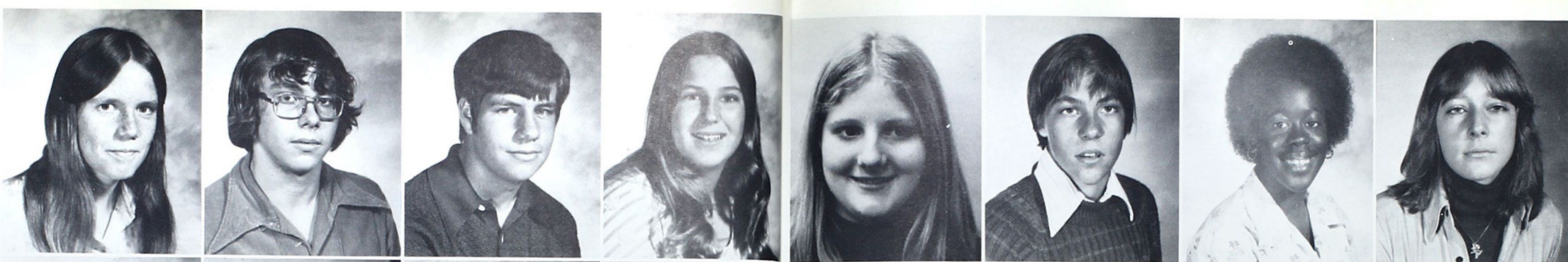


sophomore class

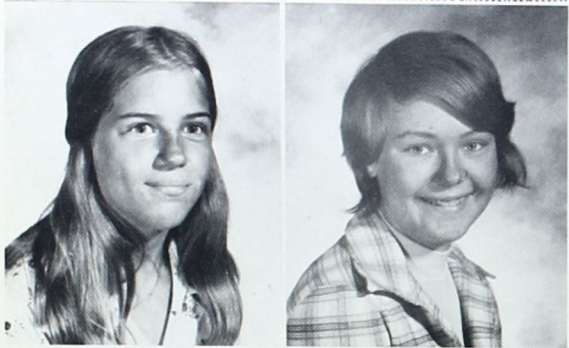
freshman class

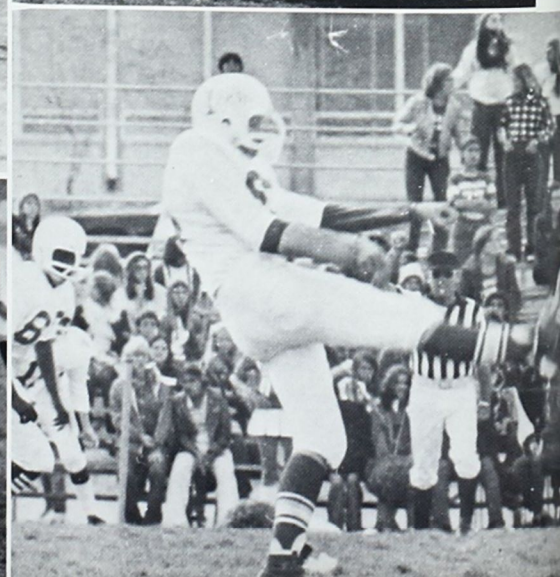
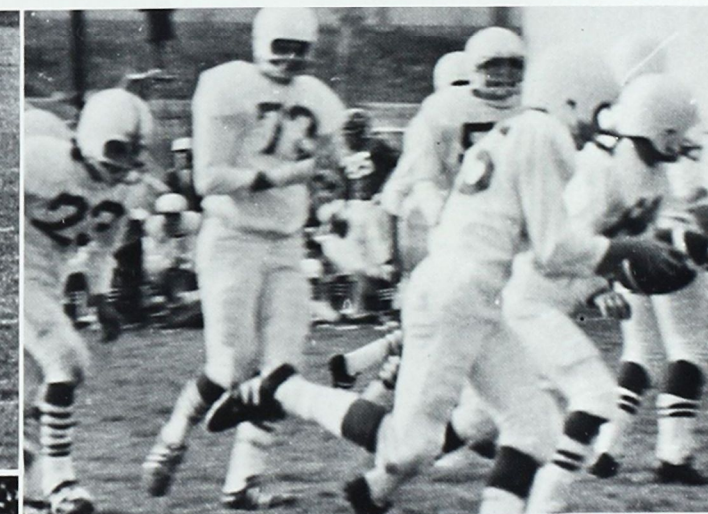
The hard-hitting Sultan Grid Men had a fantastic 1975 season with a record of 4 wins and 2 losses, both losses coming from the hands of the Karamursel Cougars. Both losses were the result of hard fought battles of 13-12 and 32-8. Victorious in the remaining four games, the Sultans dealt defeats of 30-0 and 50-0 to Ankara, and 14-12 and 16-12 to Adana.
