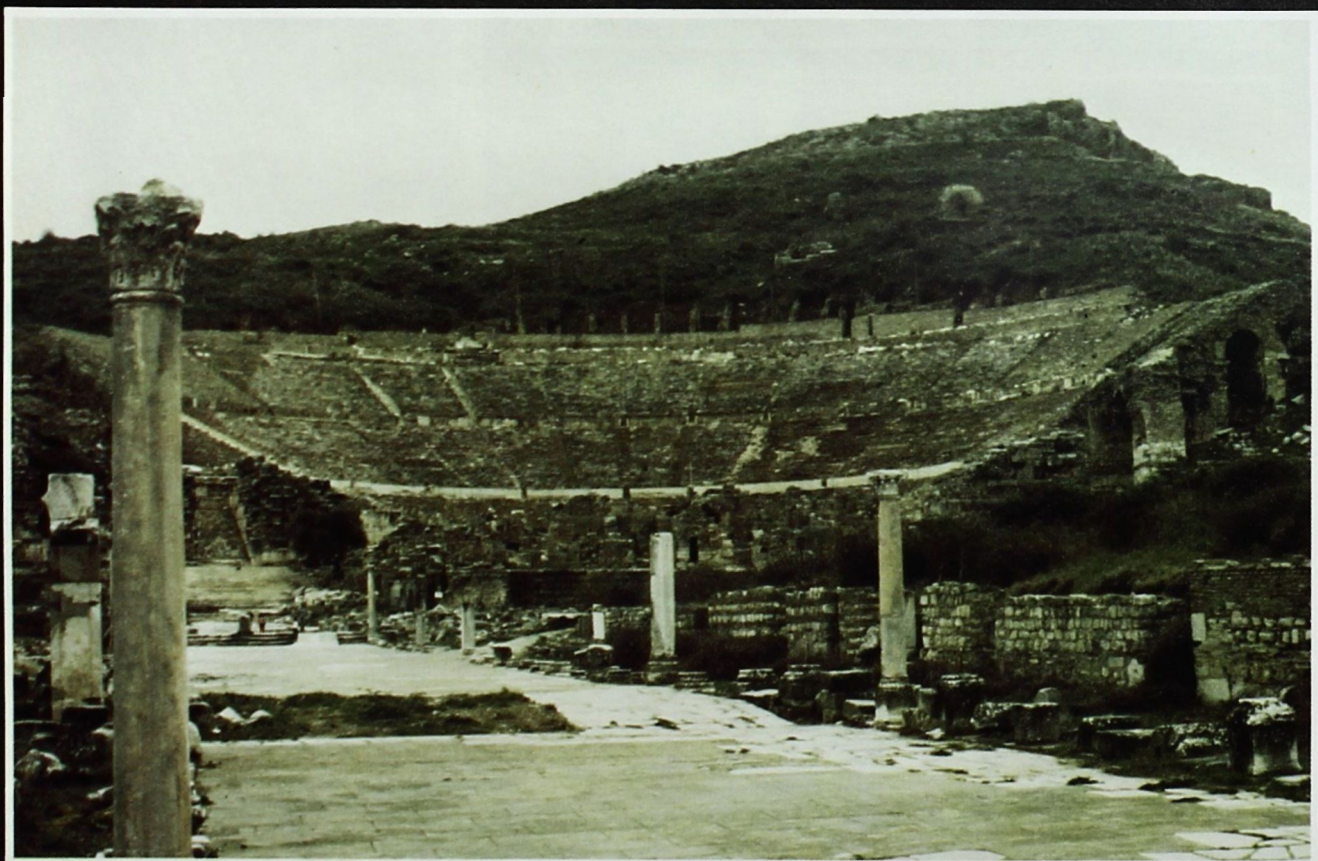


The parades and events on Attaturk Circle, the wandering shoeshine men, the variety of boats in the harbor, and the people and foods all give an insight into the city.



