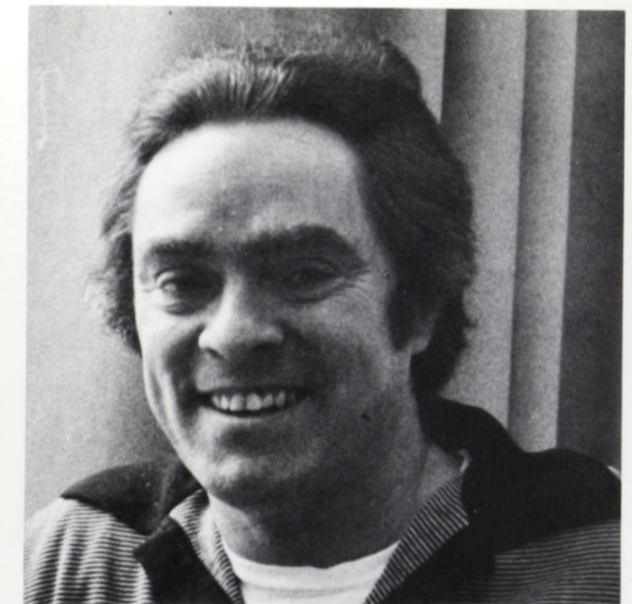

We dedicate our 1977-1978 Invader to Mr. Seeley in hopes that he will continue his involvement with the students of Kaiserslautern Junior High.

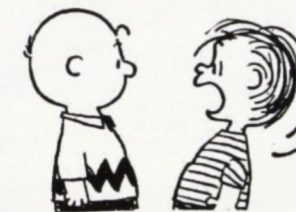

Soccer is one of the most popular sports in the world. It is the national sport of several European and South American countries, and of many countries in Asia.

