This is the fourth fruitful year, but in many ways the first three were merely preparatory. This year's senior class entered Ludwigsburg, then called Stuttgart High School, in 1958. As freshmen, they played a relatively minor role in the activities of the school. It was a time for getting to know each other and for making the first hesitant contributions to school life.

During the intervening sophomore and junior years their role gradually changed from minor to major. As tenth graders they sponsored their first dances and wrote the first sophomore class constitution. As eleventh graders they were often in friendly competition academically, athletically, and socially with that year's seniors. The year was culminated with the presentation of an excellent Junior-Senior Prom, the annual gift from the eleventh grade to the twelfth grade.

They learned to serve and to compete for three years so that in this, their fourth year, they were able to assume the leadership that is expected of seniors. By spirited campaigning, class members swept into every major office of every major organization and of most minor organizations. In positions of trust, such as student council, they directed the student body's efforts into constructive channels such as the painting of the auditorium and the compiling of a student directory.

Leadership extended to athletics. Dick Sosnay was captain of the football team while Vic Packer and Bill Wise were elected to the ALL-USAREUR Team. In wrestling, Sosnay and Richard Odom were co-captains. Three seniors are the leading candidates to head the track team.

Leadership extends to academics though in a more subtle way. Many seniors excel in extra-curricular activities and are much admired by underclassmen. Since most of these seniors are good students, underclassmen tend to study harder, realizing that academic excellence is a condition of leadership at Ludwigsburg High School.

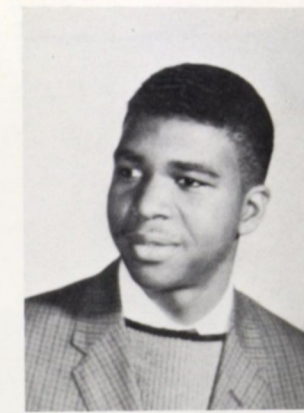

September of 1961 brought a unique collection of individuals to Ludwigsburg American High School. Numbered among the youngest and smallest class was the first crop of accelerated students from junior high schools at Kelley, Patch, Robinson and Goeppingen.

September was a confusing and awe-inspiring time for these one hundred and twenty individuals. Students had to re-orient their thinking: former big men on the junior high school campuses were overshadowed by bigger men on the Ludwigsburg campus, familiar arithmetic was replaced by strange algebra, playground games gave way to inter-scholastic football. There were new teachers, classmates, books, subjects, clubs, forms, traditions, values, rules and regulations. One hundred and twenty individuals gritted their teeth and dug in.

Gradually a change took place. As the newness wore off; certain of the individuals began to achieve prominence in school life. Tim Smith and Ed Wise served as football managers; Nikko Scheifele, Beate Gonzales, and Cheryl Lamb distinguished themselves in Student Council. Barbara Fox was Homecoming Princess; Jane Holder was Christmas Formal Princess. In wrestling, where size is no handicap, Robert Mann, Andrew Inge, Ramon Vargas, Bill Yonushonis, and Jimmy Shannon set out to prove their equality pound for pound.

More important than extra-curricular prominence is scholastic achievement. Thirty-one of these individuals

were on the honor or merit rolls at the end of the first marking period.

It was soon after this remarkable achievement that a change began; the individuals started to show a pride in each other. "I" became "We" with increasing frequency.

The second semester came and with it a unified class. The one hundred and twenty individuals had found each other and, while preserving their individuality, looked forward to joint accomplishments in the years ahead. Each could claim, with pride, membership in the Class of 1965.
