



It's time now to remember this year in your life! Remember the year, remember your friends, remember the days at FCHS. 259,200 Minutes...

































































A Memorable Year

The 2010-2011 Yearbook Staff proudly dedicates this year's publication to Mr. Gregory Ray Gillis.

Mr. Gillis can often be heard spreading his historical wisdom through his famous lectures as one passes by in the halls or sits in any classroom near to his own. Many times his students have heard his well-known jokes designed to make us laugh and learn. After all who can forget the year of the Great Charter when it was "right after lunch" 1215? Why else does the year 500 come to mind when we hear "Rall of Fome"? And how are we ever to forget our rivers again as long as we motion elbow, armpit, eye for "Elbe, Oder, Vistula"!

Mr. Gillis was born to Glenn and Mary Gillis on April 26, 1951, in Poplar Bluff, Missouri. His sister, Gail Lea, recalls many fond memories from their childhood. "He was a prototype for Bob-the-Builder. He built everything: Lincoln log cabins, tinker toy,

erector sets, and man did he love putting models together, especially cars. His two favorite sports were always baseball (2nd base) and football (quarterback). He spent hours in our backyard throwing a football through a suspended tire. He also worked for years on rebuilding an old Studebaker pickup truck. Greg was pretty doggoned good at just about everything."

Mr. Gillis began his career in a rural
Missouri high school, then spent a year teaching in a Catholic high school before taking a teaching job at FC Jr.
High School. After a few

years, he transferred to the high school. In his early years at FCHS, he coached football and wrestling. He's also taught as an adjunct professor of American history for the Austin Peay Center at Fort Campbell for almost twenty years.

He recently went back to school and received his certification as a nursing assistant (CNA). He hopes to use this training to help care for aging family members and as an option for work during retirement.


Mr. Gillis is married to Gail Gillis. He has one daughter, Hannah, and two step-children, Eric and Jennifer. In addition to his family, his faith is very important to him. He has been known to reach out and help others through Volunteers in Mission where he has participated in several trips to Guatemala to build a parsonage and a school as well as to the Gulf Coast to rebuild homes after Katrina. Mr. Gillis also traveled to China a few years ago and spent a month teaching conversational English to a group of children. His latest trip was to Boston, MA and Washington D.C. where he and his wife, Gail, toured the White House.









Vice President Joe Biden visits 3-peat Football State Champs


























































Things to Look Back on By: Betsy Grammel
