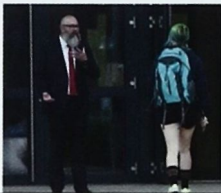

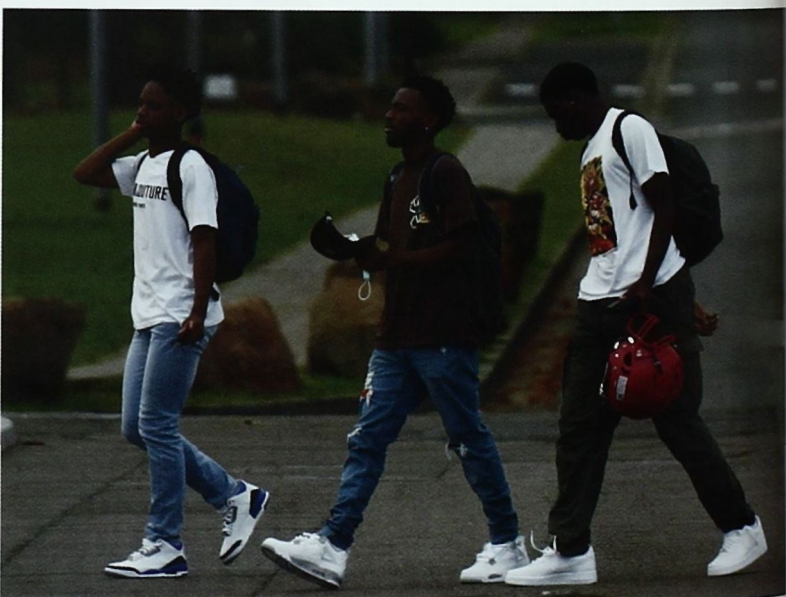

For Red Ribbon Week!

