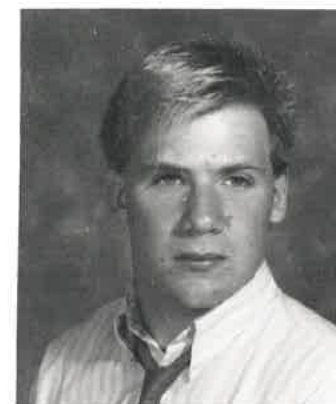


Nikki Rodriguez

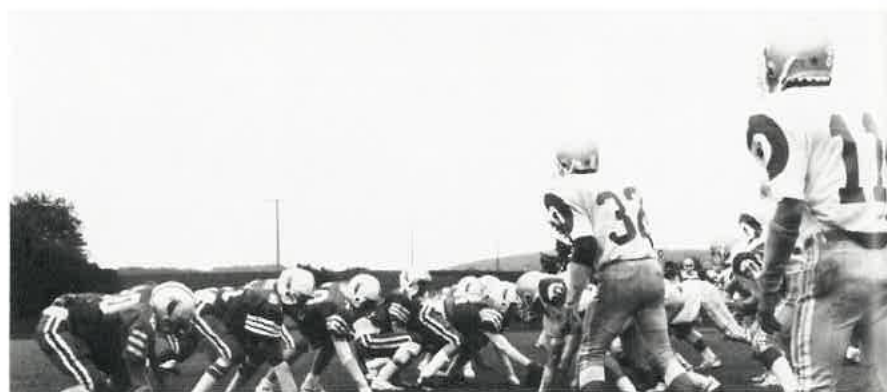

Fulda Falcons Clinch Class A Championship

The curtain has fallen on another super year for Fulda High's football team. For the second year in a row, the Falcons have won the small schools European Championship.

The road to the championship was much more challenging this year. Replacing 17 out of 22 starters from the championship team last year was a monumental task. The team enjoyed the return of all-Europe Quarterback Jay Harris, all-Europe Tight End Ron LaLonde, Center Chris Rogers and defensive starters Leon Winfrey and Curtis Claxton. The seniors had quite a load to bear.

Senior David Ferry, Shannon Moore, Jeff O'Bannon, Tom Ward, Ivory Carter, Allen MacIver and Jamar Coley came through to fill in spots that had been deemed impossible to fill and strong play by many juniors and sophomores helped to fill in spaces created by the loss of the 17 starters from the year before.

By winning the championship for the second year in a row, Fulda joins the ranks of the High School elite. Before

Fulda, only one other high school (Geissen) has managed to win-back-to-back championships.

Fulda began the 1989 season on the road against Osterholz with a 18-6 victory. The team followed that up with another road victory, 18-0, over Karlsruhe before beginning a home stand that saw the Falcons dominate Soesterberg, 54-0, Brussels, 46-6, and Bonn, 64-8, respectively. Fulda's only stumble came at Bad Kreuznach, 6-0, the last Saturday in October. A driving rain and seven offensive fumbles spelled doom for the Falcons. The following weekend was a do-or-die game against Ulm. Due to a possible three-way tie between Bad Kreuznach, Ulm and Fulda a point differential system was created to determine the A-Central championships. Ulm had beaten Bad Kreuznach, 18-15, Fulda had lost to Bad Kreuznach, 6-0. With the points differential system, points scored and allowed are taken into consideration. Ulm and Bad Kreuznach were both +3, Fulda was -6. In order to make the playoffs, Fulda had to beat Ulm by 10 points. Nine points would have left Fulda tied at +3 with Bad Kreuznach and Bad Kreuznach, due to

the head victory, would have won the championship and the right to advance to the playoffs. The Falcons took care of all the complicated figuring by blasting Ulm 20-0. They were off to the playoffs for the second straight year!!

The first round opponent was Munich High School. Munich had advanced the week before with a 45-8 thrashing of Volseck and were quite a challenge. Their wishbone attack was led by senior Quarterback Andy Reardon and all-Conference Halfback Junior Dean. The Falcons were out-weighted as usual, 30-40 pounds a man.

The game began with a fumble on the 28 yard line by Munich on their kickoff return. Fulda converted the fumble into a touchdown drive requiring five plays. Curtis Claxton took an option pitch six yards to finish up the drive. Ron LaLonde caught the extra point pass from Jay Harris to make the score 8-0.



Munich answered the challenge with a 45 yard drive of their own. The extra point failed, as Tom Ward and Jay Harris tackled Reardon for a loss. Fulda 8-6. In the second quarter Jay Harris intercepted a Reardon pass and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown. Fulda 14-6. Munich again began a drive in the third quarter to bring the game back to within reach. Fulda 14-12. Fulda then began the drive that sealed victory. A key 12 yard pass from Harris to Claxton and a 40 yard sweep run by Claxton were the big plays as Fulda scored their third touchdown. Harris again hit LaLonde for a two point pass. Fulda 24-12. Munich again began to drive the ball, but Fulda stiffened and a 4th down pass fell incomplete. Fulda ran the clock out on the Munich two yard line. Pandemonium broke-out as fans and players alike celebrated. Fulda was on its way to their second trip to the championship.

