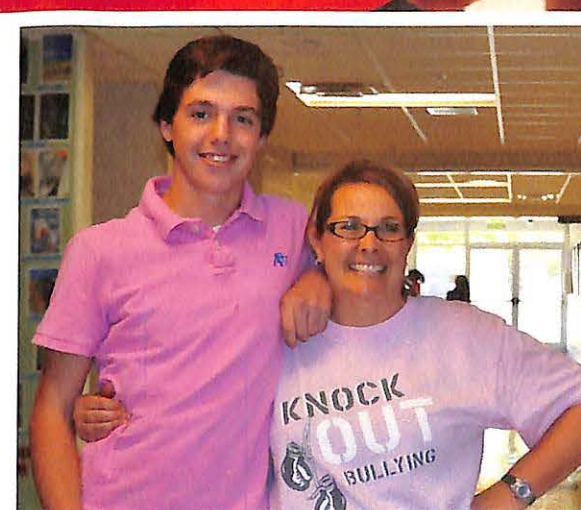
# OUT WITH THE OLD, in with the Blue!

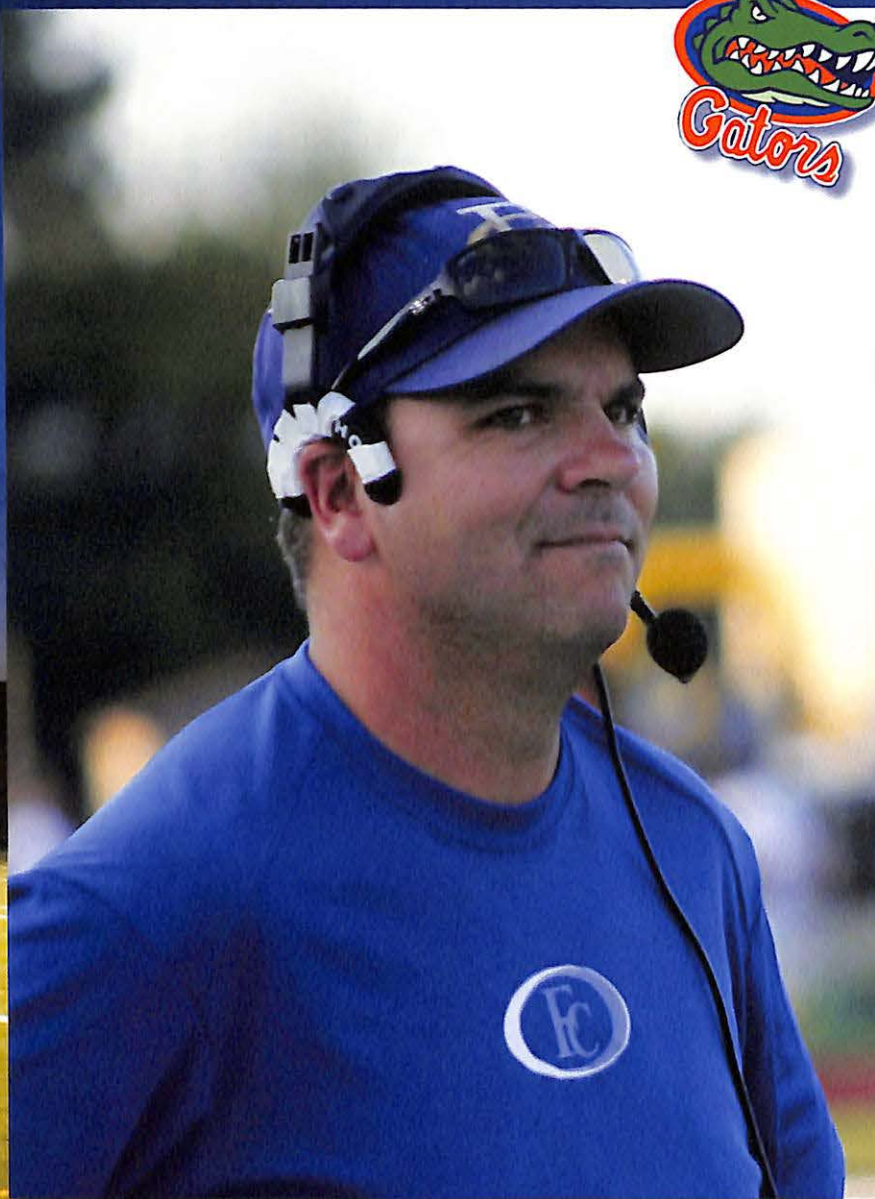

# Coach Shawn Berner



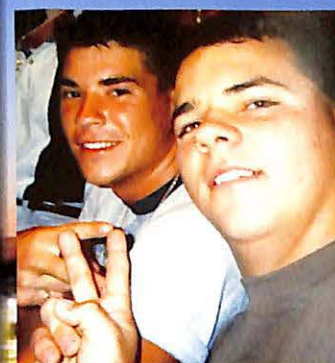
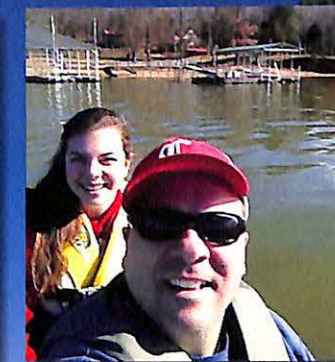

