The number of students continues to rise and the number of classes offered has also increased. Hohenfels now has a robotics lab. an art studio, three complete science labs as well as a music room and the Great Hall.

The Great Hall is the scene of many different activities. From music concerts and drama productions to dinner theaters and drill practice, this room is definitely used by the students.

Extra-curricular activities offer the students many different opportunities. Odyssey of the Mind teams have placed first for the past few years. The FBLA students recently went to State Leadership Conference in Garmisch and for the past six years. Hohenfels has taken a team of students to Model United States Senate. Each year art and literature by students at Hohenfels M/HS have been in the SHOWCASE, the DoDDS Europe anthology.

















They went all the way to Europeans and came home with three individual winners. Not bad for a small school.



















Students who have attended MUSS say they have gained a better insight to how the government operates.



An extensive kayak trip is also an activity that is jointly sponsored. In this event participants must kayak through the Regen River in the Bayerischerwald.



Odyssey of the Mind (OM) is a creative problem solving

organization for students to expand their knowledge using innovative solutions. Students are given a choice of five long-term problems to solve at the beginning of the school year where they then choose their problem and form a team of 5-7 people. They spend all year constructing their problems to present at competition. They also must solve a spontaneous problem given the day of competition, which can range from role-playing, creative engineering or verbal conundrums.

This year, 21 Hohenfels Middle/High School students competed in three teams doing three different problems: The Jungle Bloke, Geometry Structure, and Ancient Egypt. Competition was held March 3 -5, 2006 at the Edelweiss Lodge and Resort in Garmisch, Germany.

The event consisted of 275 students comprising 43 teams from 21 schools representing 6 countries. 


