






## "One In A Million"








#### Keeps Moving Along!!

Football plays a very important role in the life here at Fort Campbell High School. The hard work and determination that the team put forth, provided us with a fantastic record any school would be proud of.



best efforts and the results were amazingly great.



These ladies have kept the office running smoothly and have always shown courteousy and tact with the students.




## Top Ten Seniors






# Valedictorian Leslie Bright




#### Kristi Bessilieu







#### Mike Garner