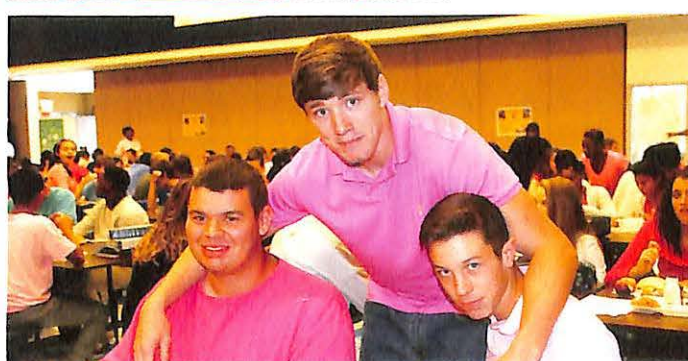
## The Legacy

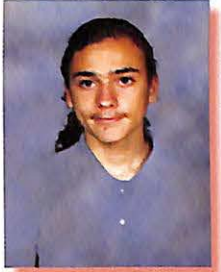

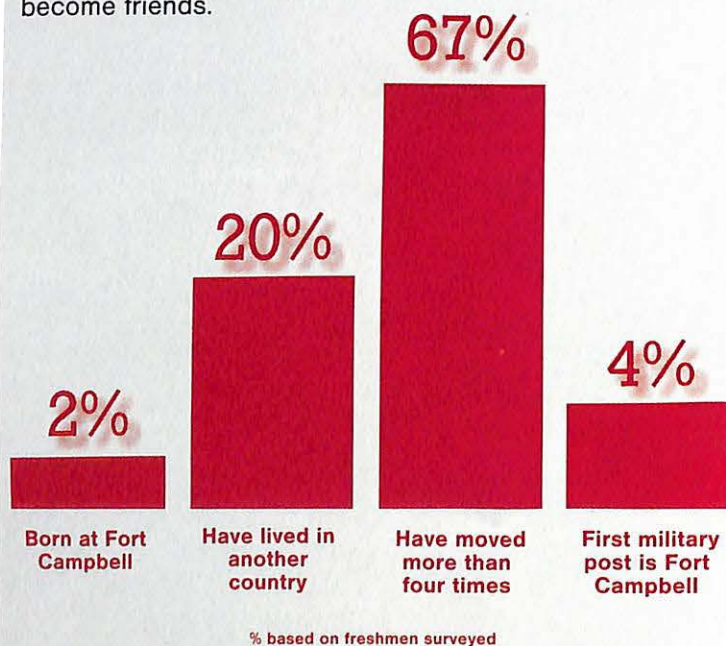

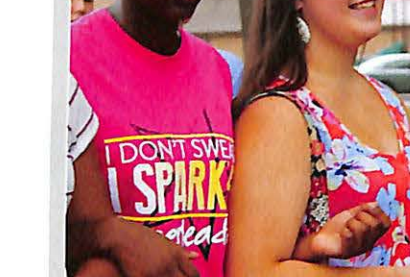
