




# Sultans keep on truckin' in the face of great odds!

The Saturday sports early birds, the Sultan JV Football Team saw the same action and the same number of games as the varsity team, yet remained out of the main spotlight on Saturdays.


The JVs played just as long and got just as tired as the "Big Team", but did not enjoy the same crowds and






The Sultan Varsity Basketball Team started the season with four returning members and five new men. All the team started the season and carried through with great potential and spirit.




