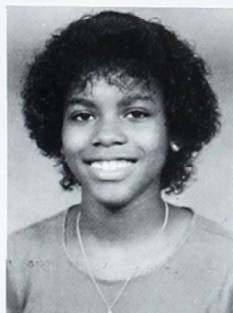
The Sophomore Class Of '97

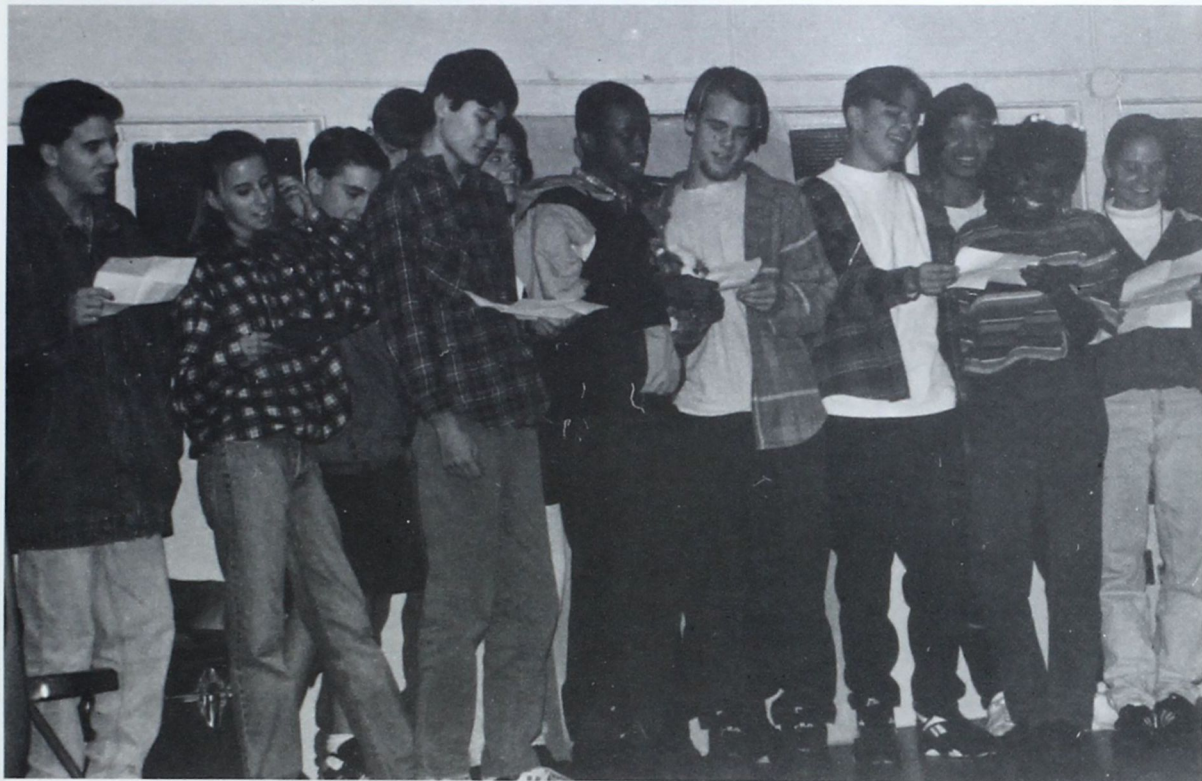

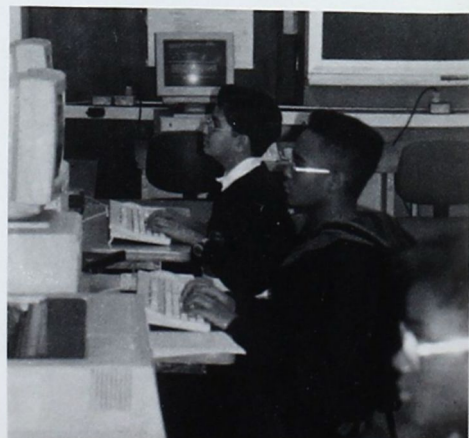