## Welcoming the Blue

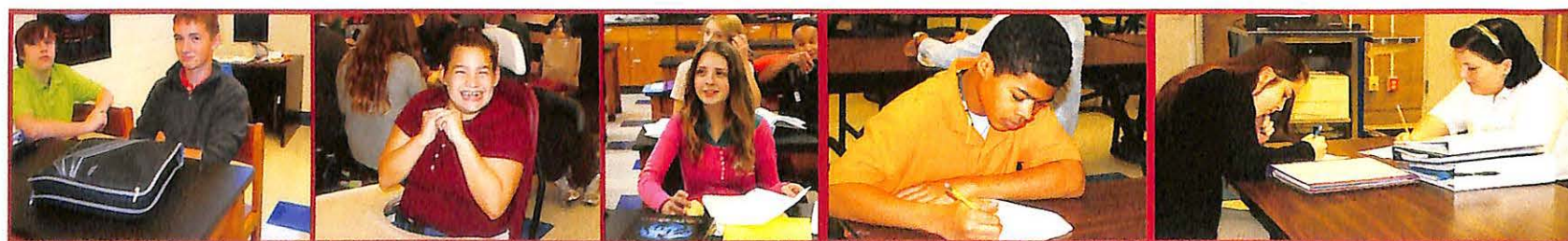

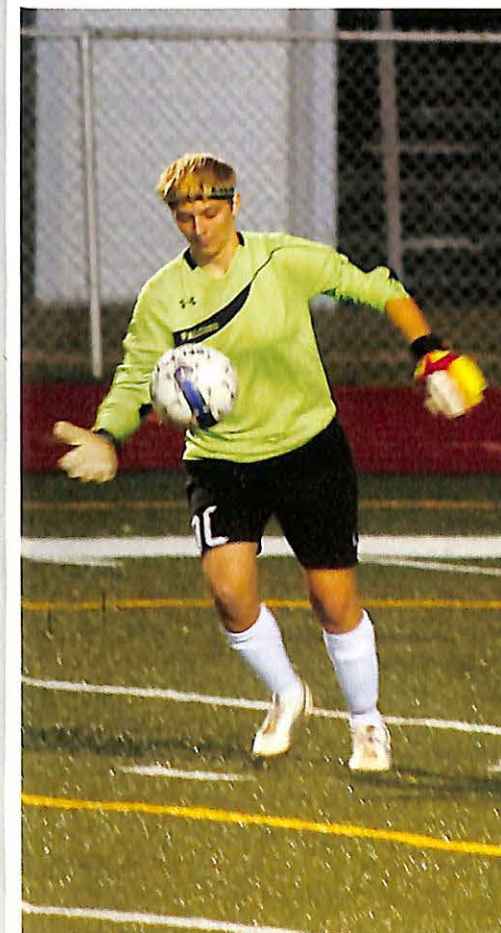

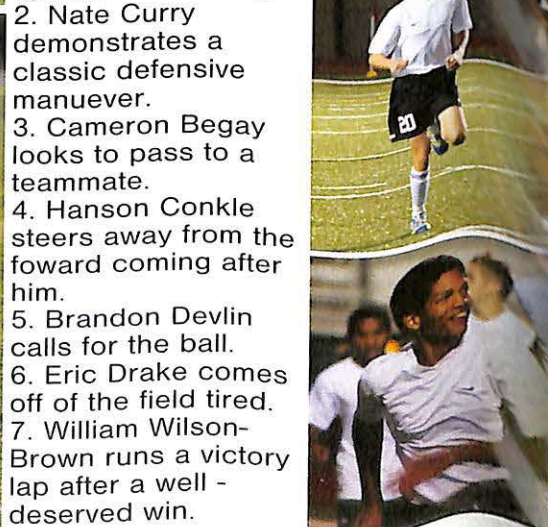

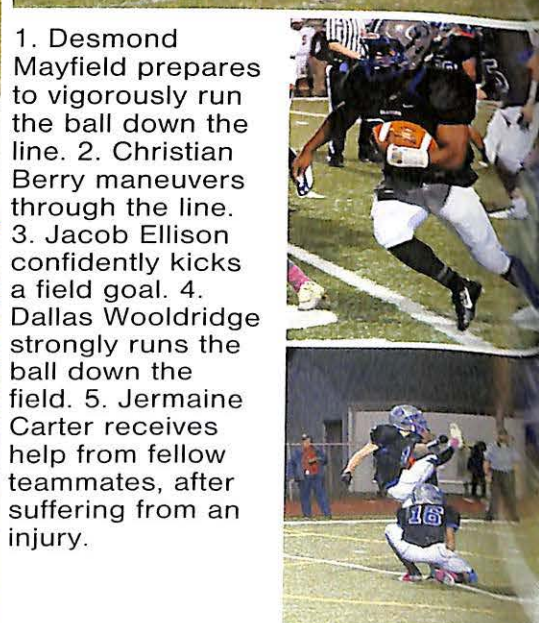

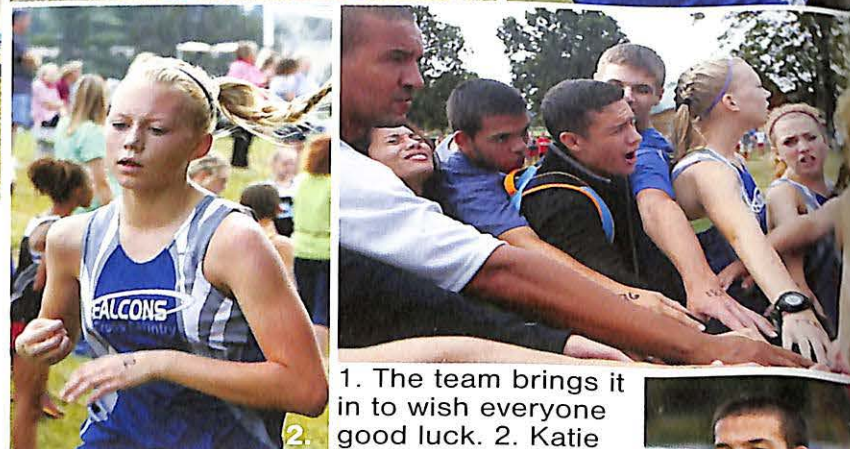

