And ran on.

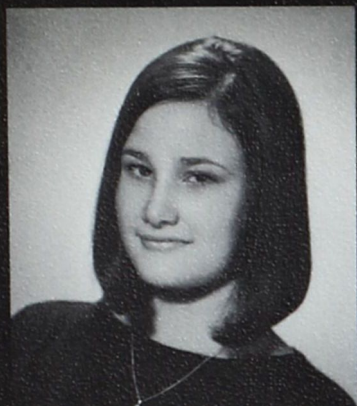


The Wayfarer

"Oh, best little blade of grass!" he said.

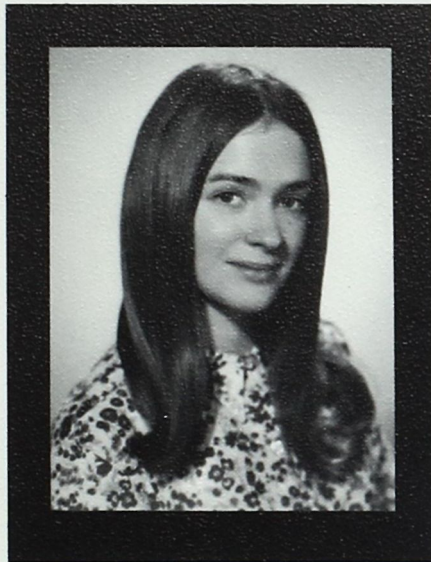

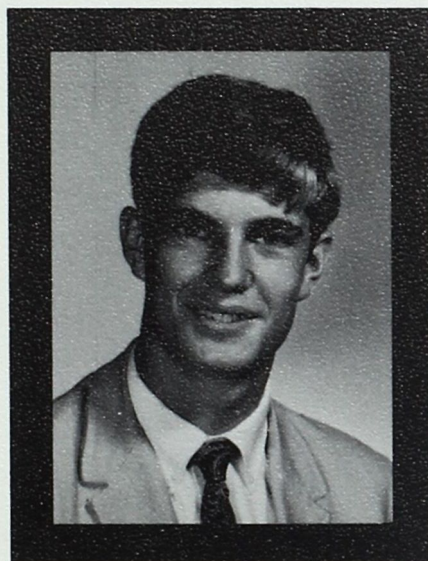
Two Poems by Theodore Roethke

I learn by going where I have to go.

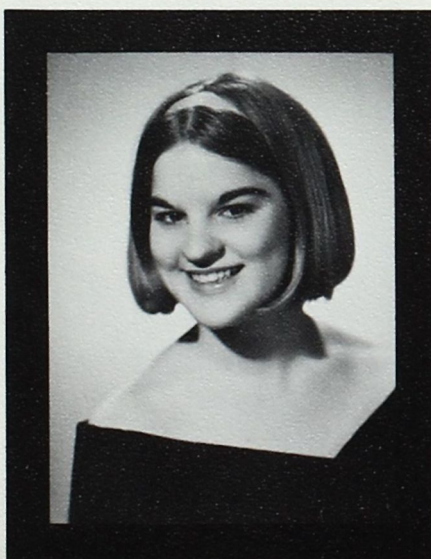
