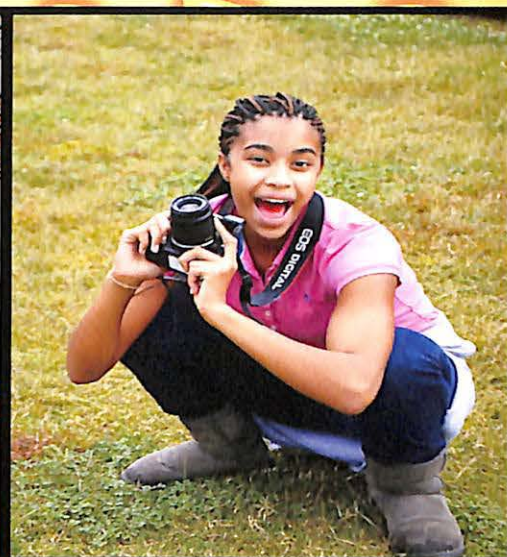
WE AREN'T CREEPERS! WE ARE YEARBOOK

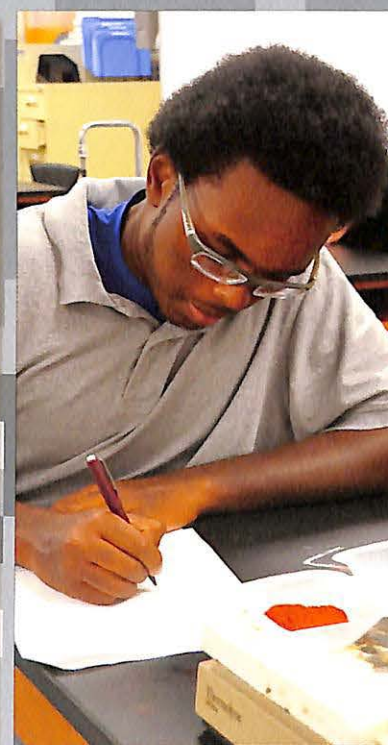
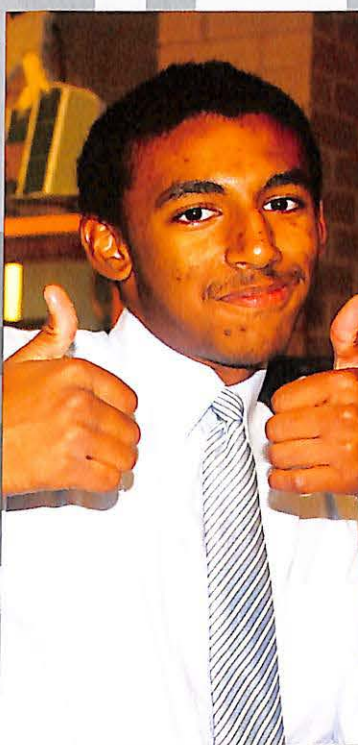


Our story begins...

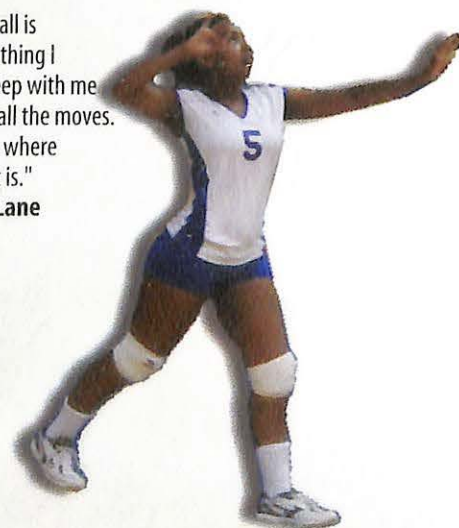

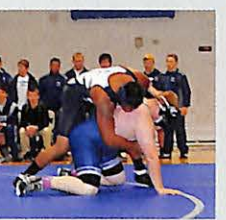
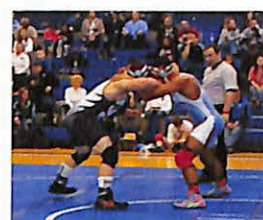


The Tough Guys

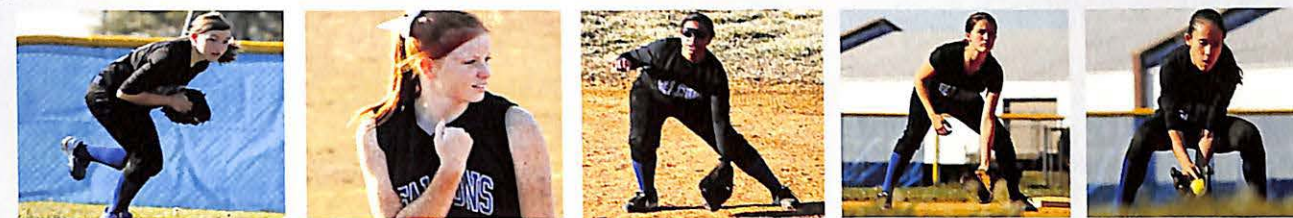

Nia Gibbs-Francis usually competes in four events, but high jump is her favorite. Her best jump is five feet and five inches!



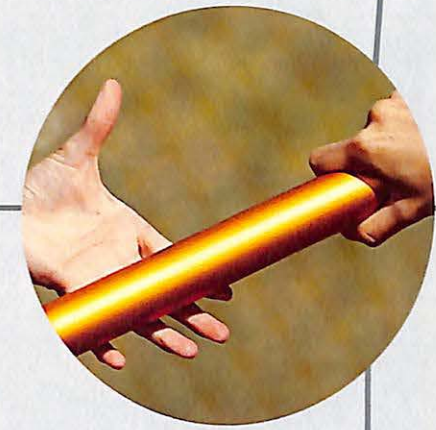