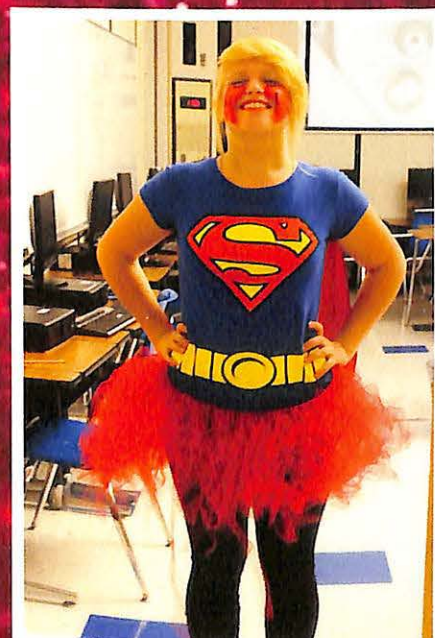
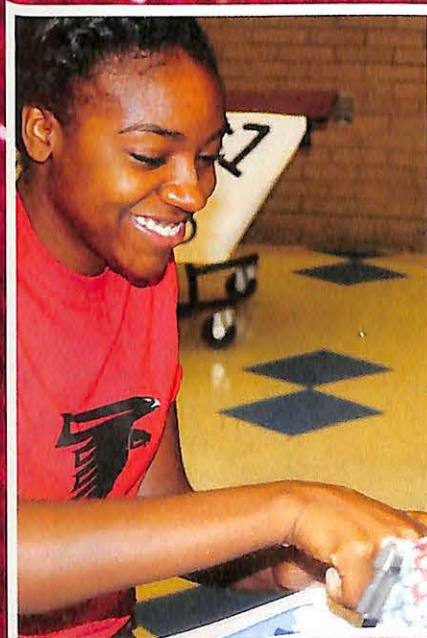
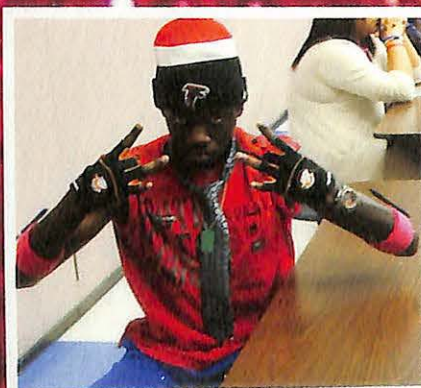
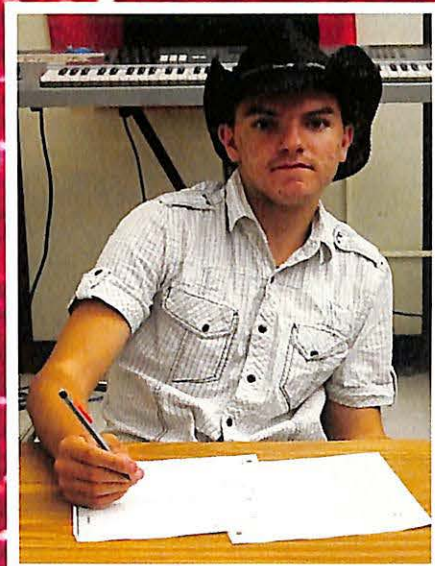
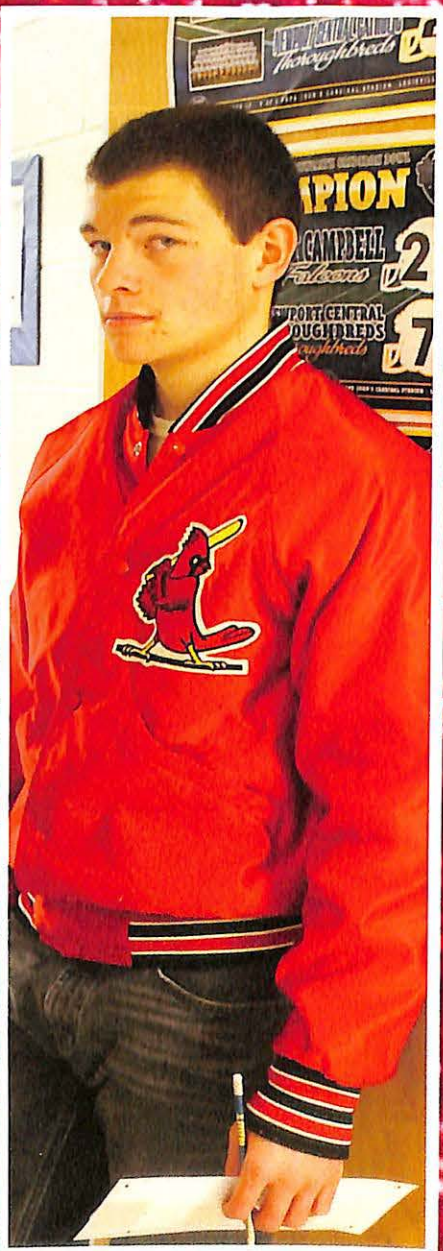




