What better word to describe our world right now? We're in the middle of a global pandemic, celebrating our first year as a school and nothing is as it seems. New teachers, new students, and a new school.



"It doesn't take only a day to learn these things, it takes a longer period of time. For me, when dancing or drawing, you can see my improvement every day and I see it myself." says Shiri-Amor Sojot, a seventh grader dancer and artist.



When it comes to dancing, she specializes in three different areas: Hula, Tahitian, and Shuffle. Hula is a Polynesian dance form accompanied by chant or song. "I started hula dancing at four years

old. My mom put me in this school type of group called a Halau. She put me in it to find out if I would like it and it turned out I loved the dance and continued. Hula and Tahitian remind me about Hawaii, my favorite place. And they both tell a story with your hand movements."

Originating in the 1990s, shuffling consists of a number of motions and variations of your feet to create a mixture of rhythm to the beat of a song or remix. "I started shuffle dancing this year, at twelve years old. I came across a few people who shuffle danced, and it inspired me to dance. I started it for fun and wanted to be a part of it. Then, I later found out I loved that type of dance too."

Due to the current pandemic, Sojot shares not being able to participate in hula dancing with her hula group but how she practices shuffle dancing every chance she gets. "I just love seeing how I improve from Day 1 to today. For hula, I've only made one of my own choreography," She participated in the Reflections Program last year called **Look Within** and explains the story behind her choreography. "In 2018 there was an eruption on the East side of Hawaii Island and destroyed many homes near where my family lives. The origin of this dance is inspired by the lava from the volcanoes of Hawaii. It also represents the Goddess of Fire, Pele."

"For Hula/Tahitian: Bend your knees. It helps with controlling your swaying of your hips and it keeps your upper body centered, keeping arms up and helping with good posture. For shuffling, learn the basics first especially the move 'Running Man.' It helps a lot when you do variations and moves similar to the basics."






"I like writing down stuff and watching videos. I like writing about personal stuff," Logan Mitchell.






Robotics

In the robotics class, you learn to code. You code small robots and things on the computer. The students in this class are learning the important skill of coding.










A Work of Art




Friends Forever