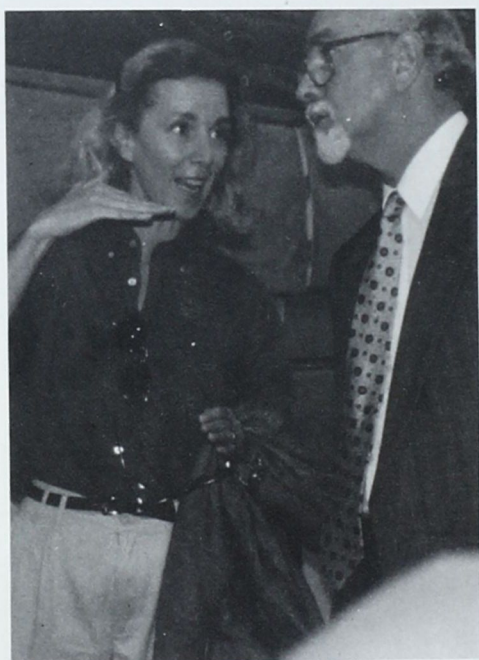

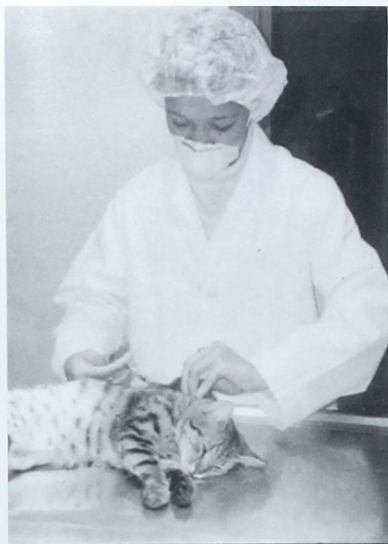

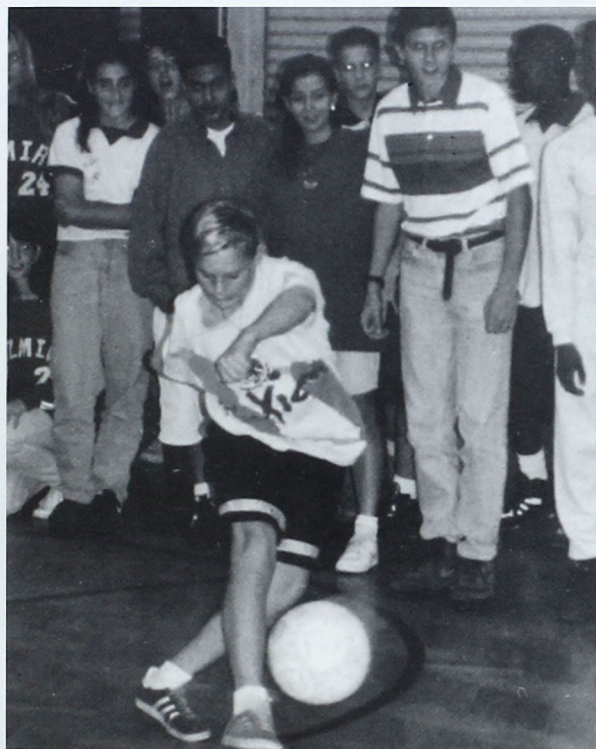

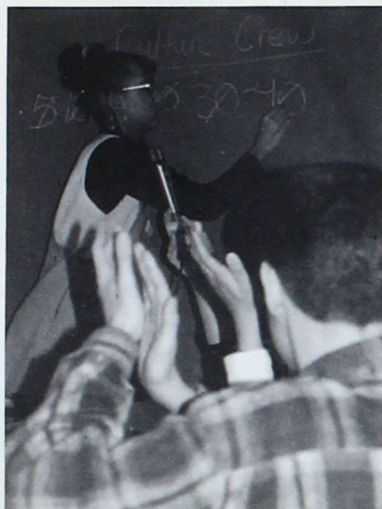

