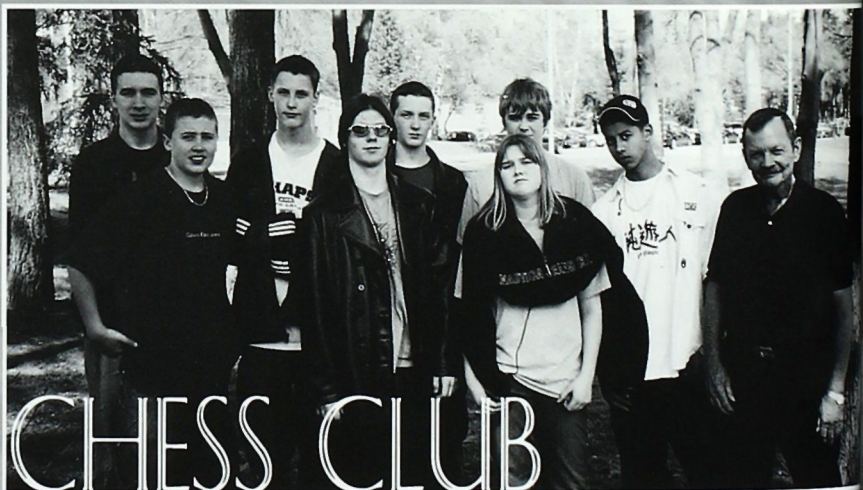

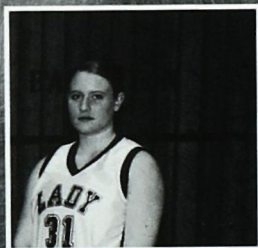

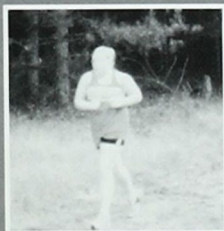

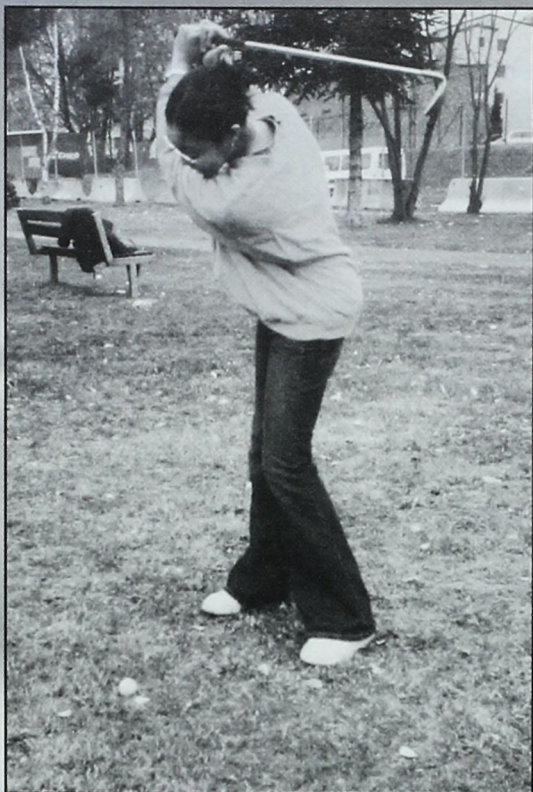

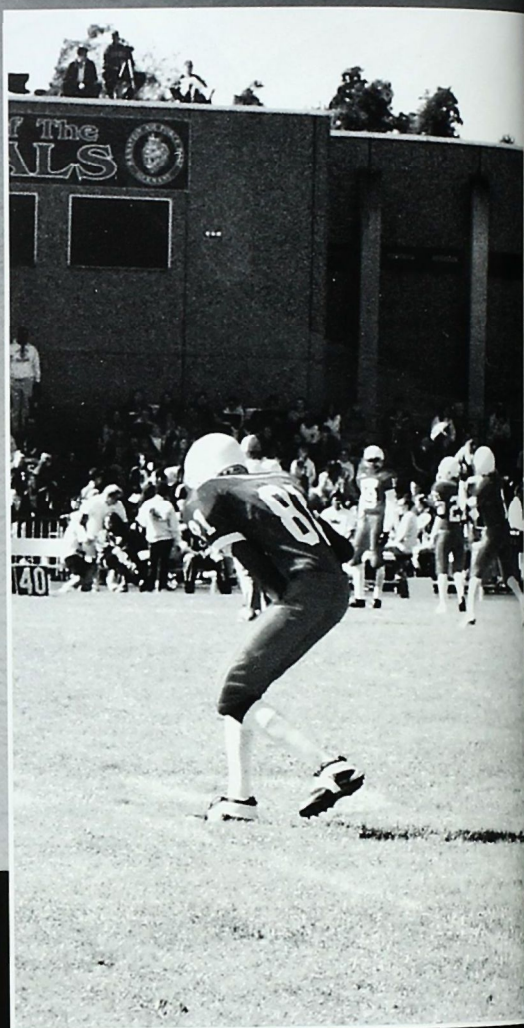

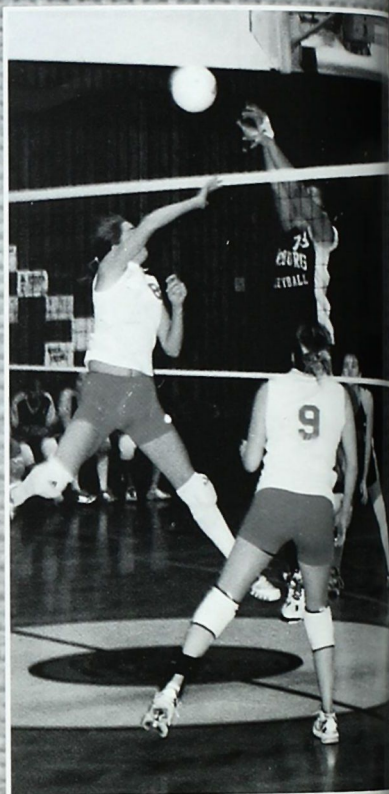

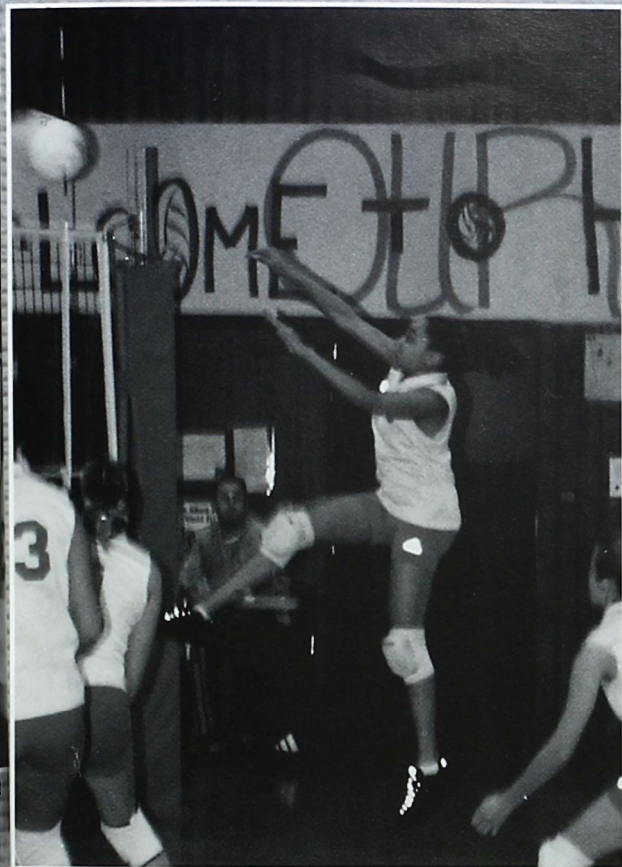

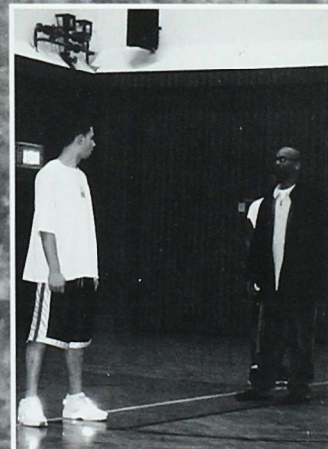

Joseph Peter Iaconis was born in the North Beach area of San Francisco, then an entirely Italian neighborhood. His parents were both born in Italy; however, his father was born in Calabria in Southern Italy whereas his mother was born in Piemonte in Northern Italy. At the time the co-mingling of these two geographic areas was taboo.

