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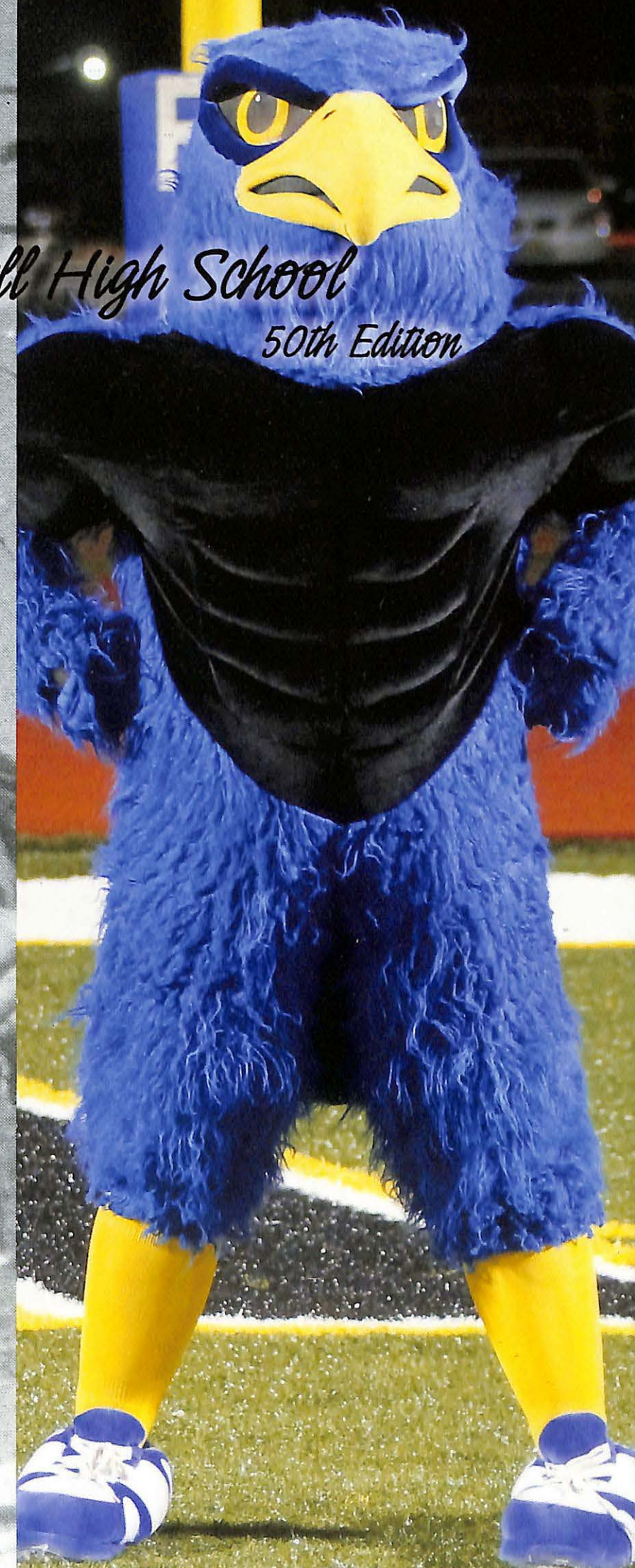