RECOGNIZING OUR BLACK HERITAGE

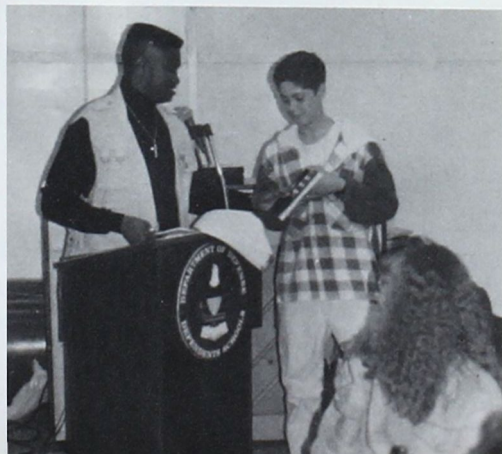

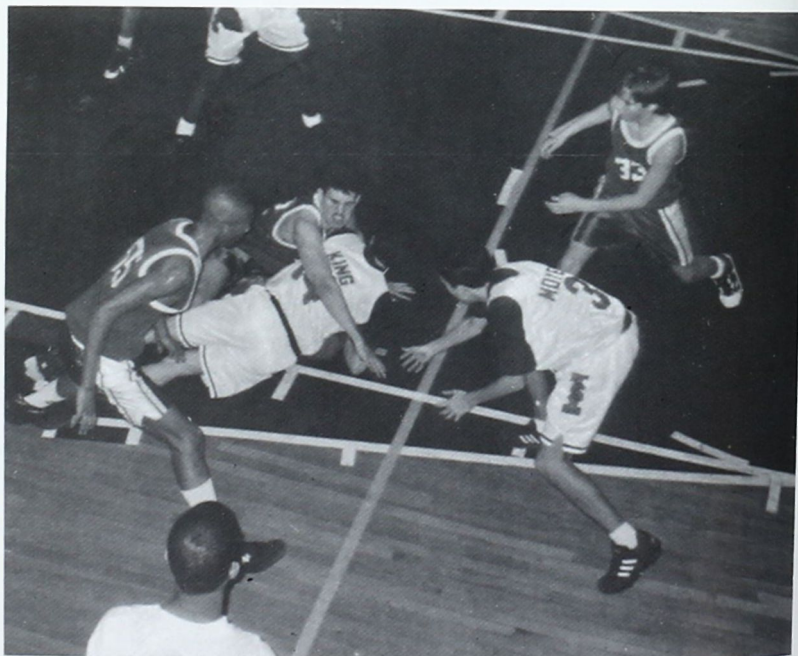

