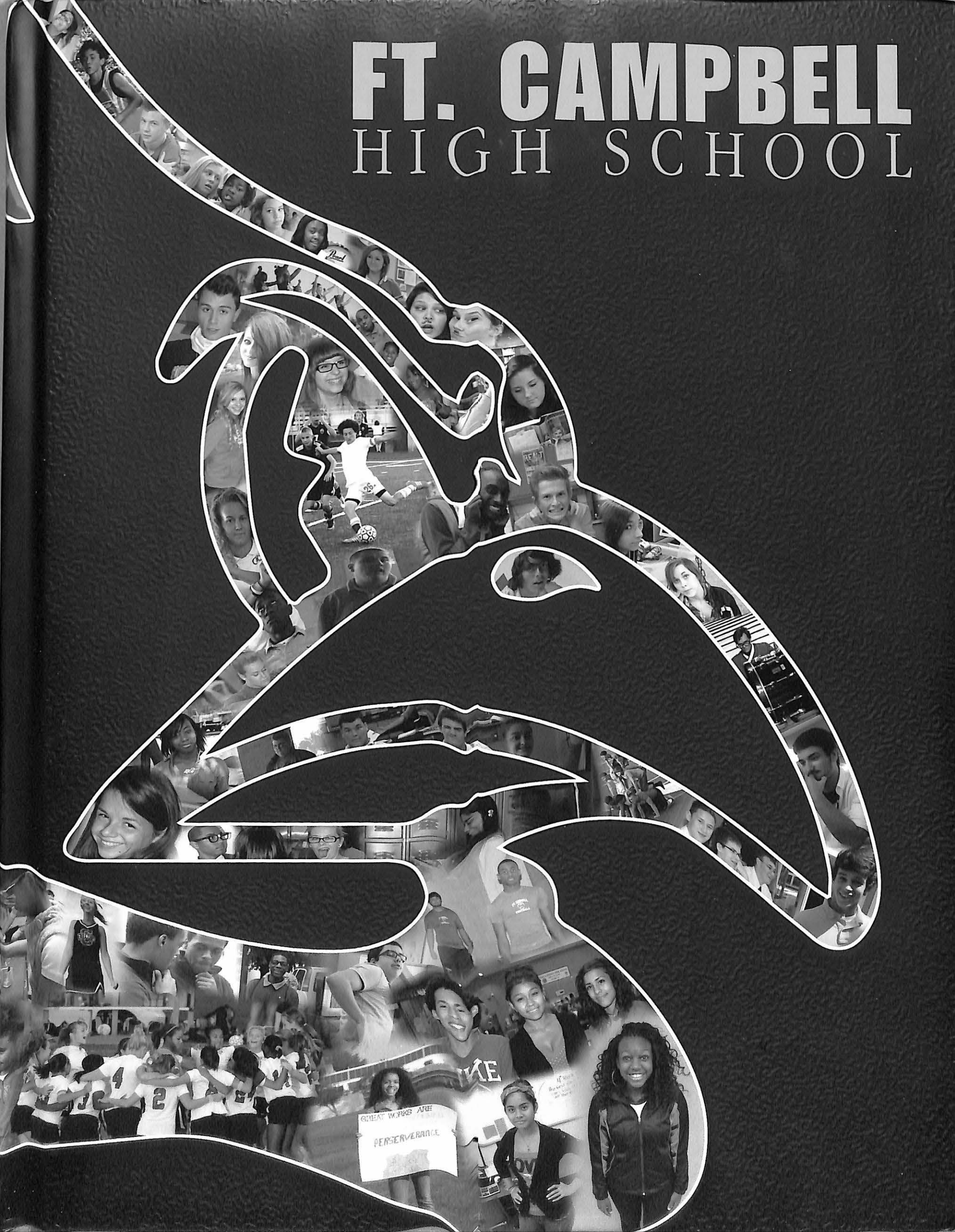

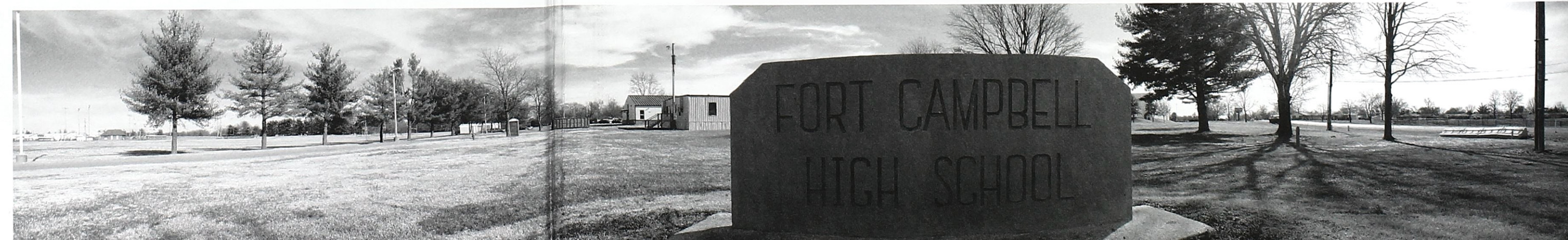

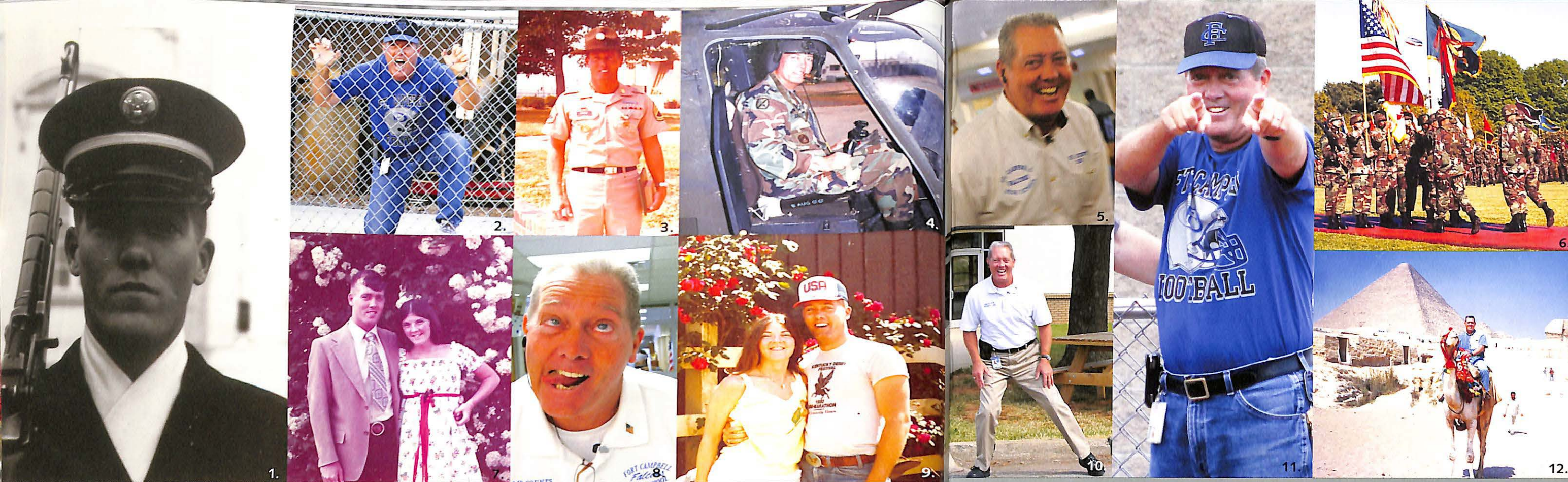

When most students see Mr. Counts they get intimidated. Every day he walks down the halls, walkie talkie strapped at his side, and he never misses a beat. If you didn't know better you'd say he was on a mission. If you actually got to know him, you would know that he IS on a mission and has been on several within his lifetime.

DCSM (Ret.) Gerard Counts, (his God given name that no one uses) Jerry, to his friends, has lived a life full of adventure. He was adopted at a young age and grew up in Brooklyn, NY. At the age of 20, Mr. Counts enlisted into the United States Army. His reason for joining the army was simple; he wanted to volunteer to fight for his country during the Vietnam War. He knew it was his patriotic duty to serve.