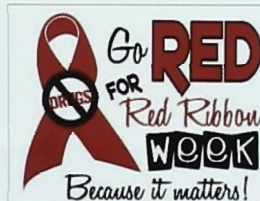

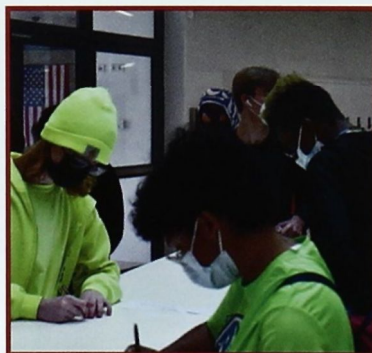

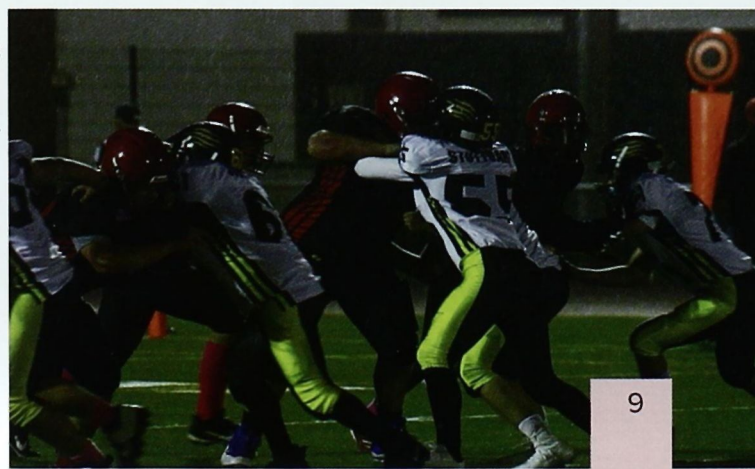

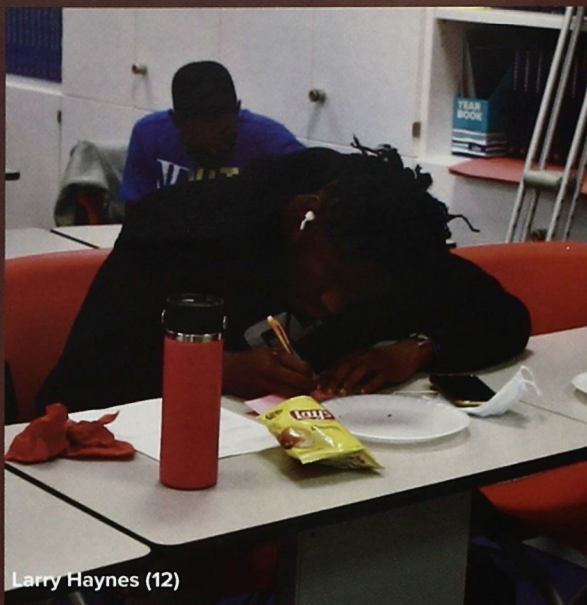

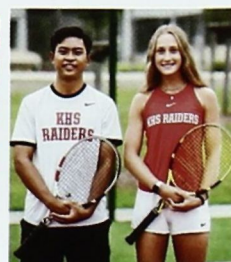

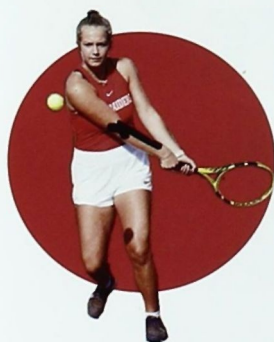
Tennis Takes First at European Championship

Q: What advice would you give to your peers adjusting to high school?

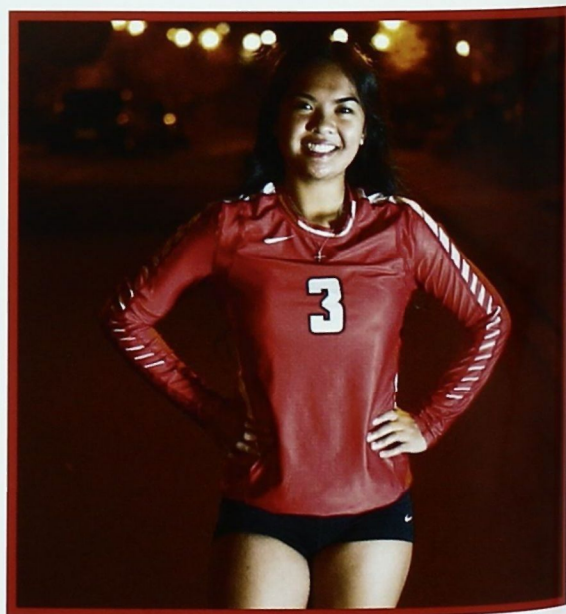

A: "I wasn't able to play last year, but I'm super excited to be able to travel and play against other teams now."

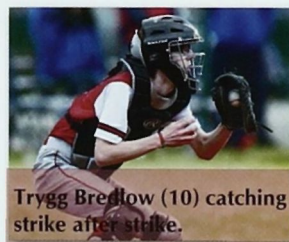

Q: Why do you like music?