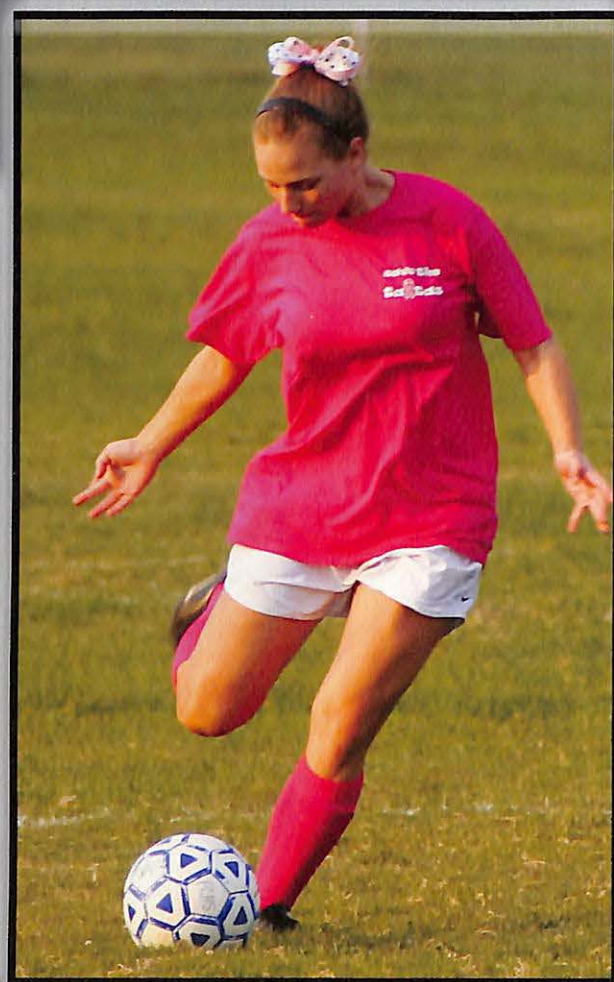

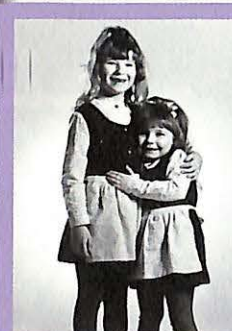
The 2011-2012 Yearbook Staff proudly dedicates this year's publication to Ms. Iris Loucks, or as everyone knows her, FRAU.