During his first assignment in Virginia in 1970, Jerry Counts fell in love and married his wife Jenny. They had two beautiful daughters, Valerie and Elizabeth. Mr. Counts was a guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington Cemetery. This prestigious position is not easy to get. In fact, fewer than twenty percent of the applicants are accepted for the position. He had to memorize all 175 people buried at Arlington at the time, sleep in the catacombs, and was expected to guard in hurricane or shine.

Later, while stationed with the 10th Mountain Division at Ft. Drum, NY, his unit was called to Mogadishu, Somalia. Mr. Counts and his division were involved in the Black Hawk Down incident, of which a movie was made. Though his specific efforts are not shown in the film, the valor awards earned from the tour meant more than being the subject of the film. DCSM Counts recalled his memory of the war while talking to the M.U.N class last fall. "I have not seen the movie. I don't want to see the movie. And I never will see the movie. I lived it."

After 33 years of service, CSM Jerry Counts retired from the military. Not being one to sit around idling, he became the FCHS resource officer in 2001. He patrols the halls and keeps us safe. He truly cares about everyone here. Over the years he has become a strong supporter and motivator of Falcon football. Mr. Counts has a way of getting people fired up! Though he spends a lot of his time at the school, he does have other interests which include spending time with his grandchildren and riding his Harley.

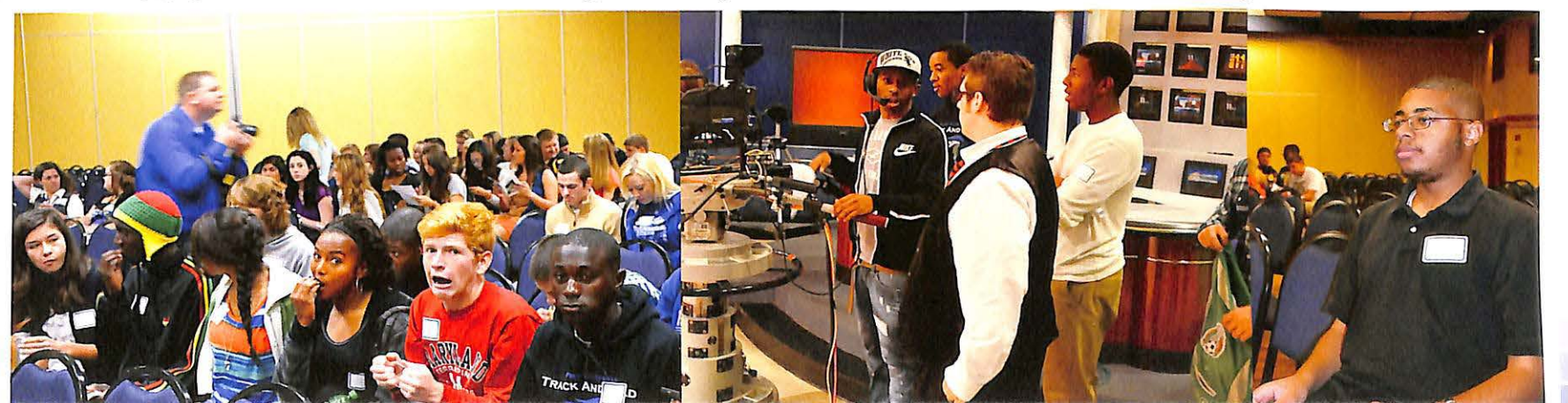

The Advanced German class went out the Edelweiss Cafe to eat.