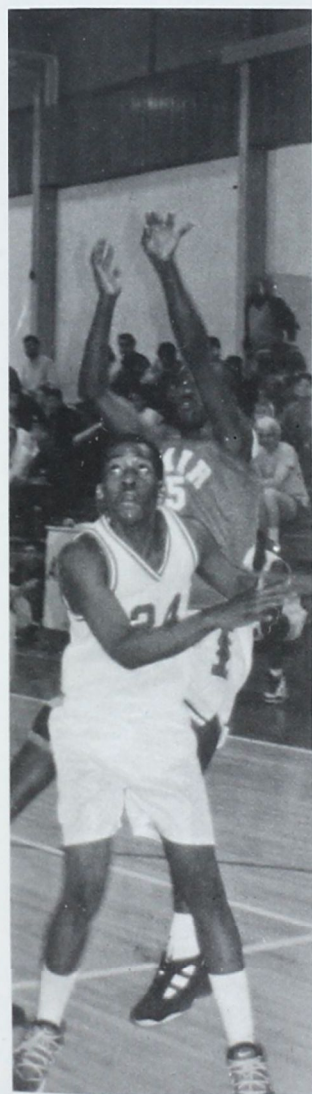

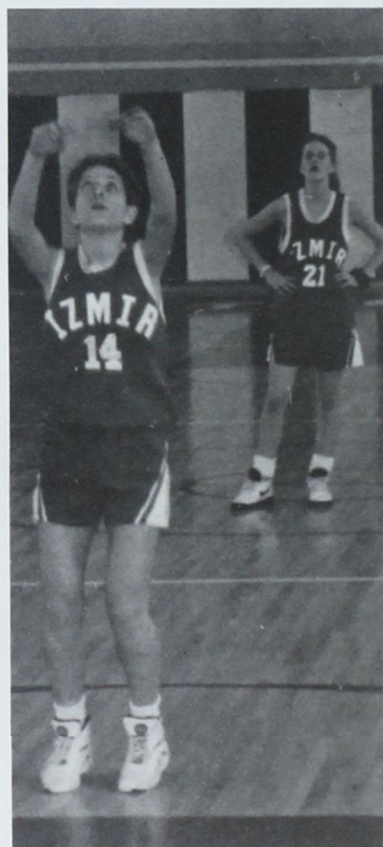

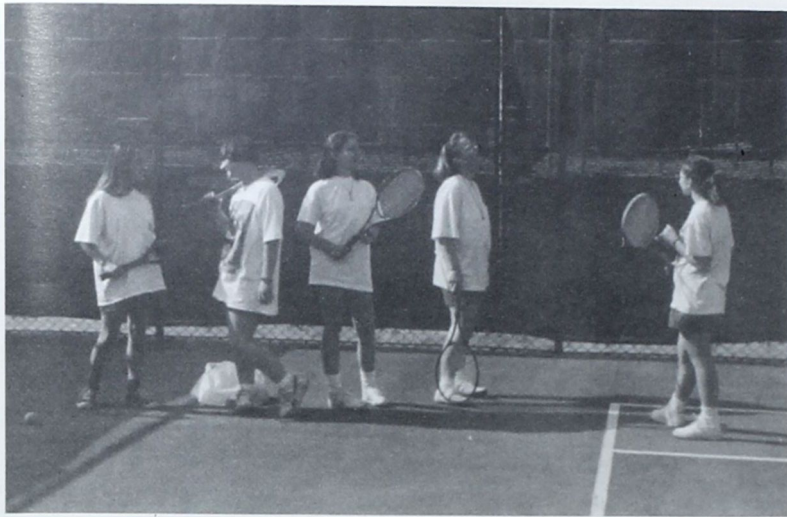

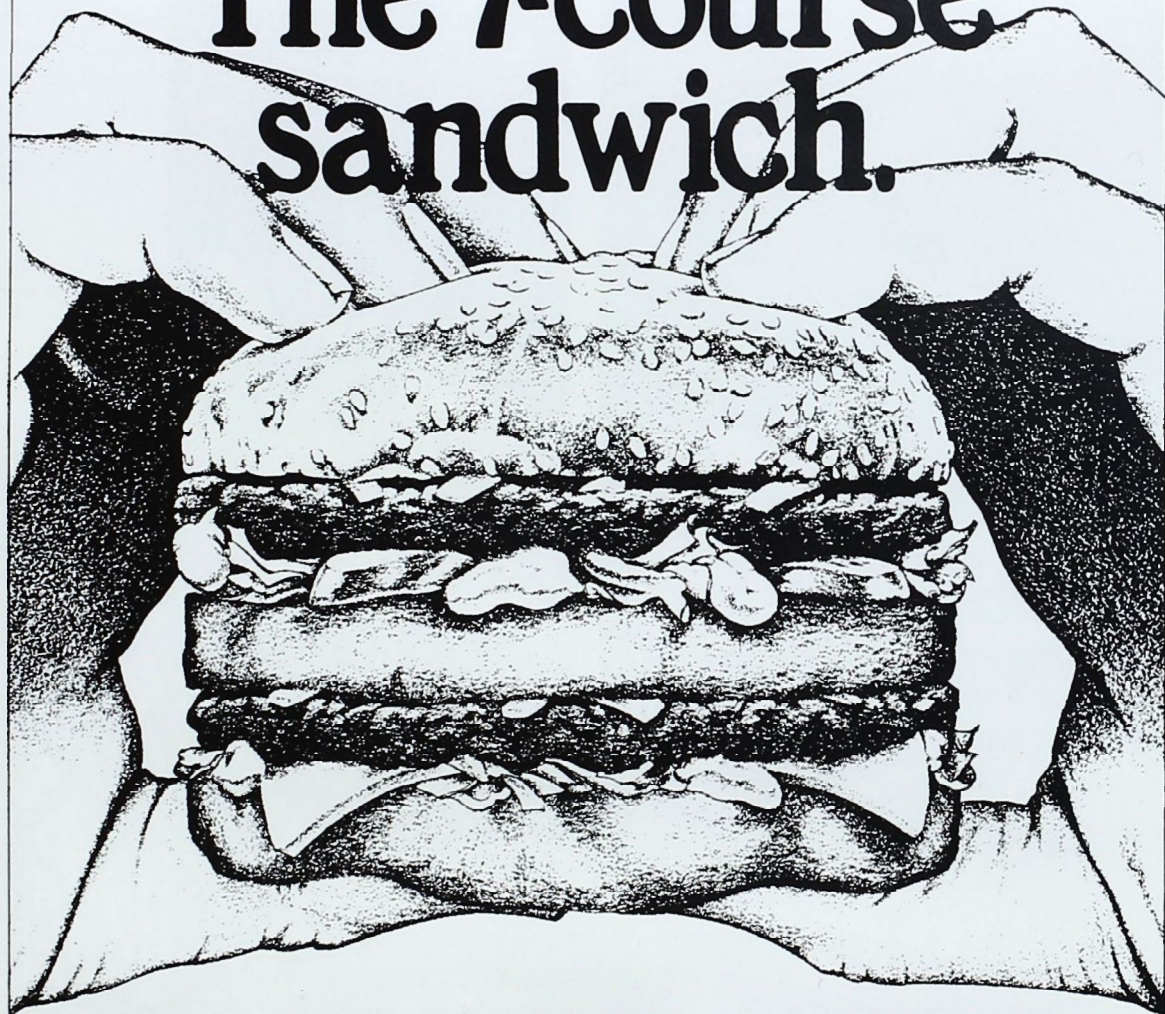
