























THE CIRCLE GAME


OUR STUDENT GOVERNMENT - SCA






SCIENCE DEPARTMENT - DISCOVERY, HAPPENINGS AND FUN

& Processes and Technical Drawing.



The philosophy of Darmstadt is "to take students from where they are and to allow them to grow at their own rate."


