

On the red top, there are many different things that you can do such as talk, play sports, and just sit and hangout. The sports that people most enjoy playing are soccer, kickball, and basketball.



The first day of school was a new experience for all of us and was kind of confusing. But at the end of the day, we all made it through.






WORKight

Some students, like Lilyana Quesada, appreciate the people who made it happen. "I love that PTSA takes time in their day to do it for us."





Many people seem to enjoy the class and everyone usually has really positive remarks for it.


"My favorite piece was probably a cupcake pinch pot. It wasn't that great but that was the first thing I made out of clay," Allie Krevy said.


"We do a lot of engineering and we also build and create different things," Ra'Ziya Burks said.

Leadership Styles


Doing fun activities in class could be one of the best ways to learn! In Mr. Petrick's English Language Arts class, students worked in groups creating a poster based on their leadership styles.



American Football is definitely a U.S favorite when it comes to sports. Even overseas, people can show their love for the rough, but fun sport.


Many students at Kaiserslautern Middle share their love for football during their recess time after eating lunch. They throw back and forth with one another and play games like Jackpot.

With Taliban cooperation, U.S. forces helped evacuate Afghan and American citizens and allies amidst chaos at Hamid Karzai airport in Kabul.

CHILDREN'S PEACE PRIZE

17-year-old Vihaan Agarwal and his 14-year-old brother Nav won the 2021 International Children's Peace Prize for their pollution-fighting project, "One Step Greener," which picks up and separates garbage and recycling from over 1,500 schools, offices and homes in Delhi, India, one of the most polluted cities in the world.

HURRICANE **IDA HAVOC**

On the 16th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina's 2005 destruction, Ida hit the coast of Louisiana as a Category 4 hurricane with 150 mph winds. After knocking out power in Louisiana, the storm hit the Northeast, bringing tornados, flooding and breaking rainfall records.



BROOD X RETURNS

Billions of Brood X cicadas, the largest group of 17-year periodical cicadas, emerged from their underground habitat in May and June 2021. Periodical cicadas are famous for being a noisy member of the natural world.



TIME'S PERSON OF THE YEAR

Time magazine named billionaire Elon Musk, chief executive of electronic car manufacturer Tesla and space exploration company SpaceX, the 2021 Person of the Year. The designation is given to the person or people that Time considers most influential, whether positive or negative, during the year.



ELECTRIC CARS

Ford announced an \$11.4 billion plan to build three new battery plants and a truck assembly plant, with the goal of mass producing a new battery-powered pickup truck. Ford also announced production of an electric version of its most popular truck, the F-150 Lightning, by Spring of 2022. GM planned new battery production plants in the next few years, and Toyota switched its focus from hybrid to fully electric vehicles.

NYCFC CLAIM FIRST CUP

New York City Football Club captured their first Major League Soccer Cup in franchise history. They defeated the Portland Timbers 4-2 in a penalty shootout. This was the Timbers' second consecutive defeat, having reached MLS Cup three times in seven years.



ATLANTA WINS

The Atlanta Braves took the World Series with a 7-0 Game 6 shutout of the Houston Astros in November, the franchise's first World Series victory in 26 years. In July, manager Brian Snitker acquired four players in late-season trades, including Series MVP Jorge Solera.



CHICAGO'S WNBA FIRST

October saw the Chicago WNBA franchise win its first championship series, defeating the Phoenix Mercury in four games. Playing to a sold-out arena, the Sky scored 80 points to the Mercury's 74 in the final game.





TWICE AS NICE

The Tampa Bay Lightning beat the Montreal Canadiens, 4 games to 1 in a 7-game playoff series, winning their second NHL championship in nine months.

SUPER BOWL LVI

The Cincinnati Bengals and Los Angeles Rams battle it out in Super Bowl LVI. The Bengals have never won a Super Bowl title and last made an appearance at Super Bowl XXIII. The Rams are only the second team in NFL history to play the Super Bowl in their home stadium.

KIDS' VACCINES GREENLIGHTED

After authorizing emergency use of the Pfizer-BioNtech vaccine for those 16 and older, the FDA amended the order in May 2021 to include 12-17 year olds. In October, approval was extended to 5-11 year olds. As of Dec. 8, 2021, the CDC reported that 61% of 12-17 year olds and 18% of 5-11 year olds had received at least one vaccine dose.

DELTA WAVE, OMICRON TSUNAMI

By the summer of 2021, things were starting to return to normal, then the Delta variant of COVID-19 arrived. By December, the newest variant, Omicron, a highly-contagious form of the virus, replaced Delta's position as the most common type of COVID-19 infection being diagnosed.
