*I have so many people to thank, and so little space to do it in. First of all, I have to thank God for all He has given me.*

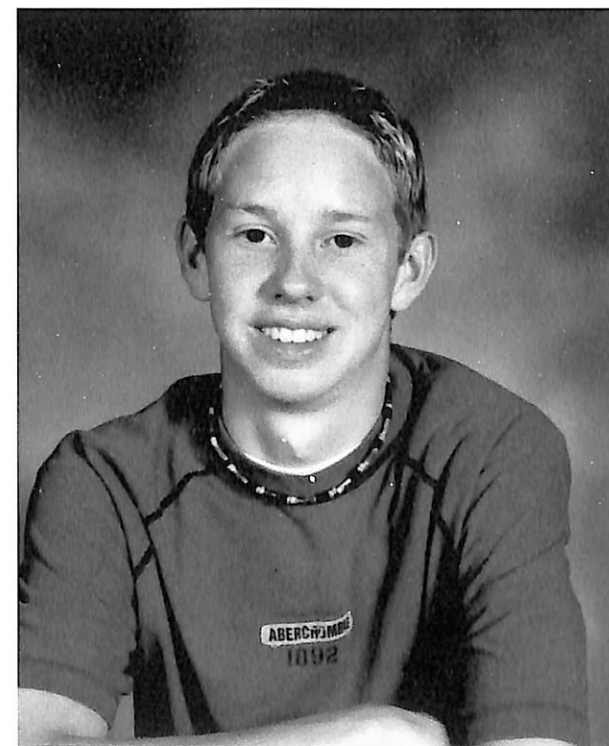

# Excel Recipients

The Clarksville-Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce initiated the Excelling in Education program in 1988. It is an ongoing cooperative effort of the Chamber and local businesses to honor area high school students who have achieved academic excellence or who have been models of exemplary citizens in the school setting. Three categories of cards are awarded- gold, silver, and blue. The gold cards are given to students who have received all A's for the semester.
