


2 Yearbook





their skills to the highest levels.


As one instructor described it, "Creative Connections is a whole semester of Fine Arts packed into one week." The activity culminates with an exhibition of artwork followed by stage


Red Ribbon Week





















Military Career Day




High School and Middle School Host Nation










































Students Shine at the Around the World Fair

Our wonderful PTO has also hosted myriad school-wide spirit and family events, for which


we are incredibly thankful. It just goes to show that parents, students and teachers together can and do make a difference!
