
School calendar highlight

The excelling in Education program is a project sponsored by the Clarksville Area Chamber of Commerce designed to support academic achievement and provide membership benefit to Chamber member businesses. The program was initiated in 1990 by the Chamber's Small Business Committee, and is currently managed by the Education Committee.

The Excell program recognizes and rewards area high school students who have realized specific academic achievement during the preceding school semester. Recognition efforts are in the form of identification at an Excell presentation at the student's school among peer students, parents, and program sponsors. Rewards are in the form of discounts on merchandise of services offered by Chamber member businesses that provide product of interest to teenagers.

Students earning no semester grade less than an "A" for the previous semester receive Gold Excell Cards. Students earning no semester grade less than a "B" for the previous semester receive Silver Excell Cards. Students nominated by the school's Excell Coordinator and selected by school administration for significant improvement in attendance, attitude, grades, and/or extra-curricular activities receive Blue Excell Cards.

Chamber member businesses listed in this Excell brochure have agreed to provide each cardholder a minimum 15% or equivalent value discount on student purchases upon presentation of their Excell card and appropriate identification. Some restrictions may apply and are listed under each specific offer in this brochure.

Each card is valid for a period of 8 months. Cards are presented shortly after grades have been tabulated for the prior semester. Fall semester cards are normally presented in mid-March and normally expire in November, spring semester cards are normally presented in mid-September and normally expire in May.

Cards are not transferable: discounts will be extended ONLY to those students whose names appear on each card. Card privileges will be terminated for anyone abusing this restriction.
