Coming off a 1995-6 season which saw only one win, this season's varsity men's basketball team had its best season in 16 years with a 13 8 record finishing fourth overall in the European Championships The Raiders were led by All-European Tournament point guard Tom Hollins who led the team in steals and scoring. Co-captain Darian Walker was the leading rebounder in Europe, once pulling down 20 boards in a playoff game. Ryan Chandler and Andrew Pfannes teamed with Walker to control the guards throughout the season. Mike Ethridge, who was the team's best pure shooter, was one of the most outstanding sophomores this year, hitting four-three pointers in one quarter twice this season. Domination was evident in every aspect of the Lady Raiders' 1996-7 season. The European Champions undefeated at 20-0 cruised through the regular season enroute to K-town's first women's basketball title in 22 years, crushing opponents by an average of 25 points.
Led by Captain Danielle Evans, the Raiders rolled over the European competition throughout their championship season, which culminated in a convincing 49-35 victory over cross town rival Ramstein. The last time KAHS was tops in Europe at girls basketball was in 1975 when they defeated Stuttgart.

The Lady Raiders stifling defense, which has been called the Red Sea' after the team's vermillion uniform was the key to the $20-0$ record. While surrendering a moderate 36 points to Ramstein, throughout the regular season and tournaments, the women in red thrived on clogging lanes, forcing long shots and starting the fast break off opponents' misses. Evans was often the recipient of long passes from her partner in the backcourt, Amy Smith. Helping pull down those rebounds were the Ambulo sisters, Katherine and Noriko.

Evans not only earned a spot on the girls' all tournament team, but she was named MVP as well. Joining her on the all tournament teams was Amy Smith.

Character coincided with talent to combine for a well oiled, powerful roundball machine. Coach Soberanes spoke of his players fondly, saying, 'This is a great bunch of girls. I can't say enough about them.' With only one senior on the team, and the junior varsity girls also going undefeated, KAHS' women's basketball program is certain to flex its muscle for years to come.
