Hurricanes Wreak Havoc on Southern States

On August 29, 2005, Hurricane Katrina, a category 4 storm pounded the Gulf Coast. Parts of Mississippi were hit particularly hard. The following day New Orleans, which had been spared the full force of the storm, suffered calamitous damage as levees holding back flood waters broke submerging around 80% of the city.

A mere month later, on September 23, a category 3 storm (Rita) causes waves to flood parts of New Orleans and breach yet another levee. Total damage done to New Orleans is estimated at over \$7 million.

Pope John Paul II Dies

Pope John Paul, 84, died after a long struggle with Parkinson's disease on April 2, 2005. On April 8, he was laid to rest in St. Peter's Basilica after 26 years of leading the world's Catholics. Leaders from more than 70 nations gathered for the largest funeral for a Pope in history. John Paul II was the first Polish Pope and the first non-Italian Pope since the 1500's.




Space Shuttle Discovery

On July 26, 2005, Space Shuttle Discovery lifted off. The mission of the shuttle was to deliver supplies and test new safety procedures at the International Space Station. Despite difficulties at take off, and two missed passes at a landing, the Discovery and its crew landed safely on August 9, 2005.

On July 17, thousands of Disney fans came together to celebrate Disneyland's 50th birthday in Anaheim, California. Since the 1955 opening of Disneyland in California, ten other Disney parks have opened worldwide, one of the most popular being Disneyworld (FL) in 1971.



2005 Was A Long Year...

Actually, slightly longer than usual. An extra second was added to the end of 2005 to make up for the slowing down of the Earth's rotation. "Leap seconds" used to be very common. This is the first in seven years and shows the unpredictable nature of the planet's behavior. The International Earth Rotation & Reference Systems Service keeps track of time by measuring the Earth's rotation, which varies, along with an atomic clock, which is unwavering. When a difference between the two appears, IERS adds or subtracts a second to keep the two timing systems in sync.



Around The World...

Steve Fossett completed a 23,000 mile flight on March 3, 2005. He's the first person to make the solo non-stop journey around the world.



Doin' Time

Domestic diva, Martha Stewart, was released from a women's prison facility in Alderson, West Virginia after a 5 month stay. Stewart was convicted on four counts of obstructing justice and lying to investigators about a well-timed stock sale.

Bombs Explode In London

Four coordinated terrorist attacks on London's subway transit system during rush hour kill over 50 people including the attackers, and wound more than 700. The attack coincided with a summit meeting of some of the world's most powerful nations. British Muslims were said to have been responsible.



Largest Passenger Plane Launched

A prototype of the Airbus A380 had what was considered a very successful test flight in Toulouse, France in January, 2005. The plane is a whopping seven stories high and can seat 555 passengers.



The third installment to George Lucas's prequel trilogy made its big screen debut in 2005. Star Wars Episode III: Revenge of the Sith is one of the top ten highest grossing films of all time along with Star Wars Episode I: The Phantom Menace.




A Melty Mess


- The Chicago White Sox swept the Houston Astros claiming the World Series Championship in game four.


One More Time

A Discovery Down Under

It's estimated that there are only around 1,000 Snubfins in the world making them susceptible to many threats.

Comet Crash

After a 6 month, 83 million mile journey, NASA's Deep Impact probe hit a comet with a brilliant flash of light. The probe was designed to provide information to scientists about the inside of the comet. Using special cameras, the probe took pictures of the nucleus and sent them back to scientists on Earth to study.



7th Grade Math Museum Field Trip in Geissen


Art Club gives students the opportunity to work on their own Artworks. They can get materials, get technical help, or just have a supervised area in which to create their art.







After school band allows students to obtain music lessons for the talented Mrs. Warner-Kingsberry. Guitar, violin, and various other instrument lessons were made available.




Future Business Leaders of America

Home Economics Club


Home Economics club allows students to learn various cooking and handicrafts with Mrs. Reade-Pellicano.






Sankofa Dance Ensemble

Students meet to learn the basics in American Sign Language and to get an introduction to Deaf culture.




The students have the opportunity to work with technology software and hardware teaching it to others at school and the community. Word, Publisher and PowerPoint are some of the programs members.









Are things becoming a blur? You're seeing RED? Don't adjust anything, it's just our Red Ribbon Week celebration we had in October to stay drug free.



Wrestling offers character building, sportmanship, travel and an opportunity to learn whole body athletic skills.