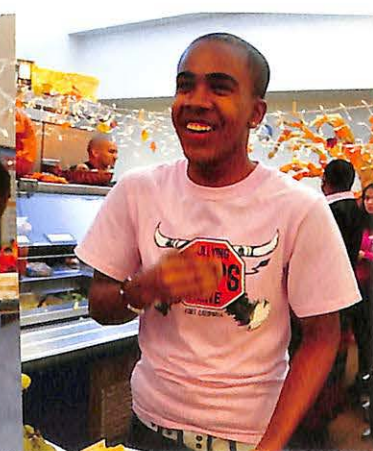

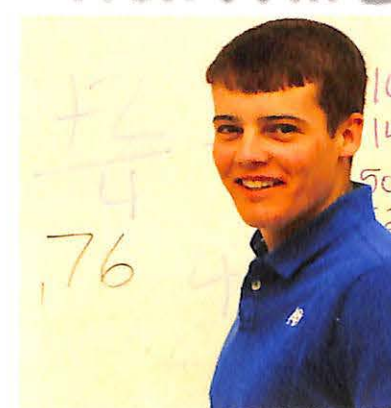
## Ms. Greene's View

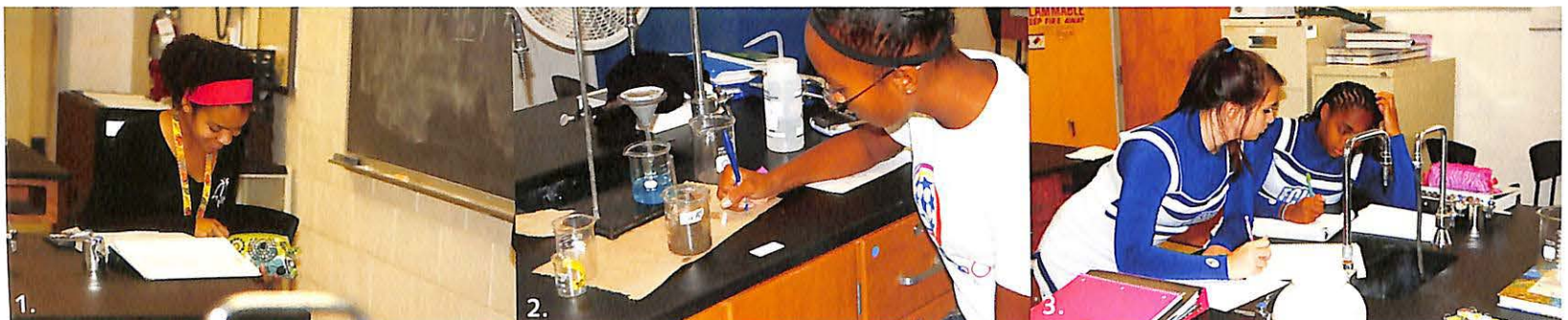
The most exciting phrase to hear in science, the one that heralds the most discoveries, is not "Eureka!" (I found it!) but "that's funny..."

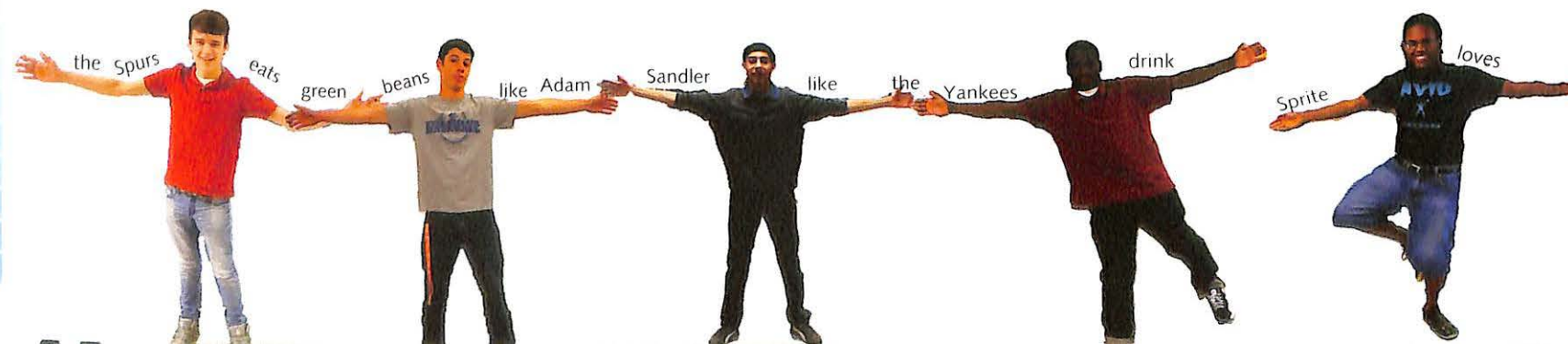

players improved over the course of the season.