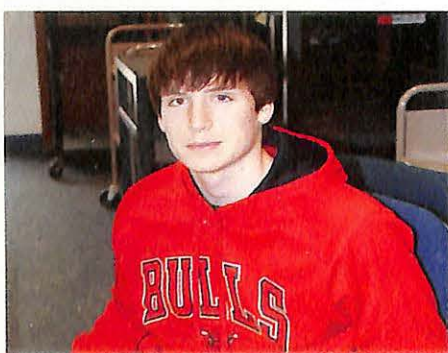
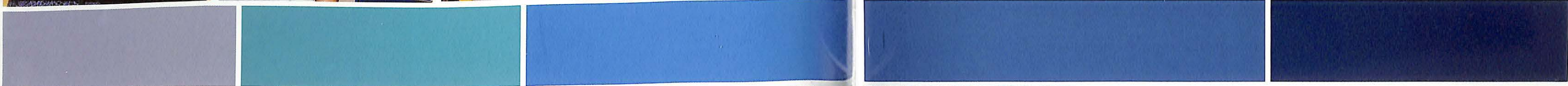
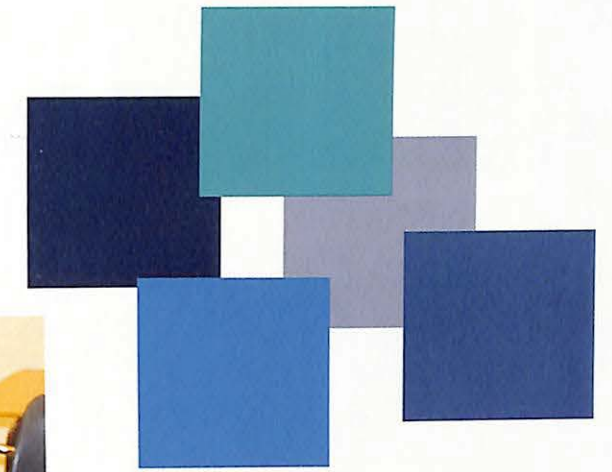
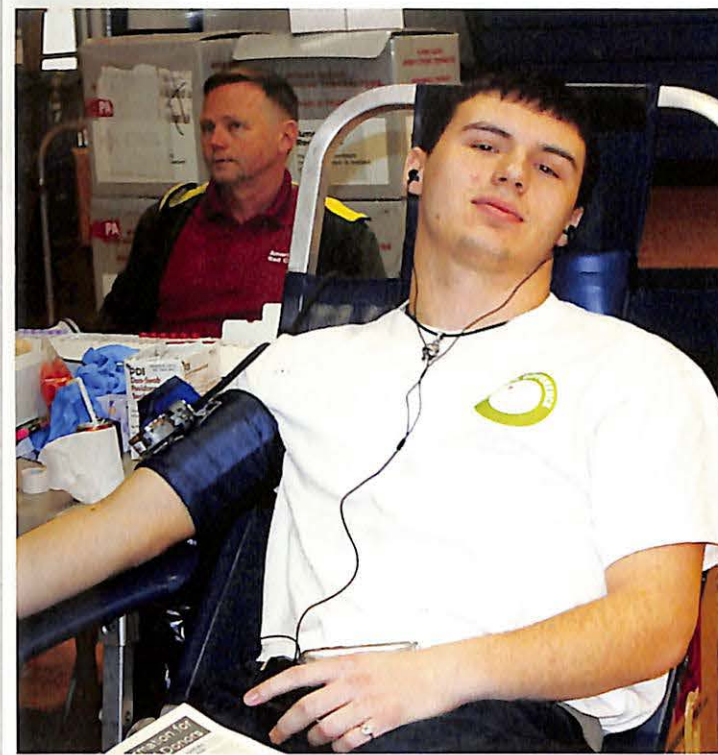
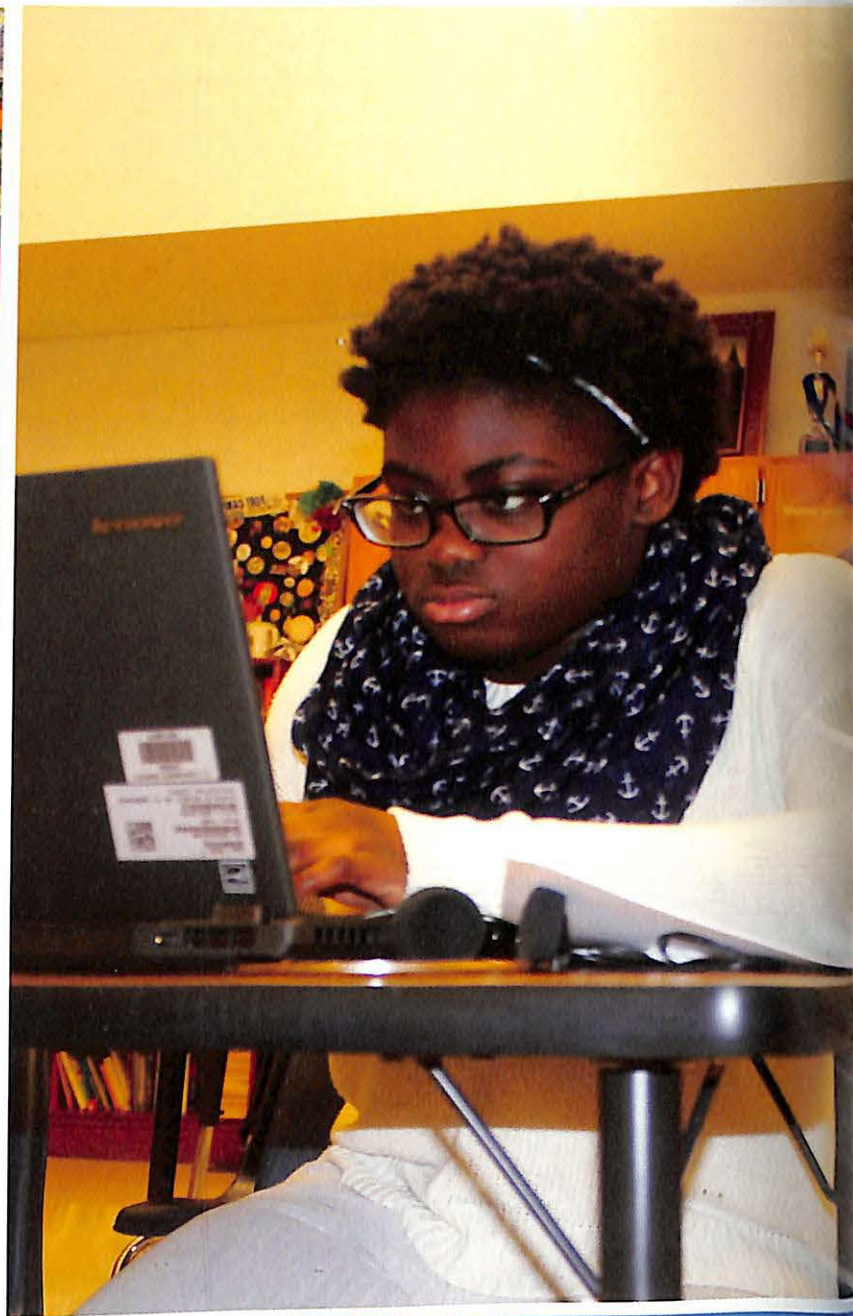
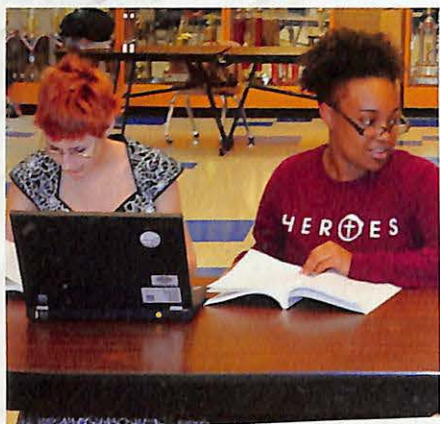
# Red Ribbon Week

