Tom Paice has become one of California's great men; he has become chief dog catcher. He got this title after he caught the notorious Black-nose the Hound.

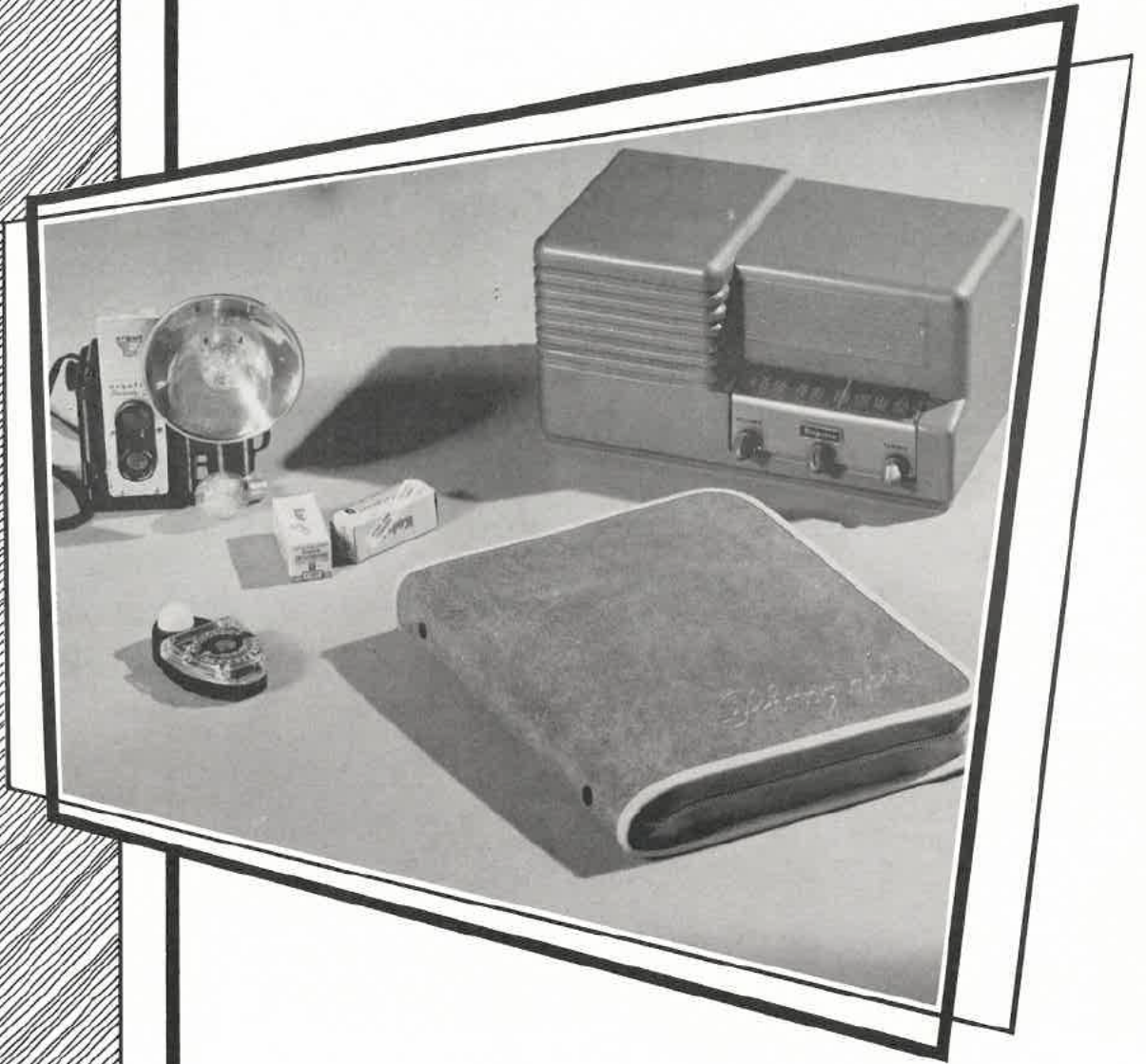