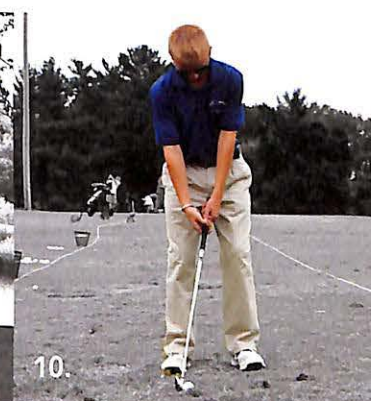

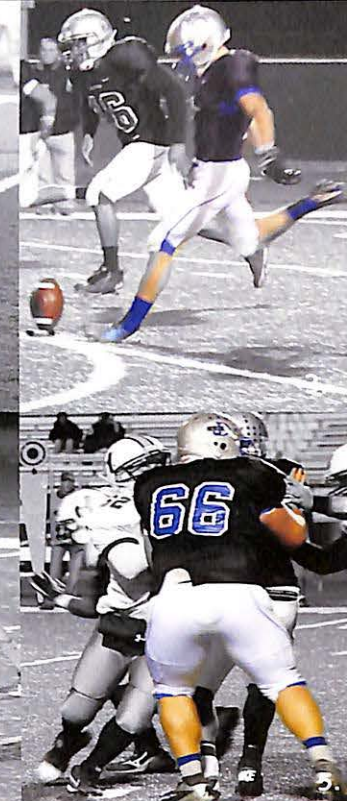
# FOOTBALL

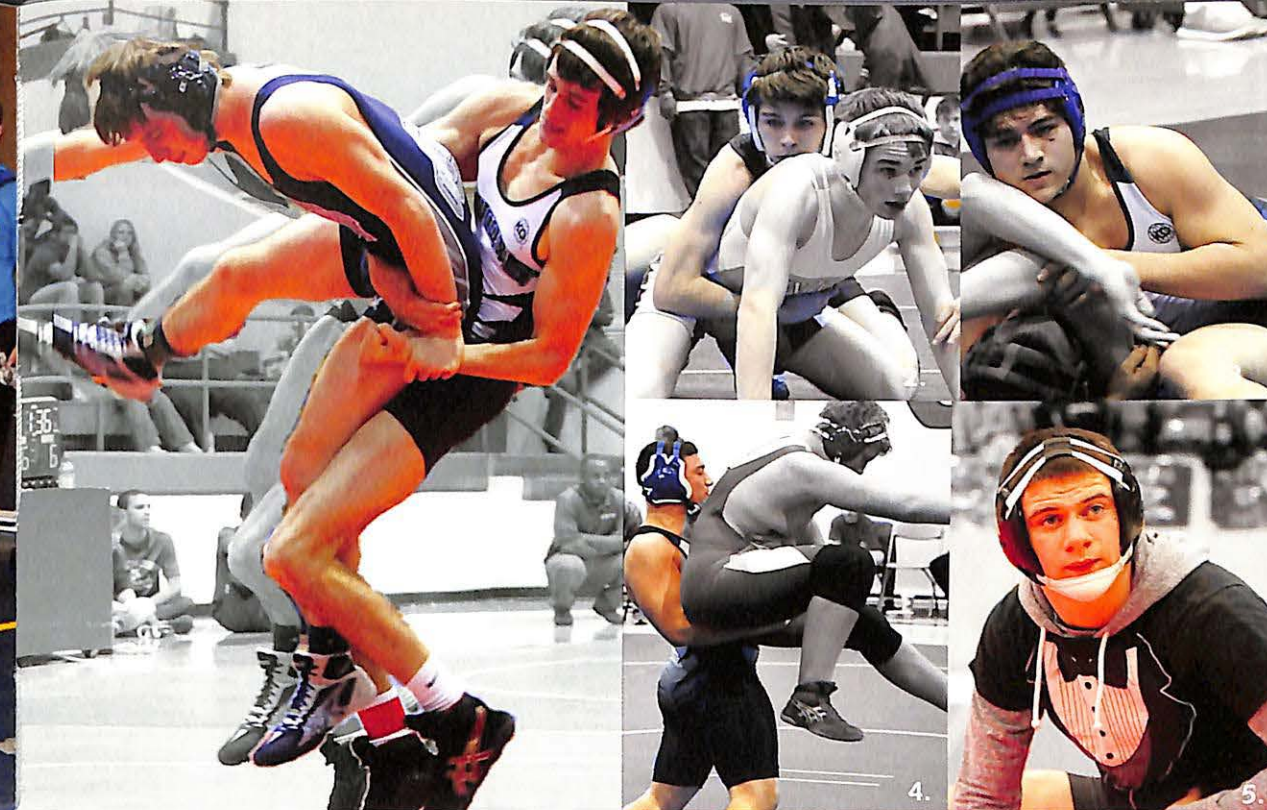
