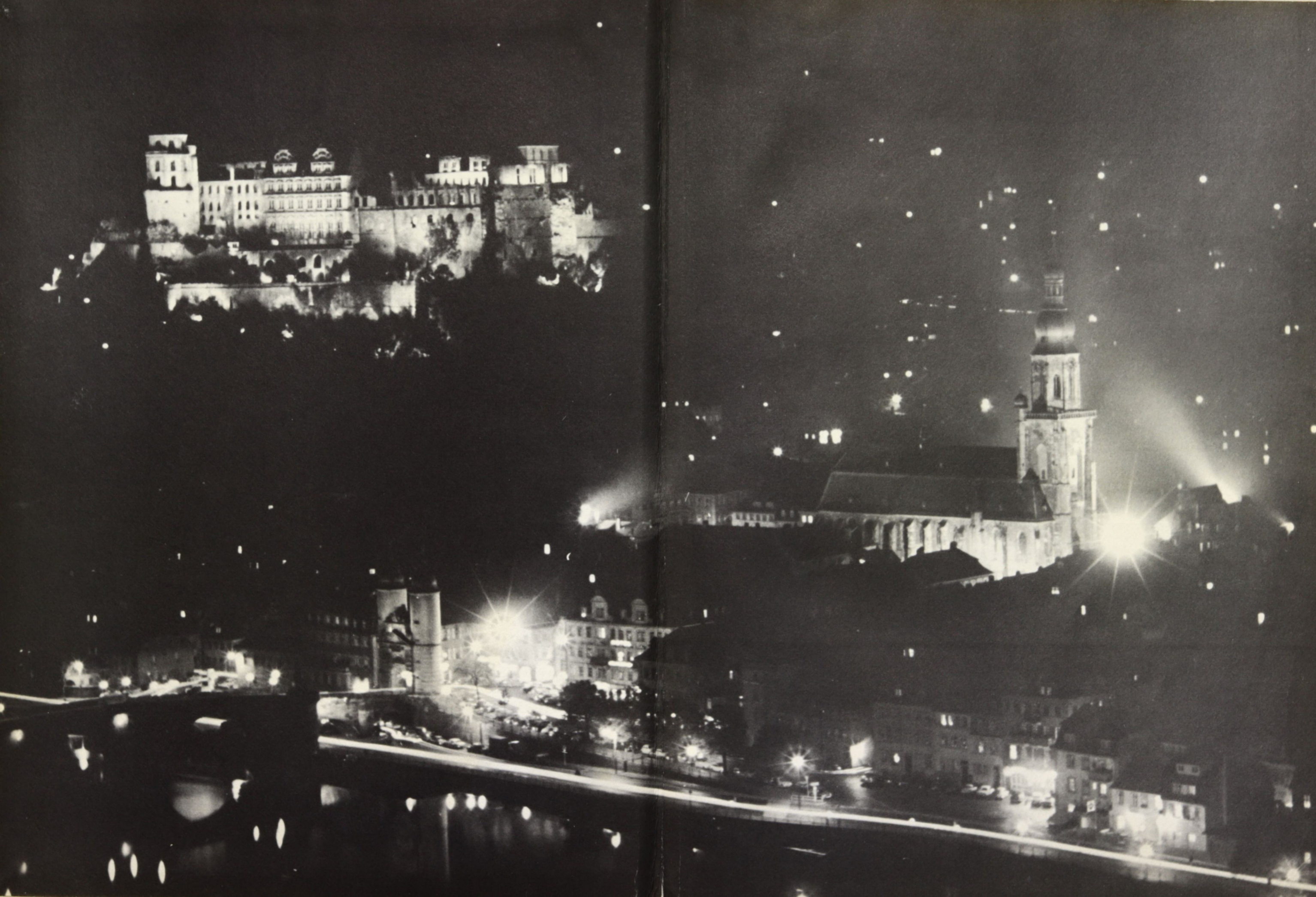

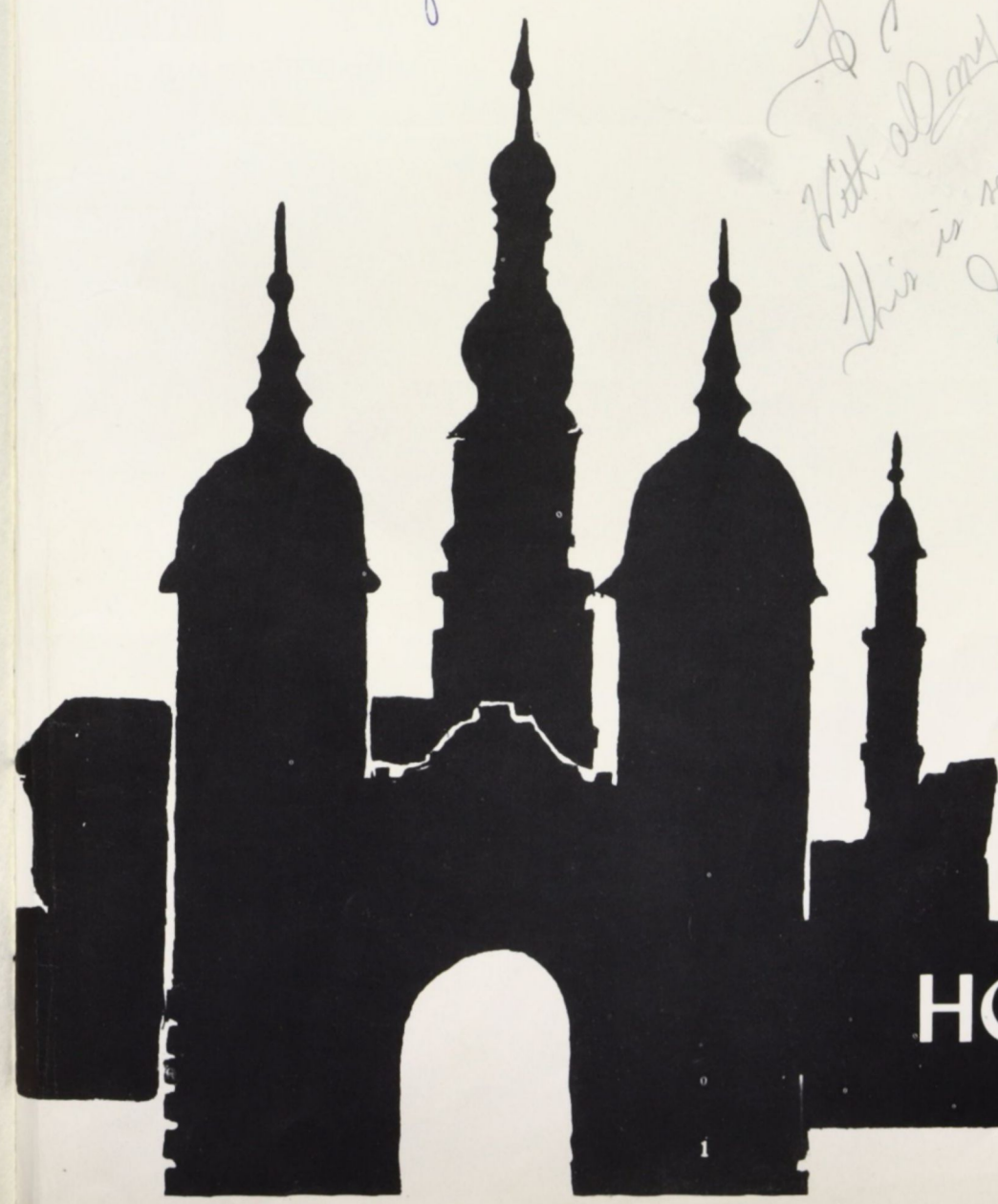