Meanwhile, in Berlin, the Berlin Bears were crushing the England champion, Woodbudge High School, 34-6. This set up a titanic struggle between two old foes.

Fulda had never beaten Berlin on their

home field. The Falcons were also facing a veteran team that featured a 220 pound average line and probably the best back in Europe, Chris Alford.

After a long trip on the duty train, the Falcons arrived to a cold, crisp sun-filled day in Berlin. The game was one not to be forgotten. Simply put, it was pure unadulterated football - physical and intense. Both teams were well prepared and played their hearts out. So even were the teams that two breaks determined the final score. Fulda bobbled a punt and gave Berlin possession on it's 8 yard line. A valiant goal line stand forced Berlin to kick a 19 yard field goal. Berlin 3-0. Late in the fourth quarter All-Europe Quarterback Jay Harris launched a 28 yard pass to David Ferry. The ball was touched first by Ferry, then a Berlin Defender and then into the hands of All-Europe Tight End Ron LaLonde for the touchdown. Harris had been roughed (Knocked out cold) and reserve quarterback Thomas Richardson came in for the extra point play. The run was no good. Fulda 6-3. Berlin launched a few desperation passes to no avail. As the last seconds ticked off the clock, the players, coaches, cheerlead-

ers and fans exploded onto the field in joy as the Berlin players dropped to their knees in shock and disappointment. It had been a glorious battle with nothing held back, football at its finest!

Fulda finished the season at 8-1 with the #1 defense and the #2 offense in Europe (The offense averaged 27.5 points a game, the defense gave up an average of 4.7 points a game). Most importantly, the Falcons have another year to enjoy the title of the best Class "A" Football school in Europe. Quite a feat for a School with only 230 students.

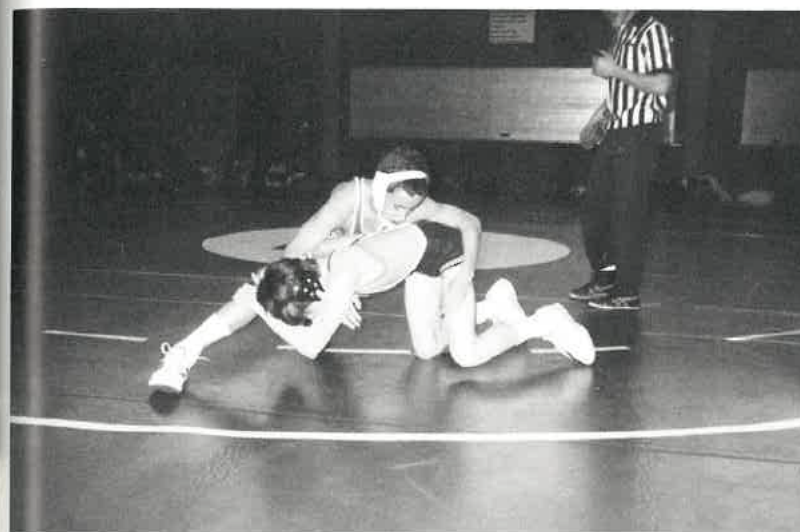

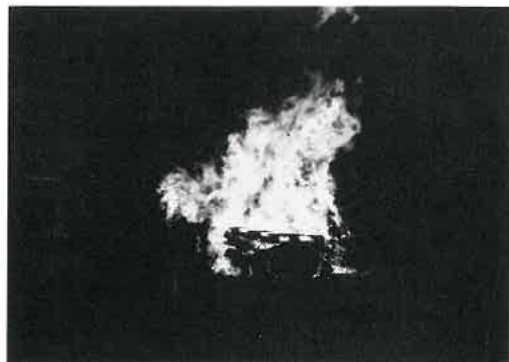

700,000 Flood into West Germany

Fulda High School Students
Witness History being made.

More than 700,000 East Germans streamed into the west for a visit, and souvenir hunters from the west stacked up pieces chipped off the Berlin Wall.

Germans from both sides of the crumbling Iron Curtain embraced each other, laughed, sang and cried. Many East Germans rushed to West German stores to buy fruit, electronic products and other items they had so long desired.

West Berlin has been the heartbeat of the celebration. Hordes of East and West Germans were joined by visitors from around the world who rushed to take part in history in the making. Some pushed baby carriages and others rode bicycles, weaving their way among throngs of strollers in front of the wall that divides West Berlin from the Brandenburg Gate.

Austrian border officials said the steady flows of East German refugees heading to West Germany through Austria had slowed to a trickle. Only 150 East German asylum seekers crossed the border during a 24 hour period that ended that fateful Saturday Morning when the wall came down, this was a sharp drop from 1,000 a day average of the weeks prior.