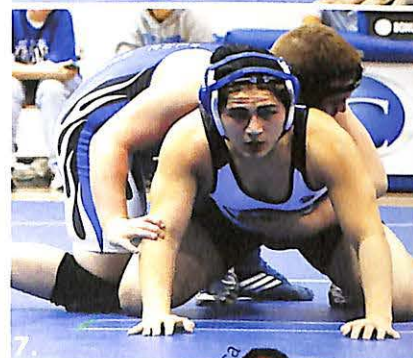
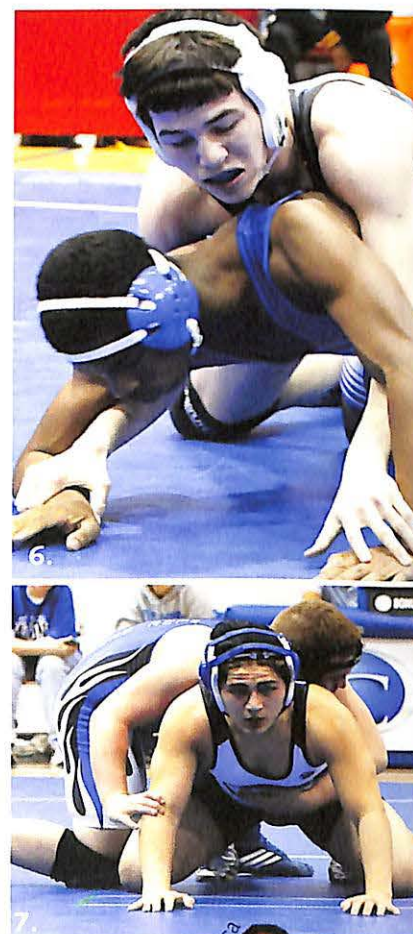
# Boys Wrestling