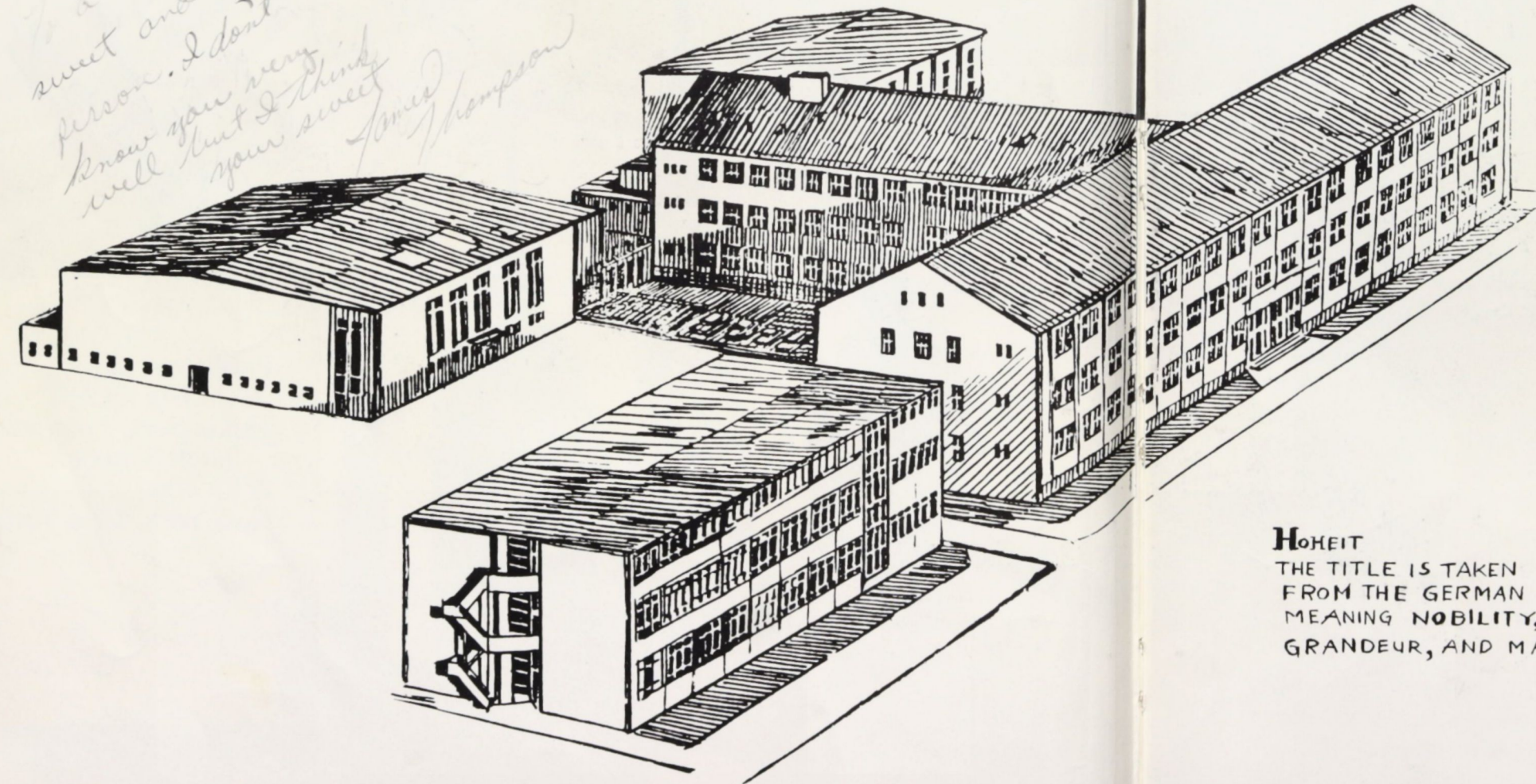
Hail, All Hail

The Lions were quick to capitalize on their opponent's mistakes.



