

Kaiserslautern High School began its history in a converted apartment building across the street from its present location. The high school was carved out of the forests and was originally known as Rhine High. From 1953 to 1958 one hundred and fifty-eight students were housed in dormitories. Students came from all over Europe where their parents were serving, because they had no opportunity to attend school. During the 1960's the dorms disappeared and the school was renamed for the host city, Kaiserslautern. It has been known as K-town High ever since.






