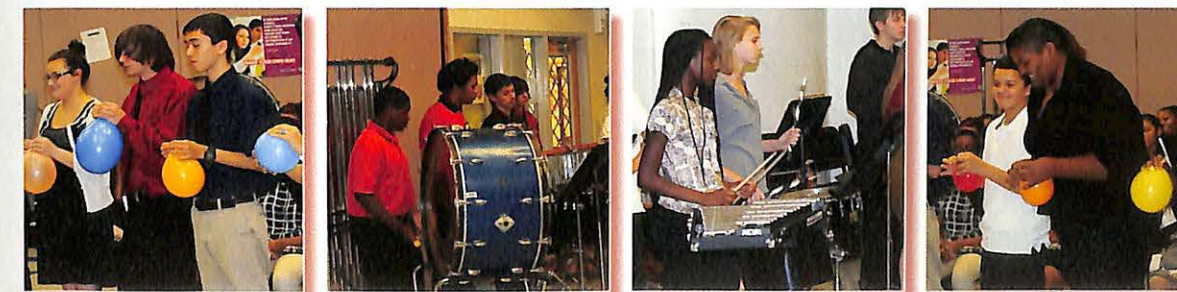
Taking a moment of silence, the FCHS choir performed on Veteran's Day to honor the hard working service men and women very dear to our hearts.

January 29th, the FCHS juniors and seniors took a mandatory test called the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, also known as the ASVAB. The ASVAB is a multiple choice assessment that is broken into sub-tests that test your knowledge in general science, reading comprehension and sentence fluency, math, mechanical comprehension, and several other subjects. The scores are later compiled into a number that tells you what jobs you are eligible for in each of the five branches of the military. The lowest score you can get on the assessment and still be able to enlist is a 31 which would qualify you for the army. The highest score you can get on the ASVAB is in the 99th percentile.

