# National Honor Society INDUCTION HELD IN MAY

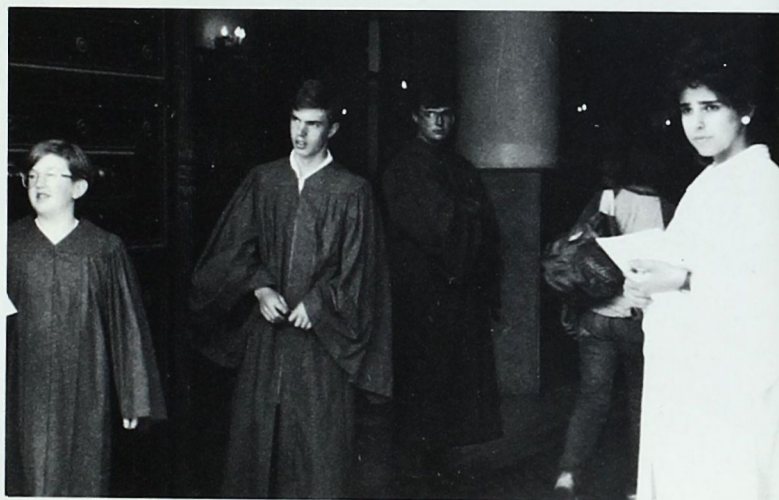

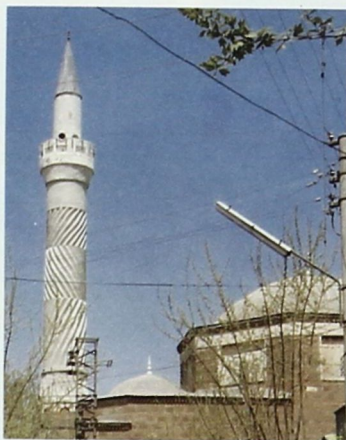
## Izmir, a City of Contrast

The Izmir American High School edition of the class of 89, is unique, not only in each individual's personality, but also because there are only three females in the entire twenty-one student class.

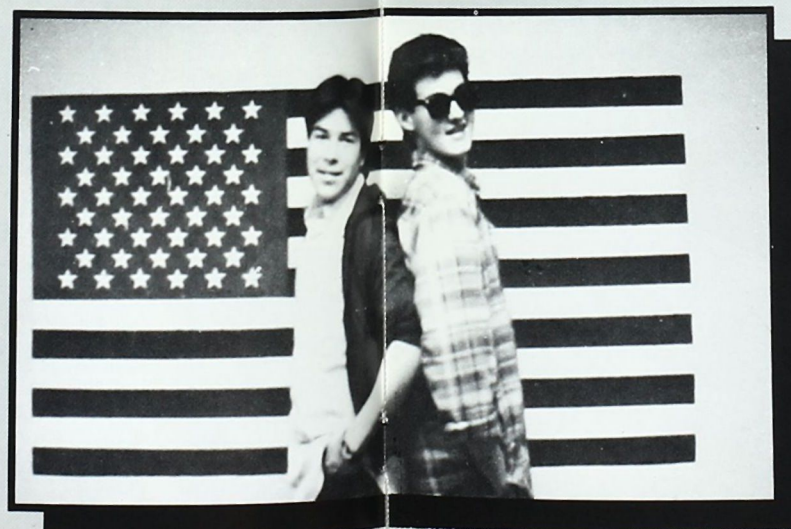
Therefore, the sophomore superlatives were chosen in a different way. Only one person was chosen to represent each category: instead of one from each sex.