Fort Campbell's Finest Artists

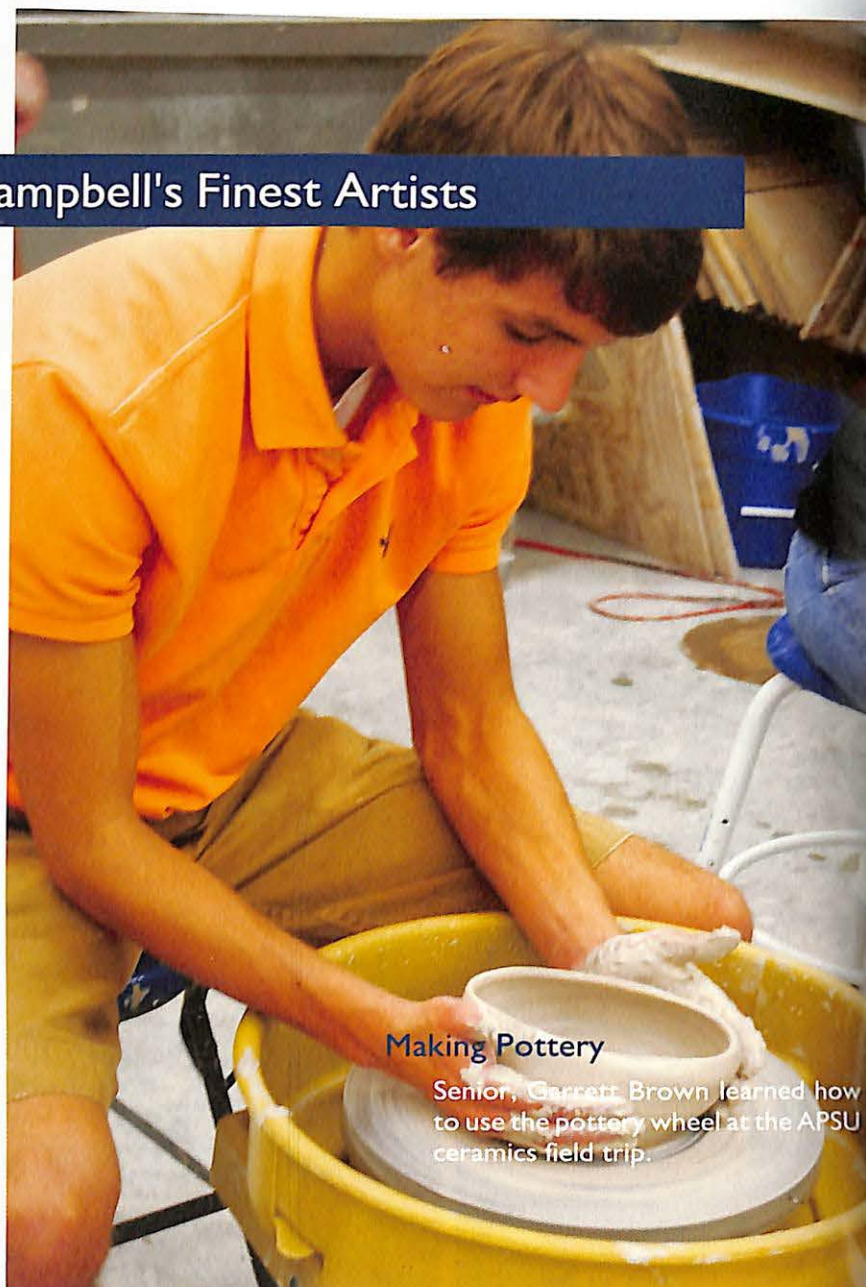

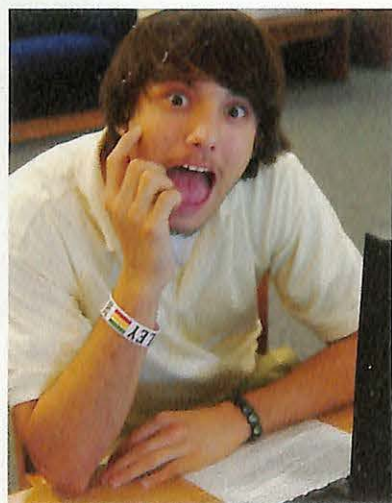