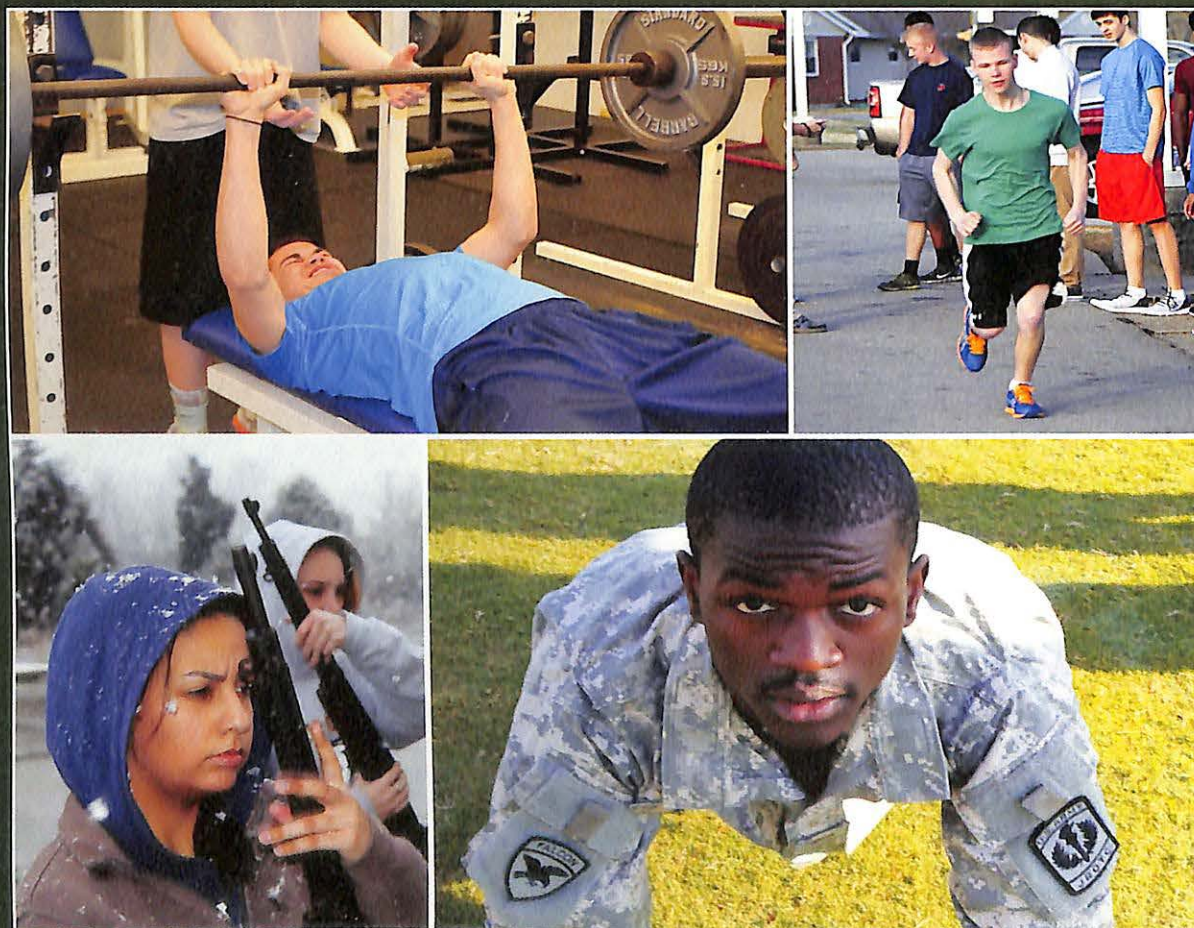
## Learning Experience

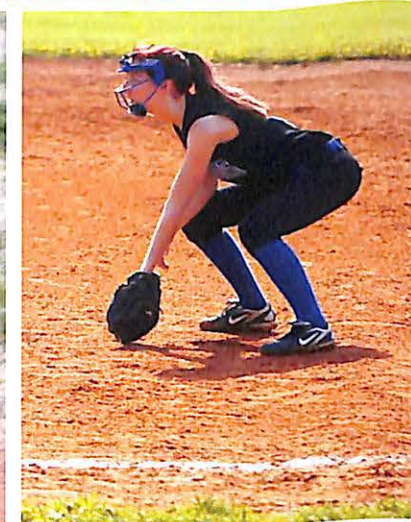

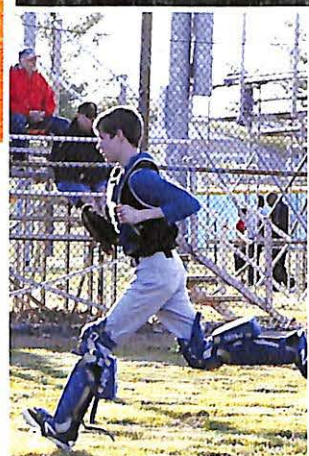

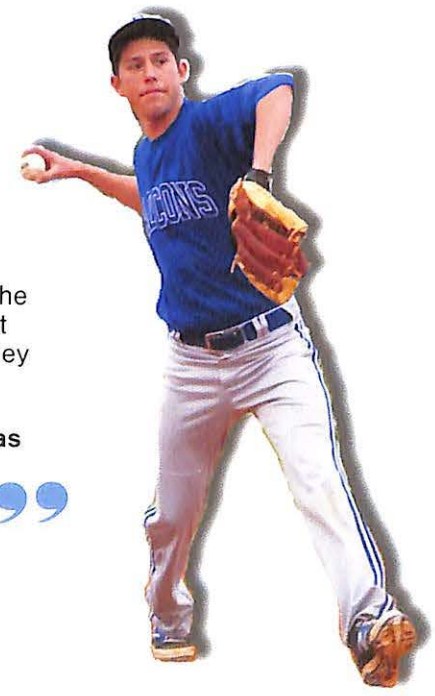

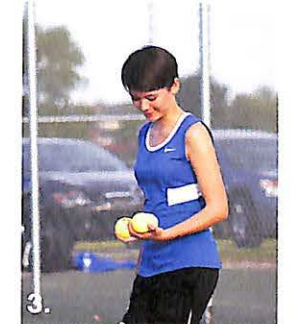

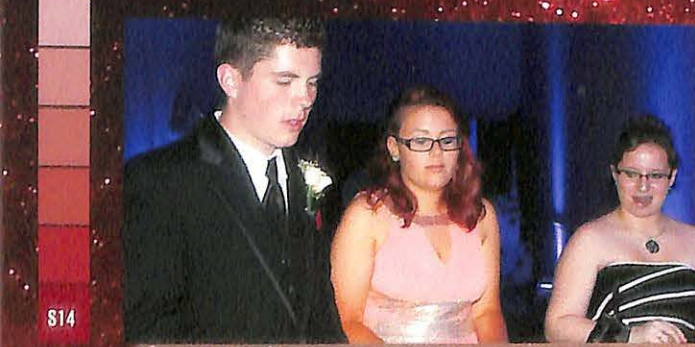
