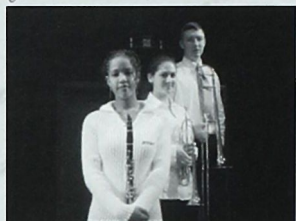
## Jazz Band

## Honors Band

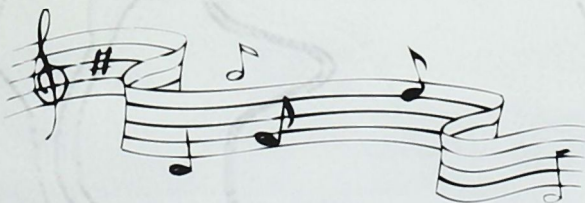
For the past three years, Hohenfels has been participating in this Honors Band Festival and we've had 3 consecutive years of luck. This year we've had the privilege of sending Pamela

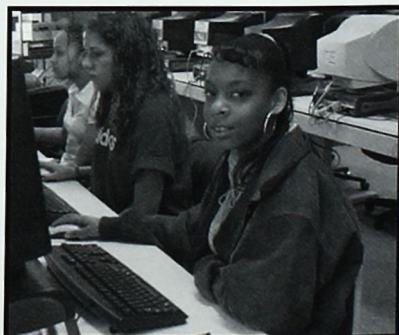

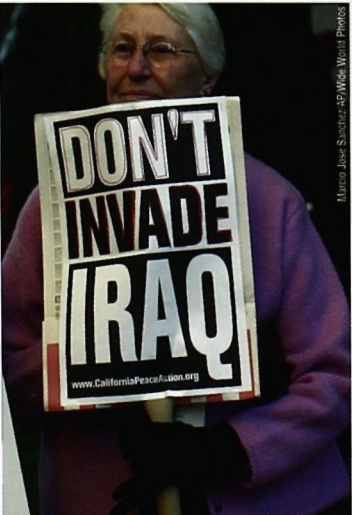

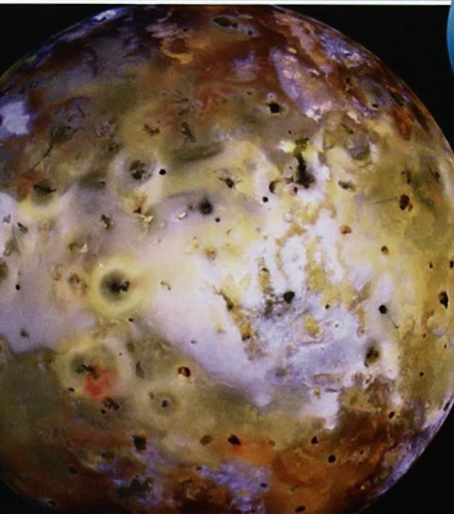

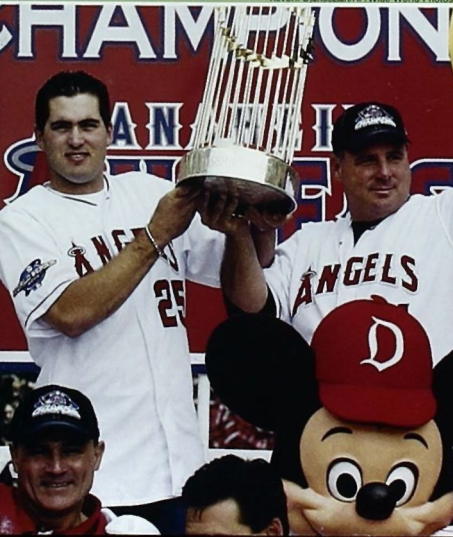

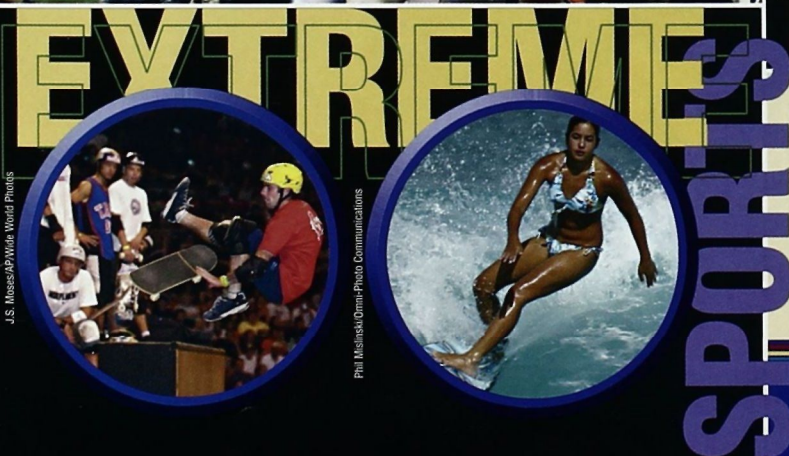

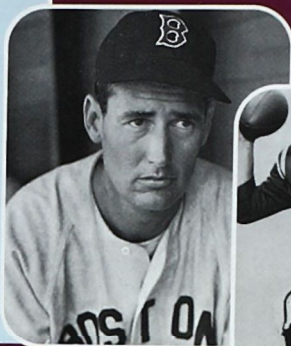