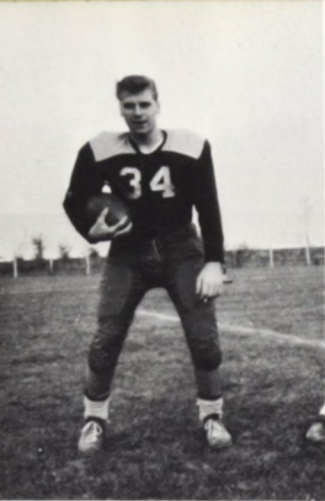

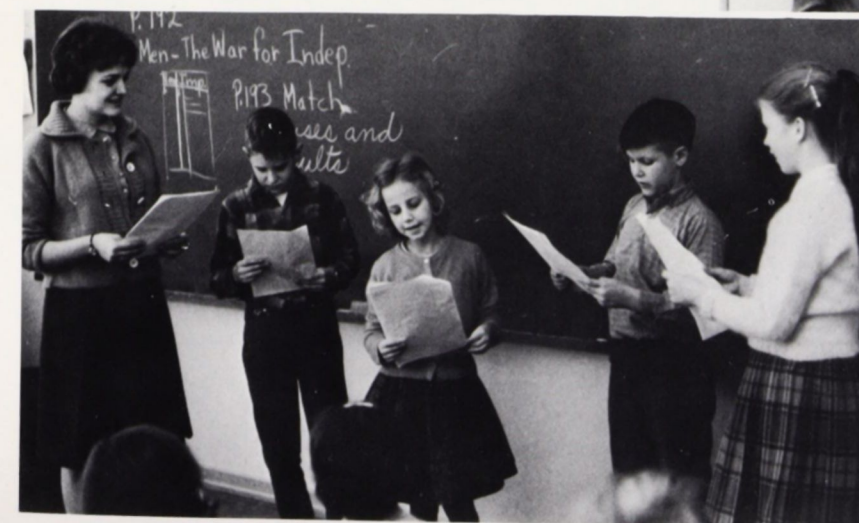