Mr. Iaconis attended a Catholic school for preschool and high school, and he also entered the Jesuit University. He majored in Social Studies and English, earned his BA degree, and earned his California teaching credential.

In 1962 Mr. Iaconis began teaching at Luther Burbank Middle School in San Francisco. From the very beginning, he was a very enthusiastic and dedicated teacher. That passion and commitment never diminished over the forty years of his career as an educator.

While he was teaching in San Francisco, Mr. Iaconis met his future wife Ute who had come from Germany on a scholarship to San Francisco State University. They married in 1965.

What followed were very exciting years in San Francisco: underground art in North Beach, a Civil Rights and Free Speech Movement that was centered in Berkeley, and then later the arrival of the "flower children" in the Haight-Ashbury District. Mr. and Mrs. Iaconis spent evenings and weekends at free folk and rock concerts in Golden Gate Park to see Joan Baez, Bob Dylan, Jefferson Airplane, Credence Clearwater Revival, and the Grateful Dead.

In 1968 Mr. Iaconis followed his wife to Germany after her scholarship had come to an end, and there he began employment with the Department of Defense Dependent School system, first in Bad Breunach and then, starting in 1969, at the Kaiserslautern American High School.

His first son Tobias was born in 1971, and his second son Dorian was born a year later. Mr. Iaconis was known to be a prolific reader of both fiction and non-fiction. One of Tobias' first sentences was "Joe-Daddy read when he wanted to indicate that "Joe-Daddy" should not be interrupted because he was occupied with a book.

Mr. Iaconis was also a gifted story-teller. He invented an open-ended bedtime story about a man with a golden arm, with a new installment presented every evening for over a year. The story was never finished, and for years, both Tobias and Dorian pestered their dad to tell them the secret of how the man had gotten his golden arm.

Mr. Iaconis was also a marvelous cook who cooked daily, not just on the weekends. When the Iaconis family moved to Weilerbach in 1979, one of the neighbors told his wife that she could see Joe in the kitchen every evening and she wondered what he was doing there. Ute told her that Joe was preparing dinner. The news spread quickly throughout the neighborhood. However, what was not known was that while Joe cooked, Ute did the homework with the boys. Chores were shared.

In 1992 Mr. Iaconis received his Masters of Education degree, an accomplishment that meant so much to him.

Mr. Iaconis was involved with students in many ways. For years he was known to run ping-pong tournaments in his classroom. Another of his loves was being sponsor for the National Honor Society where he maintained high expectations for his student members. He was also honored with several awards for outstanding teaching, including a recent edition of "Who's Who in American Teaching."

We will miss you, Mr. Iaconis. Thank you for sharing your love of learning with us.

