

Twenty-Eight Years Of Dedicated Service



his marks the 28th year of service and dedication to education by Mr. Bill Perry, Principal of Fort Campbell High School. Mr. Perry has provided the direction and leadership necessary to transform three schools into superb learning

institutions.

Mr. Perry came to Fort Campbell in 1957 and has served in several capacities to include: (I) 1957-58, PE teacher at Lincoln Elementary; (2) 1958-59, teaching — principal at Lincoln Elementary and assistant football coach at the Junior High School; (3) 1959-60, health and PE teacher, head football coach and athletic director at the Junior High School; (4) 1960-62, principal of Fort Campbell Junior High School; (5) 1962-68, organized and served as principal of Fort Campbell Junior-Senior High School: (6) 1968, organized the Senior High School and has served as principal for the past 16 years.

Mr. Perry has organized three instructional programs in three buildings during his tenure at Fort Campbell. The curricular offerings have expanded from 55 in 1962 to over 115 at the present time. The extracurricular and co-curricular programs have grown and flourished under his able leadership. Former students all over the world owe a great deal to the educational system here at Fort Campbell and especially to Mr. Perry for his care, concern, and dedicated efforts in the educational lives of young people.











Life After 2:30
















Hey Dude — Let's Party!

Reflecting On Excellence


Serving our post dependents for twenty-three years, Fort Campbell Senior High School was established in 1962. Prior to that, a junior high school, which was in operation from 1956-1962, carried students from the seventh grade to the ninth grade. This meant that all students in grades 10-12 had to attend the Clarksville-Montgomery County school system.

In 1962, Fort Campbell High School opened at the location that is presently Fort Campbell North Middle School. This school served all students in grades 10-12 until 1968, at which time a new building equipped to hold 450 students was built on a twenty-two acre campus on Chaffee Road at South Carolina Avenue.


When plans were made to reinstall grade 9, the need for a larger and better facility became necessary. The opening of a new high school was set for August 1984 at the corner of Ohio Avenue and Seventh Street; however, construction delays along with inclement weather altered the deadline to early 1985. To accommodate the larger student body at the former high school, six trailers were brought in to be used as temporary classrooms. Even though the comfort of the new school will be enjoyed in the years to come, we will always reflect upon the old schools and the years in which we have had a reason to be proud of Fort Campbell High.







Amoung her extracurricular activities, Sandy has stood out in the National Honor Society, Key Club, Art Club, Band and the Academic Team.







When asked about her future, Betty responded, "As far as my future goes, whatever endeavor I choose to pursue, I'll first make sure that I will be happy and proud of my decisions."





Voted Most Congenial and Most Dependable by his peers, Tim is reliable and lives up to his expectations.


After graduation, Tim wishes to attend either Eastern Kentucky University of Indiana University and study Pre-pharmacy or Biology.

Tammy has been at FCHS for five years and has participated in the Pep Club, Key Club and the National Junior Honor Society. Her favorite class is accounting, her intended major.


















Academic Team

Fort Campbell Falcon's Student Council is an organization of student representation sponsoring activities and serving to better the school.



JROTC









Every Thursday, which is also known as "uniform day", something unusual to most civilian schools takes place at Fort Campbell. The JROTC cadets of the Falcon Battalion proudly display their uniforms for the rest of the school.

JROTC cadets learn many useful skills and facts that will help them if they decide to pursue a military career as well as help them in civilian life. Cadets learn map reading, oral communications, marksmanship, first aid, service and ROTC opportunities, and most of all, LEAD-ERSHIP.

Leadership is very important in military life as well as it is in civilian life. The instructors try to show students how to apply what they learn to all aspects of life. One way they apply their leadership abilities is during the battalion assemblies. The Falcon Battalion has one assembly every month. Cadets are assigned to various leadership positions depending on their rank and leadership ability. Cadets earn rank in many different ways. One way is to attend leadership lab after school. This is mandatory for earning rank. Grades are also an important factor in earning rank as well as leadership ability and conduct, in and out of class. The JROTC instructors are: left to right, MSG. Kruck, SGM. Hatcher, and LTC. George.

During the summer, volunteers from the cadet corp try to earn money by having car washes. The money the cadets earn goes to the "cadet fund" which helps pay for the annual "Military Ball" or other activities that the cadets may decide to have.

The enrollment of JROTC puts no military obligation on the cadet. The purpose of JROTC is to teach good leadership and prepare the cadet in case he or she decides to enter the military.

Extra-curricular activities are important to the cadets. The Falcon Battalion has activities after school of their own. The cadets have the opportunity to participate in the Rifle Team, Drill Team, Color Guard, Rangers, Battalion staff, parades, hay rides, the Military Ball and in the summer they get the chance to go to te JROTC summer camp.



Freshmen Promise 'Great Things'














Fantastic Finish

The team was led at the plate by Mike Caver, who hit .340 and slammed two home runs, which also led the Falcons. Appropriately, he was named Most Valuable Player.