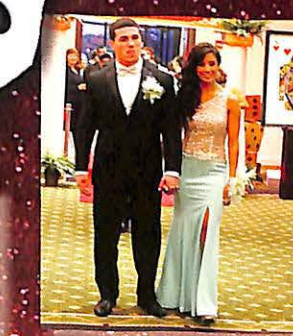
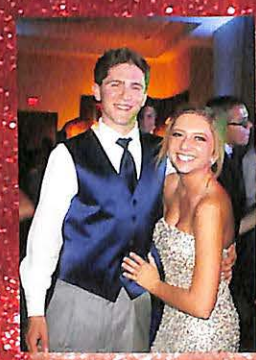
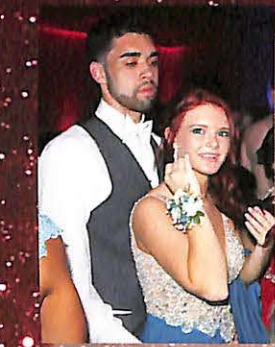




# PROM

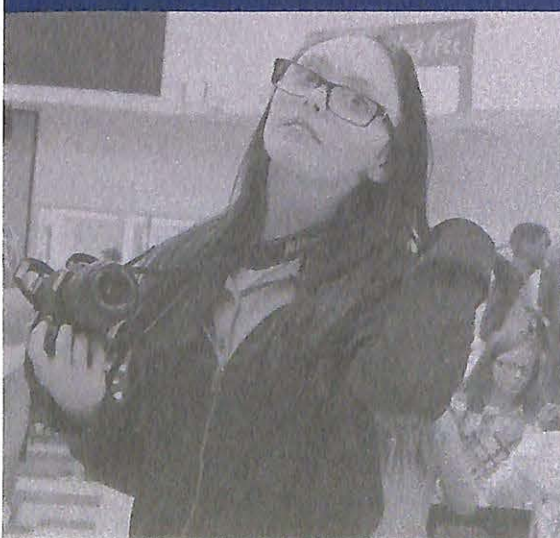

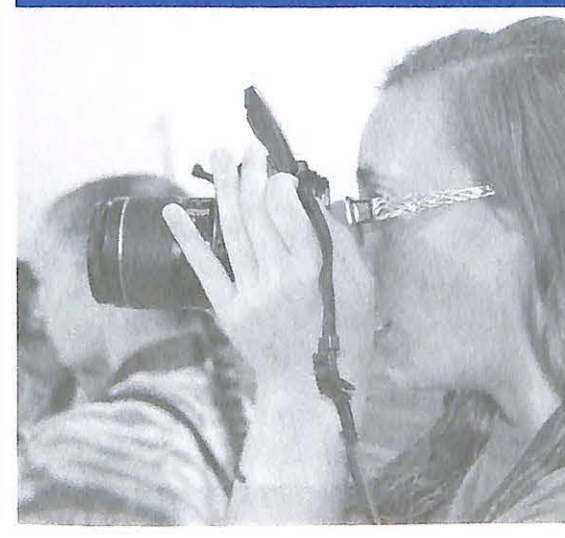

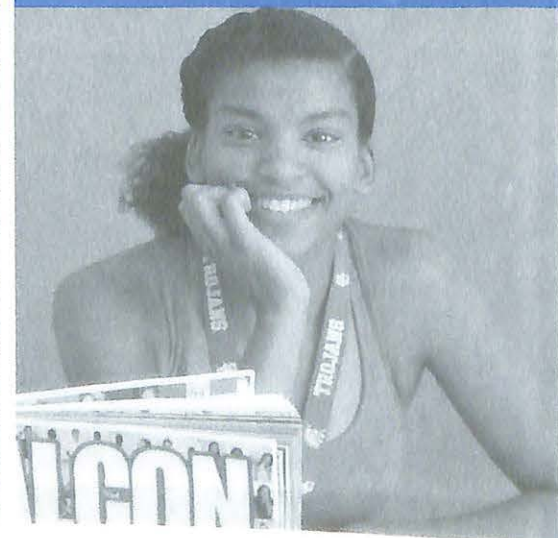
