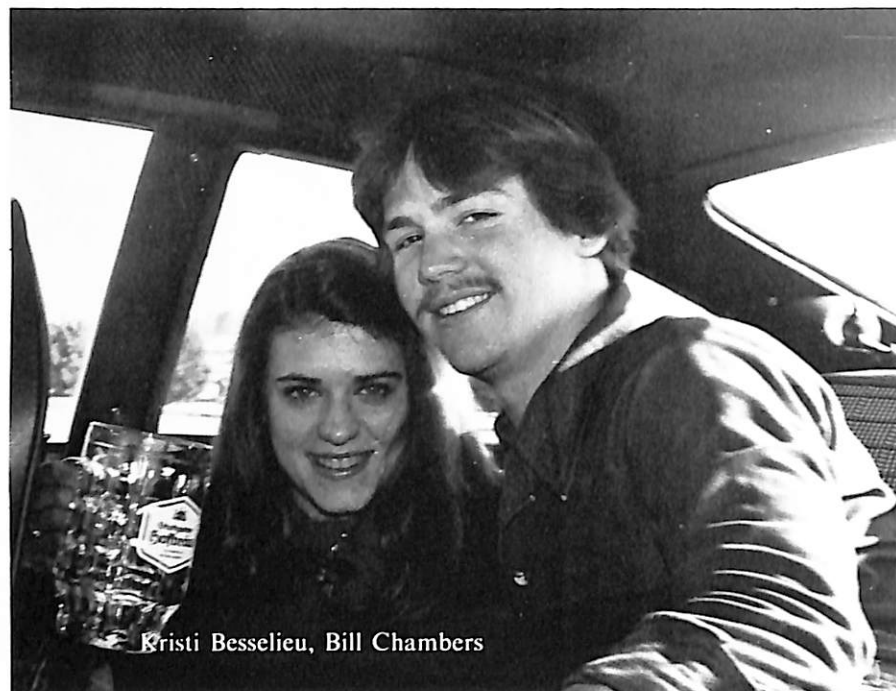
## Dianna Lindberg