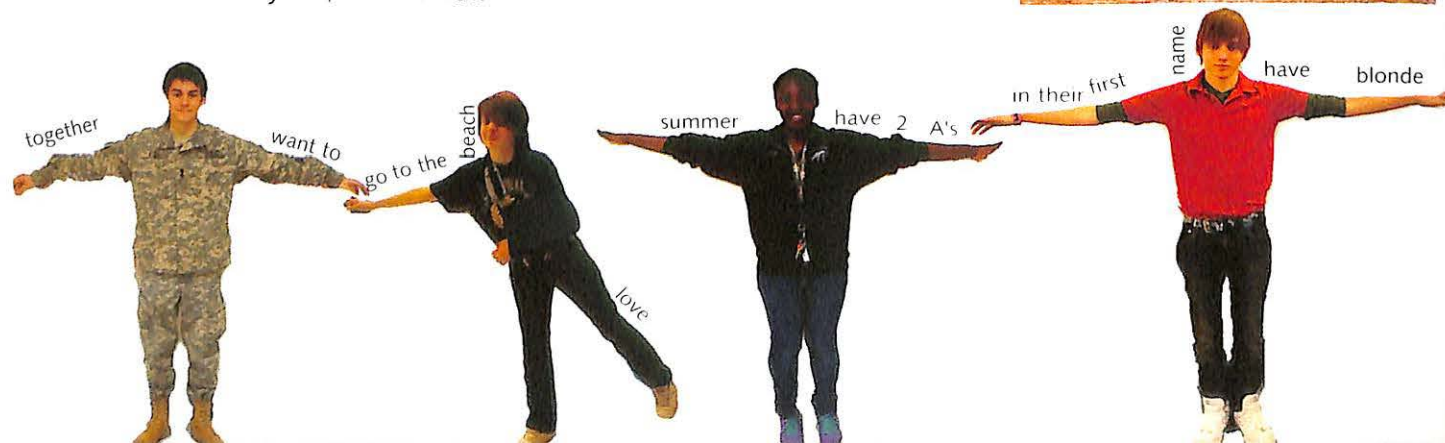
# BOYS BASEBALL

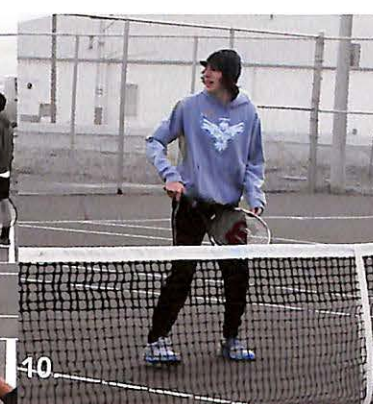
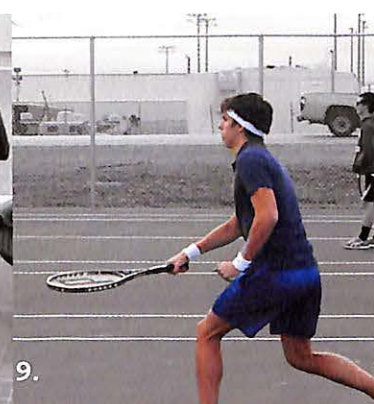
No matter what the outcome, the members of the FCHS Tennis Team supported each other during every match.

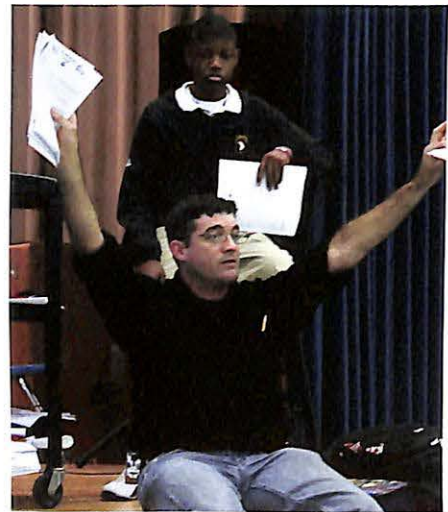
## Senior Service Project

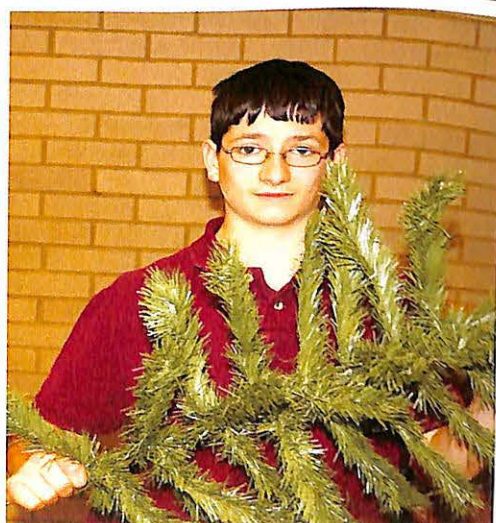
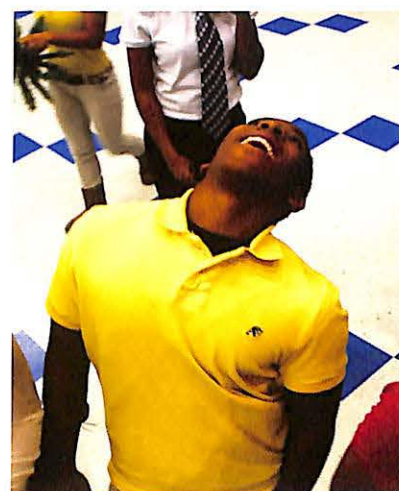


## Anime Club