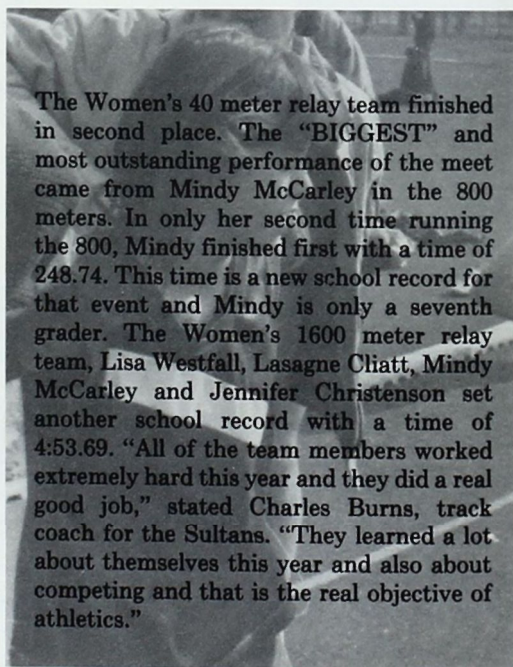

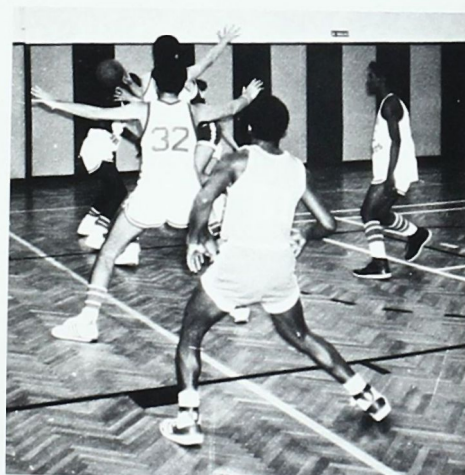

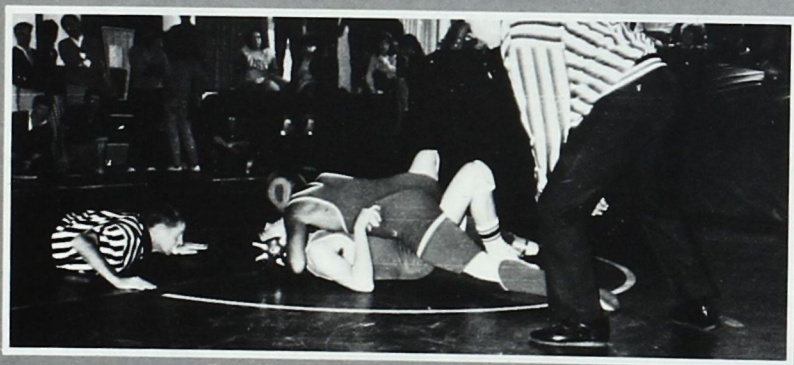

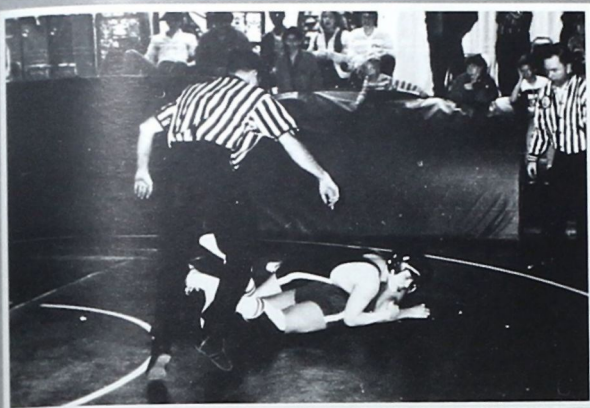

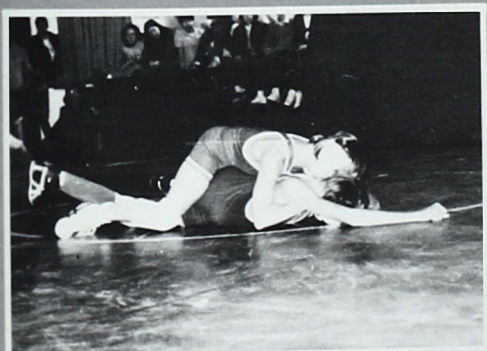

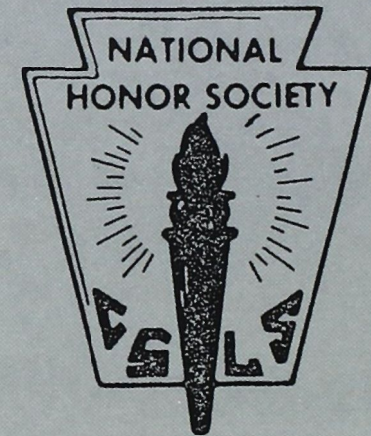
# Izmir Scholars Compete in Brain Bowl