The All American Language

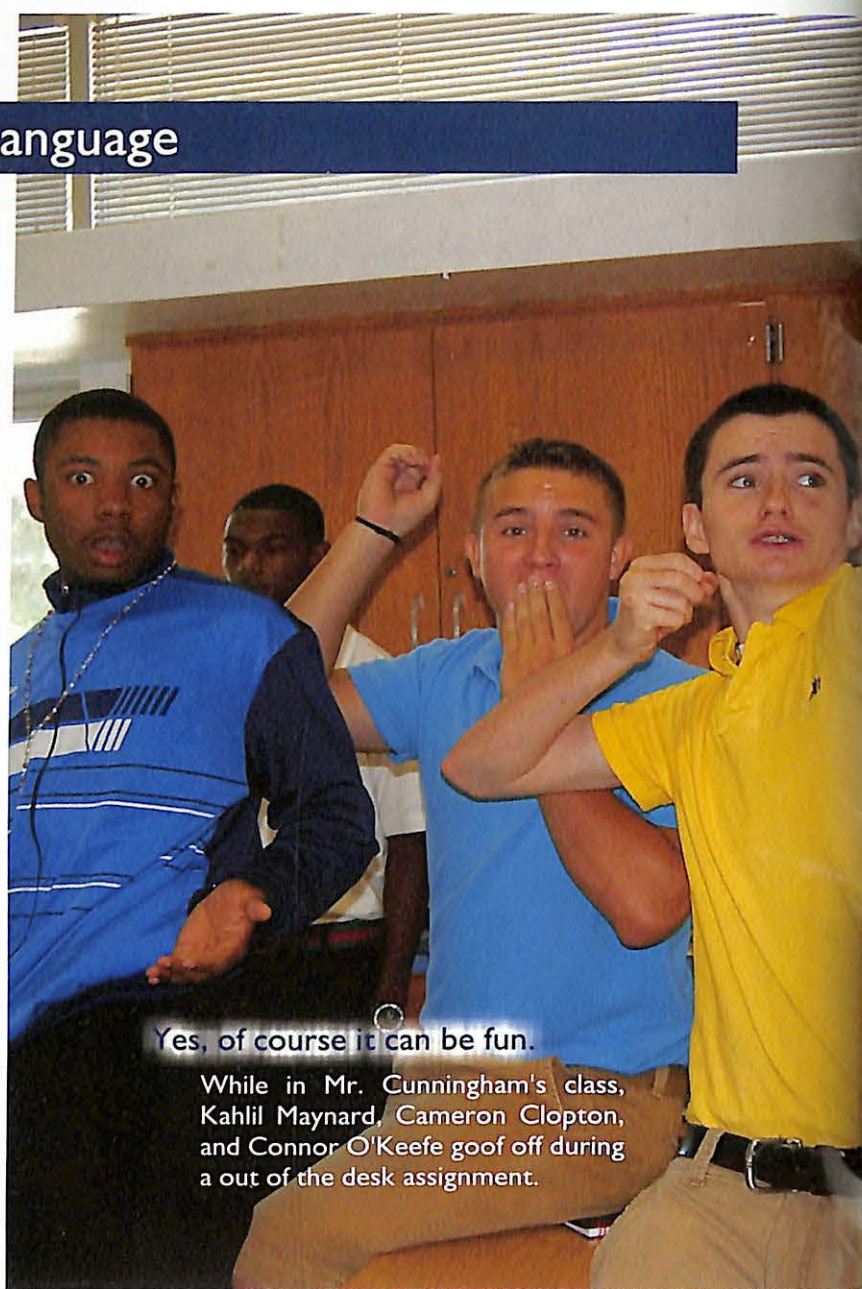

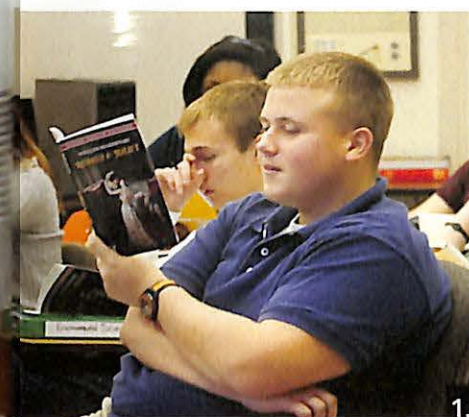
Teacher Spotlight