THE ANCIENT CITY OF EPHESUS

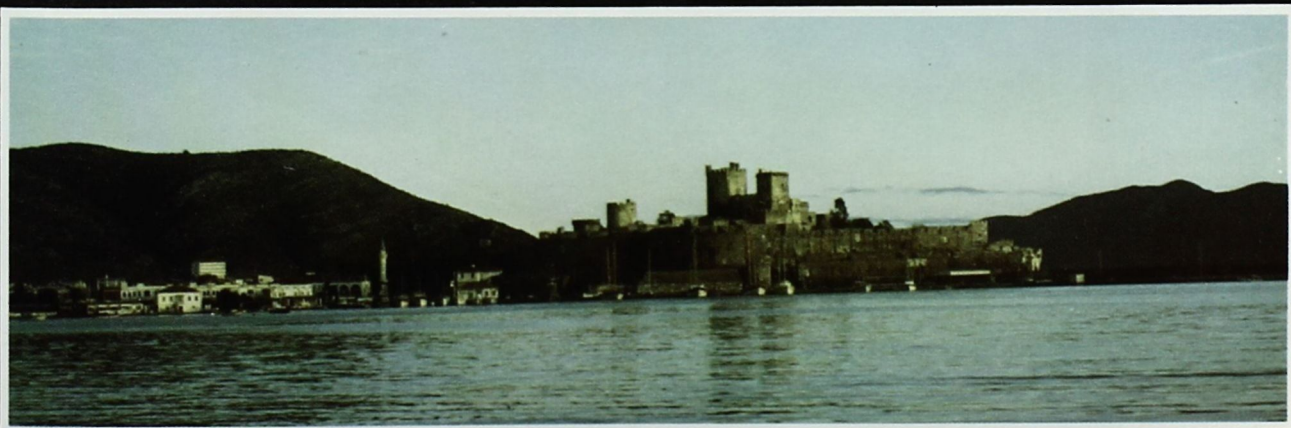

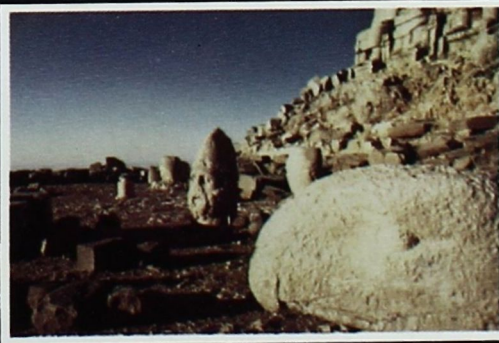
The quiet surroundings of Sardis or a mountainside city projects a peaceful feeling of relaxation.

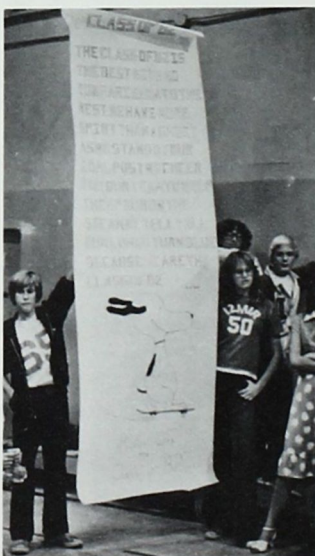
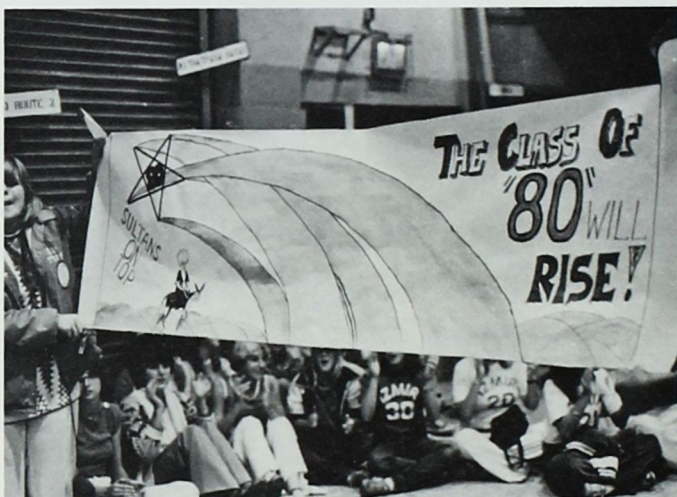


PEP RALLY

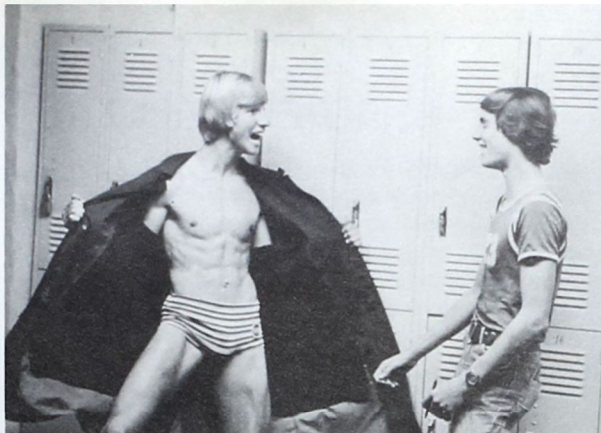
