1974 saw the Karamursel Varsity Football Team extend its unbeaten string to two seasons. The Kougars, under the brilliant
guidance and leadership of super coaches Dennis LaValley and Blan Palmer, stormed through the league schedule blasting the
opposition. The Karamursel defense was one of the least scored upon in Europe, while the offensive squad had one of the

one man in Europe.
Spurred on by Kujawa's 3 TD's and Spittle's 105 yards, the offense stole the show. In the 1st game of the season, the KHS gridders whipped Ankara in true Kougar fashion, 50-0. Rafael

Gray bolted for a TD on a 33 yard option during the 1st Kougar play. The powerful defense led by Turner and Spittle, held the Trojans to 101 yards while the Kougars collected 388.

The next week the Kougars
highest point totals in USDESEA.
The Kougar defense, led by All-Conference stars, Mark Lyon, ''Boom' Fields, Mike Fuhrman, and All-Turkey and All-Europe linebacker Jeff Spittle, chalked up two shutouts and allowed only 42 points. The secondary unit used three major defenses: the 52 regular, 52 kill, and 40 monster. Meanwhile, employing coach LaValley's wishbone offense, the Kougar attack completely overran all opponents and scored 241 points on 34 touchdowns, 3 field goals, 4 two-point PAT's, and 20 PAT kicks. All-Conference selections from the offensive squad were Lyon, Spittle, Kujawa, Fuhrman, Turner and Enloe.

The whole Kougar backfield: Rafael Gray, Ples Kujawa, Jeff Spittle, and Mark Lyon ranked among the top twenty scorers in USDESEA. They scored 58,50 , 71 , and 46 points respectively. Special honors go to Mark Lyon who made the All-Europe 2nd team as a halfback and Jeff Spittle who made the All-Europe 1st team as a linebacker and placekicker. Spittle was the number

traveled to Incirlik to play the Hodjas for the first time ever. Lyon's passing lent sparkle to the contest and Spittle shined as he rushed for 81 of 213 yards. It was a Spittle TD in the 2nd quarter that was all the Kougars needed, as a tough defense led by Turner, Spittle, Lyon, and Scaramucci limited the Hodjas to only 88 yards and no points.

Then the Kougars were again on the road, this time traveling to Izmir to meet the IHS Sultans. The KHS squad had two TD's called back in the first half and left the field at halftime trailing $6-0$. After coach LaValley's pep talk, the offense got the ball on the kickoff, swept the field, and capped their march with a 3 yard TD plunge by Spittle.

Spittle's PAT kick rounded the score 13-6. The Sultans added 6 to their score but the Kougars triumphed, 13-12. Kujawa paced the attack with 128 out of 214 yards. The KHS gridders regained possession of the pigskin once more later on and drove across the field. Kujawa climaxed the drive with a daring 15 yard TD run.

The fourth game of the season saw the Kougars at home hosting the Incirlik Hodjas in the first night game of the year. The play started off quickly. Lyon drew blood first on a 13 yard keeper. Right after the kick-off the Hodjas raced the field and were out

ahead by 1 score: 8-7. Everyone was ready for a close game when Lyon again hit paydirt and took the Hodjas spirit with him. From then on it was all Karamursel as Spittle scored 21 and Lyon 18 to ignite the offense. Fuhrman, Fields, and a super tough line excelled on defense to hold Incirlik to a meager 66 yards.
Saturday, October 19 will go down in Kougar history. The occasion was the 1974-75 Homecoming. Under the lights at a wet and muddy Kougar stadium, the teams lined up with the conference championship at stake. It was the Izmir Sultans, in red and white, needing a win to share a piece of the trophy, and the Karamursel Kougars in black and gold nose to nose on the line. The KHS players took the field with confidence and pride in themselves and their coaches, and the admiration of the large and faithful Kougar crowd. Halfway through the first quarter, Ples Kujawa ripped-off around the end for a 30 yard sprint into the end zone. The Sultans bounced back and took an 8-6 advantage. After that score the Kougars were on fire and Jeff Spittle put the team ahead to stay as he rammed over from the 2 yard line. The Sultans went nowhere fast as a tough Kougar defense with standouts Fields, Fuhrman, Lyon, and Spittle ground their offense to an abrupt halt. Near the end of the half WB, Mark Lyon put the ball in the air to Dan Enloe and the big tight end astonished the crowds as he sped to the end zone for a perfect 54 yard strike. Then safety Lyon intercepted a sideline pass, and raced an unbelievable 65 yards for the score as the siren sounded halftime. In the second half a 7 yard run by Rafael Gray and a 22 yard Spittle field goal clearly drained the hopes of the bewildered Izmir squad. The final outcome was a $37-8$ Kougar victory and a 2nd consecutive

For the last high school football game for the Turkey Senior gridders, the Kougars traveled to Ankara to play the winless Trojans. It was no contest at all as KHS stole 21 points in the first period and ended with a 60-14 thrashing. The entire backfield gained over the lopsided play 100 yards with the total an unbelievable 496 . High scorers were Spittle, Kujawa, and Gray with 18, 12,18 points respectively. This destruction of the Trojans was the final exciting climax to a fantastic football season.

The 1974 season saw the KHS Junior Varsity squad race to a 1 -2-1 finish and win a second place standing in All-Turkey JV football. Although lacking in experience, coahces Roger Jarvis and Francis Scaramucci's charges played some creditable ball.
In the opener at Karamursel against Ankara, the Kougars squashed the Trojan's 8-zip, behind the running and passing of QB Dave Hehn and the bruising yardage of FB Larry Himes.
K'sel gained two points off a safety when Himes brought down the AHS QB in the end zone. Late in the 3rd quarter, Hehn found a crack in the line and scored on a keeper from the 10 yd . line after David Herron pounced on a Trojan fumble on their own 15 yard line.
The Kougars faced the Izmir Sultans in the next contest. Facing an unstoppable backfield the KHS gridders went down 30 -

A fortnight later the Sultans were at Karamursel. Barely into the 2nd period, Doritty swept end
and raced 30 yds. , eluding tackles, for a 6-0 Kougar lead. Mitchell took a PAT pass from Hehn for two more. Izmir pulled back within 2 pts. before the half. They took control again in the 2nd half with 2 quick TDs. The final score: 30-8-Izmir. Special mention for an outstanding game goes to Doritty and Hollander.
The season finale was set in Ankara. KHS trailed 0-6 at half, but came back strong. With 30 seconds of play remaining, HB Herron crashed over the line from 2 yards out tying it all up.