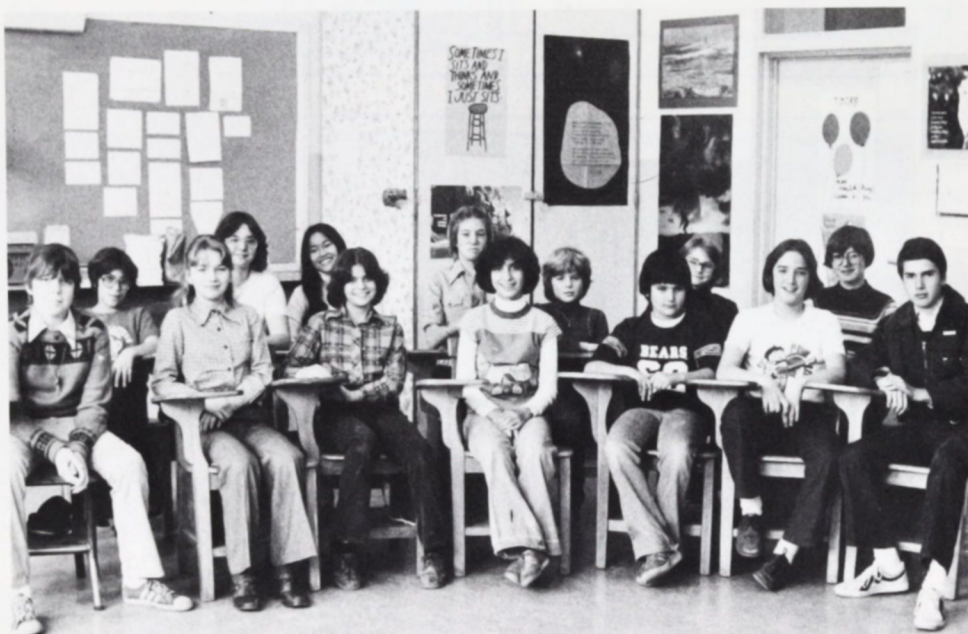

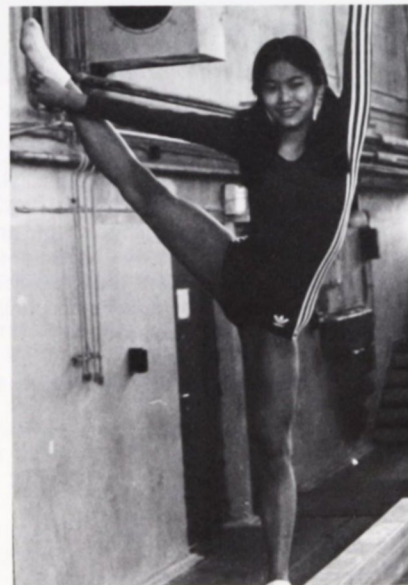
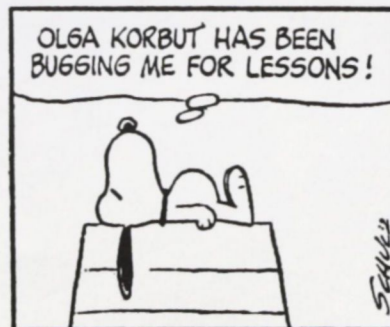
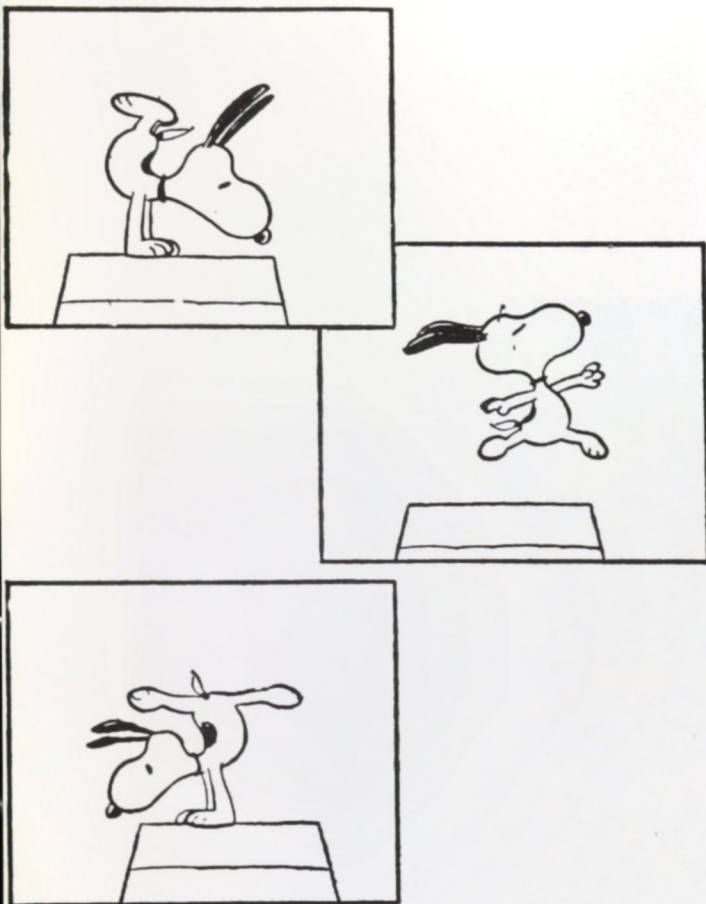
Honor Society