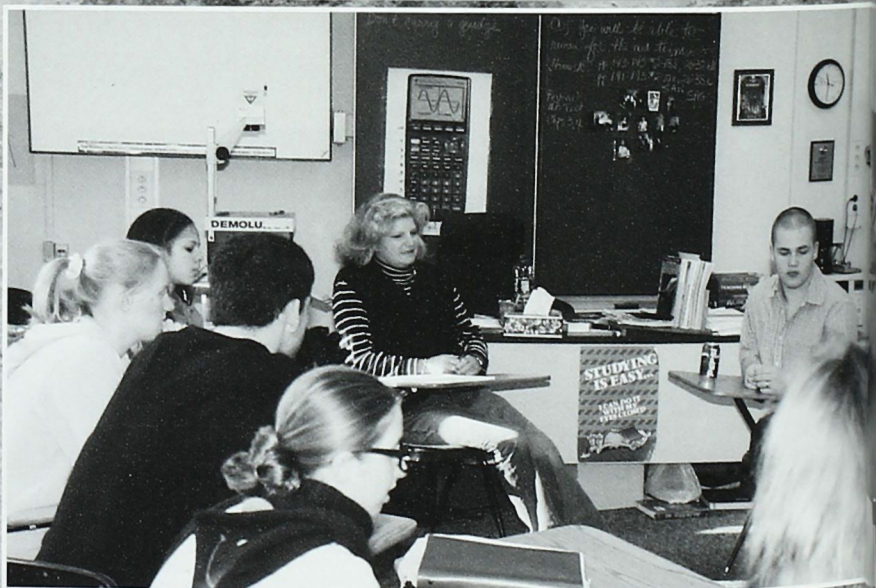


Student Government

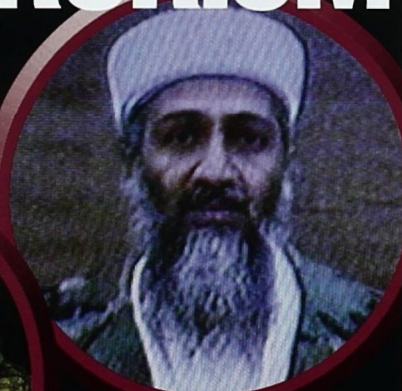

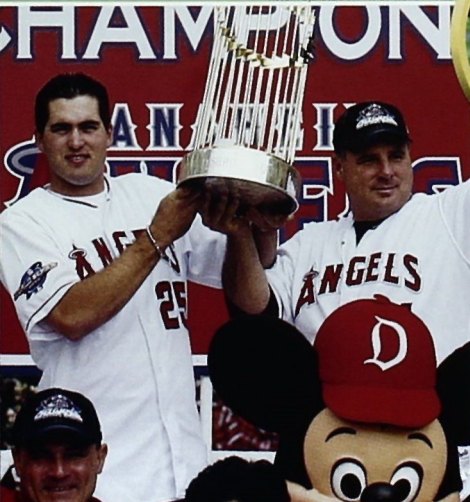

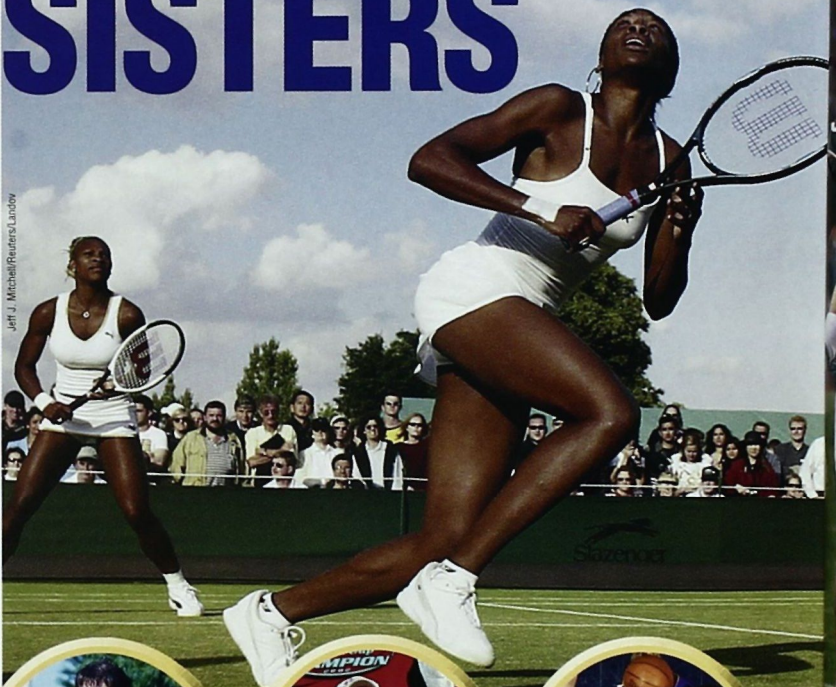