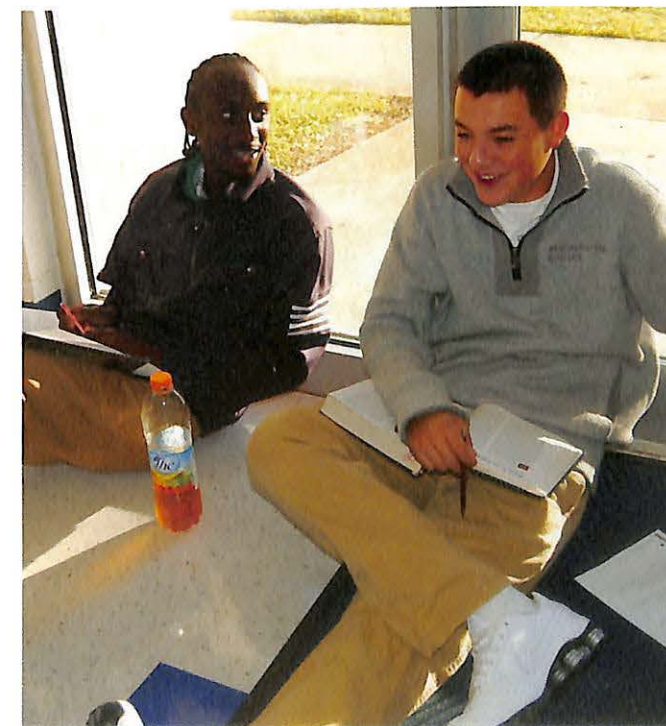

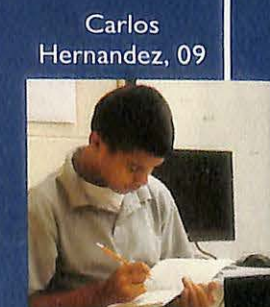

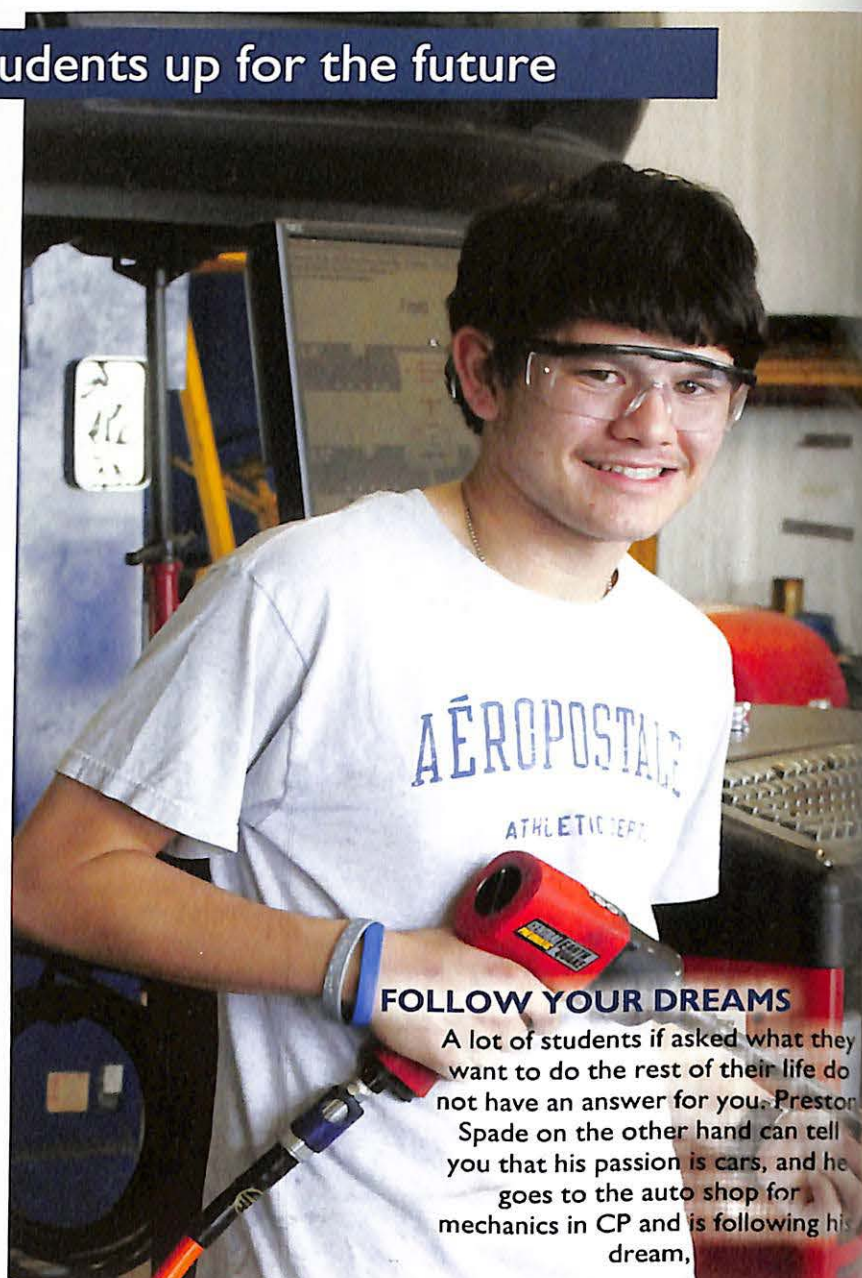
Career Practicum