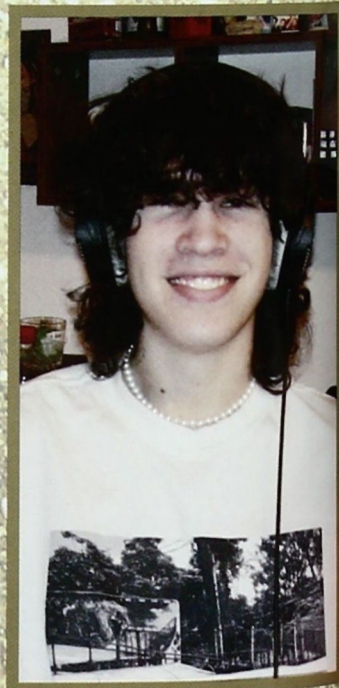

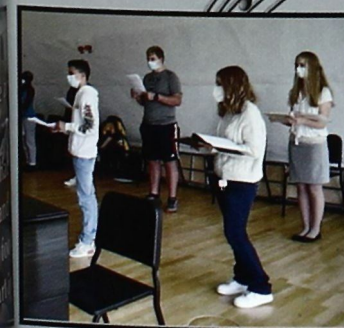

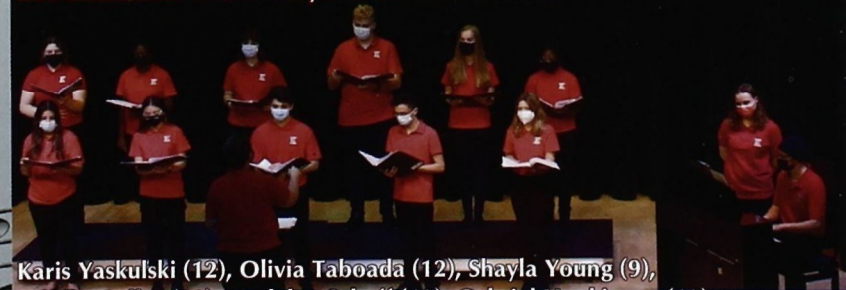

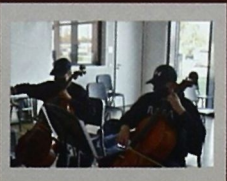

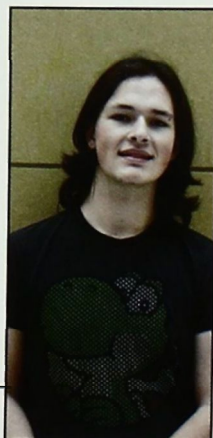

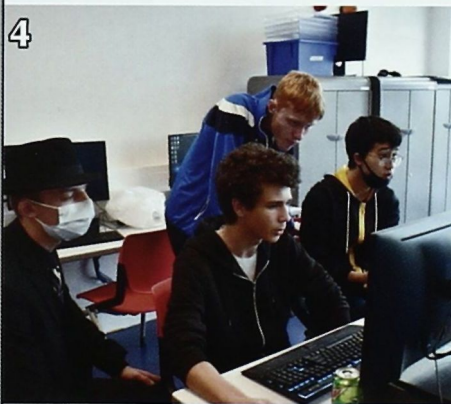
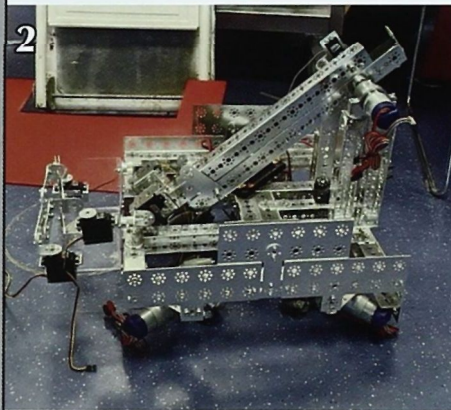

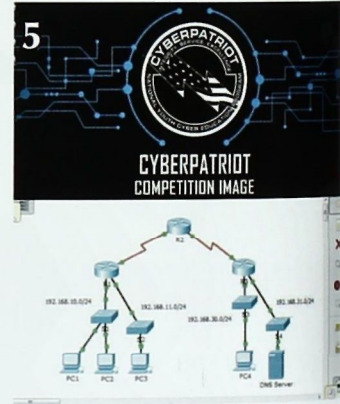

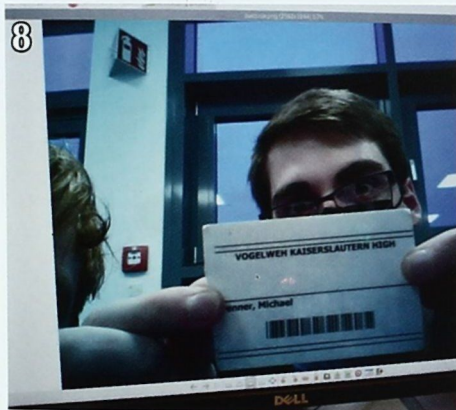