Seeing Europe



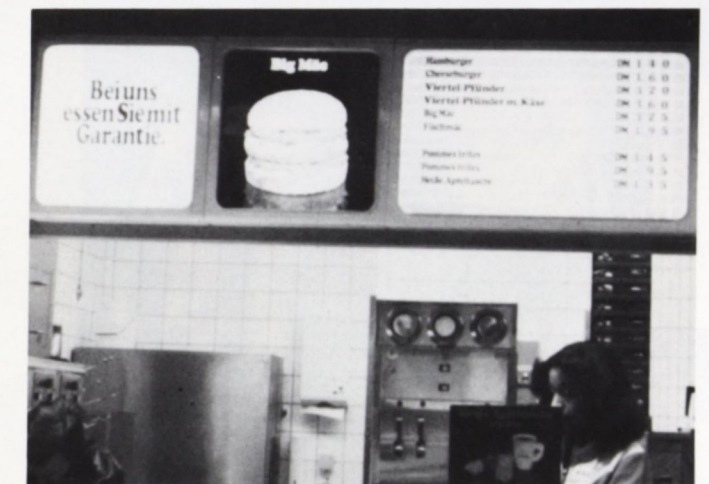

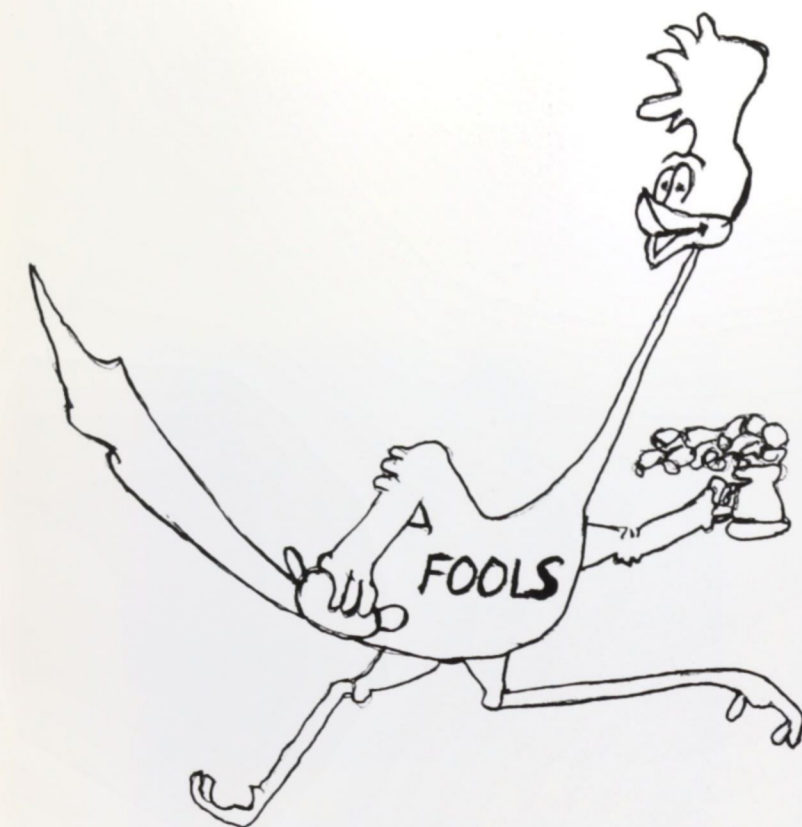
With two sections of Minorities Club, KAJHS has seen much activity. School dances, bake sales, field trips, and painting parties for P-5 have occupied our time.

We have extended our class content to the limit. When we studied Chinese-Americans, we also dined in "Hong Kong". When "Roots" made the scene, so did we.

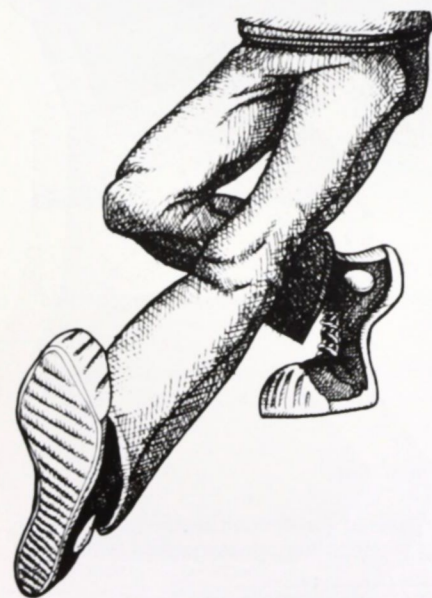