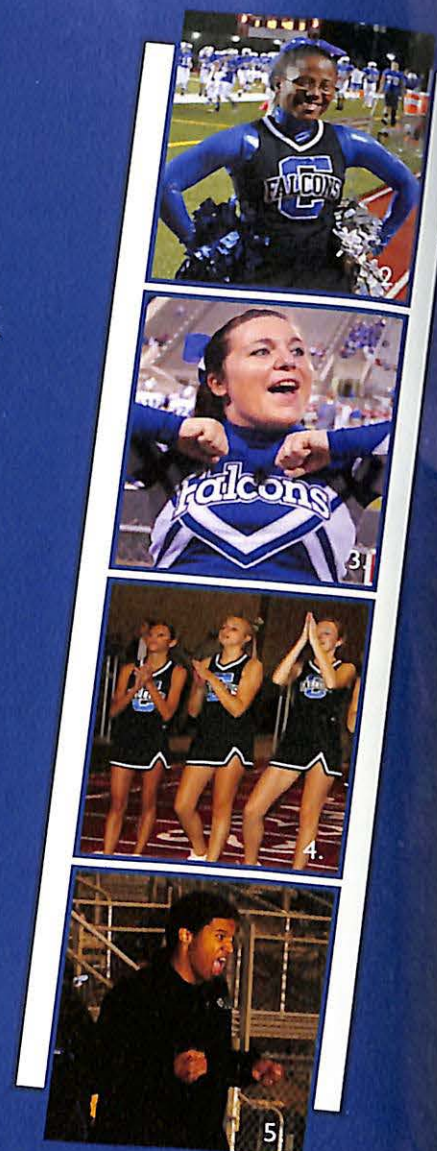

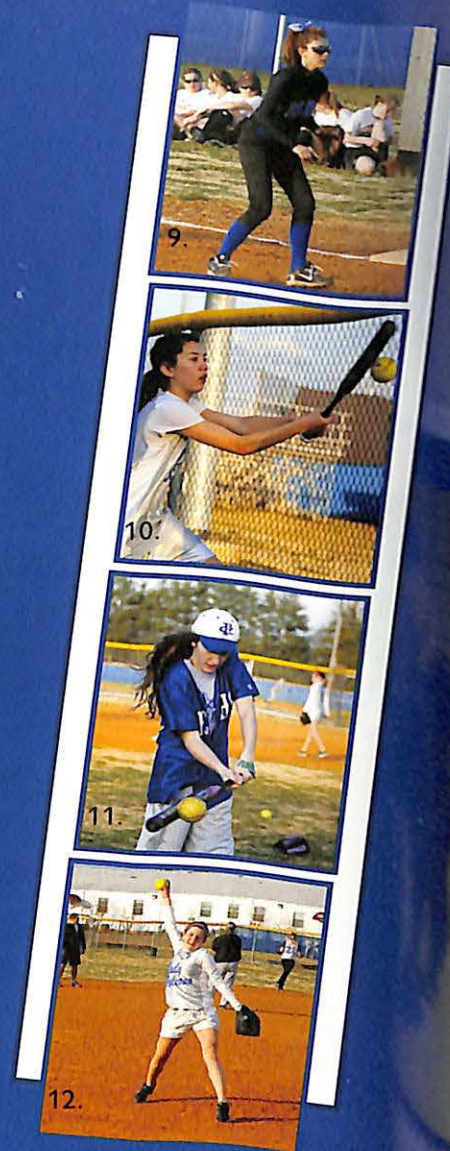

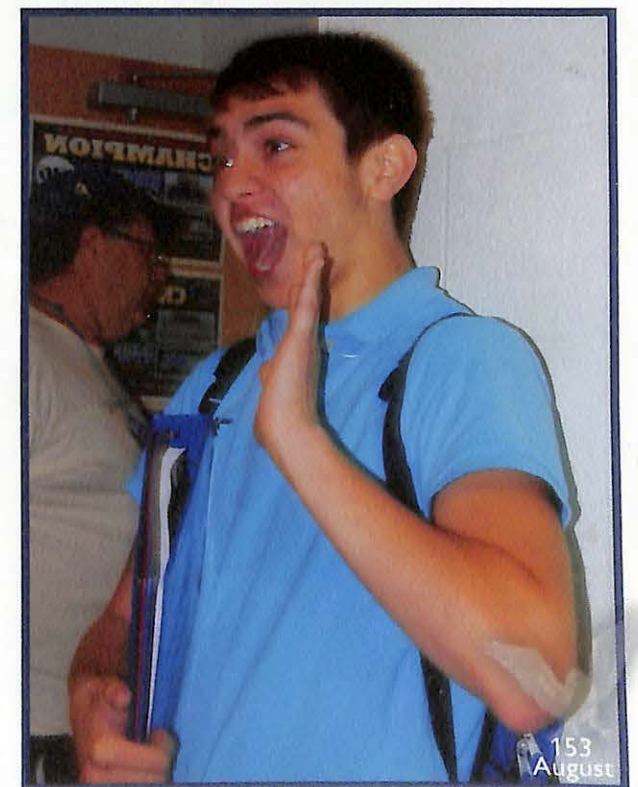
