



# Looking Back

## The Falcon Journey


In 1962, Fort Campbell High School was established to allow all military dependents to attend the same school. Prior to this, soldier's children were spread throughout the surrounding county schools. That year began with juniors and seniors starting their journey on Forrest Ave. in the building now known as Wassom Middle School. Seven years later, the Falcons added sophomores and increased their population as they moved into today's Mahaffey Middle School building. With each move, memories were made and traditions honored.

902 Bastogne Avenue became the Falcons new home in 1985 as freshmen joined the mix bringing the school to its current 9-12 status. Thirty-two years later, 21st century education could no longer be denied. In August 2018, the Falcons will move once again into a state of the art new school erected on what used to be the high school soccer practice field. Some may remember having the homecoming bonfire in that location, while others ran on the side of the road for PE. More memories for were made and traditions still honored.

Looking back, the progression of secondary education at Fort Campbell mirrors what the life of a military child encompasses. Transiency is a major aspect of military life. Adaptability is a Falcons greatest strength. Ending up at the final destination, wherever that may be, is not what makes this school unique. The Falcon spirit lives long inside that military kid. The traditions learned and the memories made along the journey sometimes can't be explained but will undoubtedly cause the exclamation, "What a ride"!

Following in his father's footsteps, Mr. Puhr joined the military and spent twenty years in government service. He lived through events that are now part of history. When Mount St. Helen's erupted in 1980, he was stationed at Ft. Lewis, Washington, and took part in a search and rescue operation to assist with the devastation. While stationed in Germany with his wife in 1989, the Berlin Wall fell, so they were able to hammer pieces off of the wall.

Mr. Puhr attended college courses while in the military, and once he retired from the army, finished his teaching degree at Austin Peay State University with a BA in history. He began teaching World History, World Regions, and Honors World History at Fort Campbell High School in 2002. As a member of the social studies department, Mr. Puhr was always the voice of reason and his colleagues appreciate his candor and team spirit. As the assistant boys soccer coach for FCHS for six years, he brought his wisdom to the field.

He married his wife, Seresa, on May 28, 1977. They are blessed with four sons, all of which served in the military: Patrick Jr., Robert, Matthew, and Benjamin. 




# Getting the Goal






Coaches are one of the most important things for a team to have. They help motivate and encourage the whole team to do their very best. Without a coach for guidance, there would be no team.


## AP Environmental Science, AP Biology, Physics, Human Anatomy, Earth and Space Science, Chemistry, Biology, and Environmental Science




## Personal Fitness, Conditioning, Lifetime Sports, Health, Activity and Nutrition




















# Homecoming Highlights






## Monday: Patriot Day...


# Continuing the Falcon Journey...
