

in the U.S. He can't represent you in court except for appearances under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Claims should also be made at this office. Phone 323.

The office is also the Civil Liaison Office for maintenance of contact with German business, political and cultural agencies. Through its Civil Affairs representatives, it handles problems pertaining to housing, adoptions, debts, claims and German-American relations generally. Phone 355.

Your Child's Education . . .

Schooling equal to that obtained in the United States is provided here for all dependent children. The American school in downtown Landsberg is located in the Saarbun Kaserne. It enrolls children from kindergarten up through the eighth grade.

Local classes begin at 0845 and are dismissed at 1515 hours. Bus transportation is furnished where necessary.

High school pupils attend the high school in Munich, living there in dormitories. Transportation is furnished so that they can come home on weekends.

All credits earned are valid for transfers to state-side schools. Prerequisites required of all instructors include college degrees, teaching experience, and certification by their respective State Board of Education. Standard Civil Service procedure is followed in their employment.

School policies are determined by the 7755th Depend-



ent School Detachment. A prescribed course of study is followed and includes studies of the German language throughout all grades. Teachers are also encouraged to take advantage of the European environment by arranging field trips and tours to places of historical and cultural interest.

The Landsberg school cafeteria serves noon meals at a cost of twenty cents per meal, fifteen cents if meal tickets are purchased. Recess periods are supervised by the teachers on the school's large playground. Basketball and softball teams are organized for upper graders.

The school term opens following Labor Day and continues until the second week of June. Students are given the usual vacations at Christmas time and in the Spring. Summer school classes, when required, are offered for six weeks for students requiring additional help.

The administration makes a determined effort to help students adjust themselves to the local school and community. However, parents wishing to discuss specific problems concerning their children are urged to make an appointment with the principal and/or teacher. Phone 216.

Parents are encouraged to join the local Parent-Teachers Association, which is very active. It meets monthly in the school auditorium on the second Tuesday of the month at 1930 hours.
