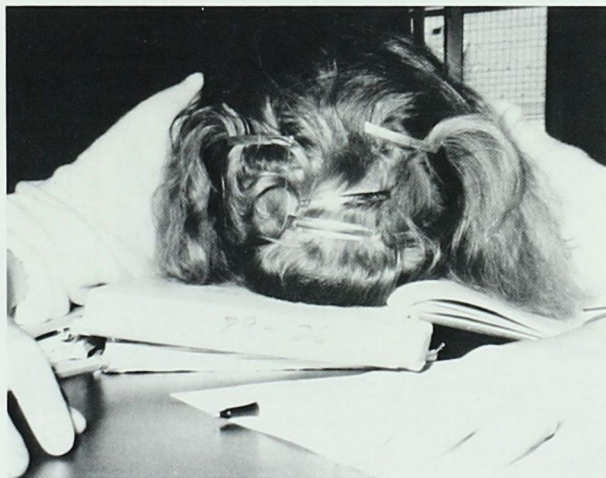

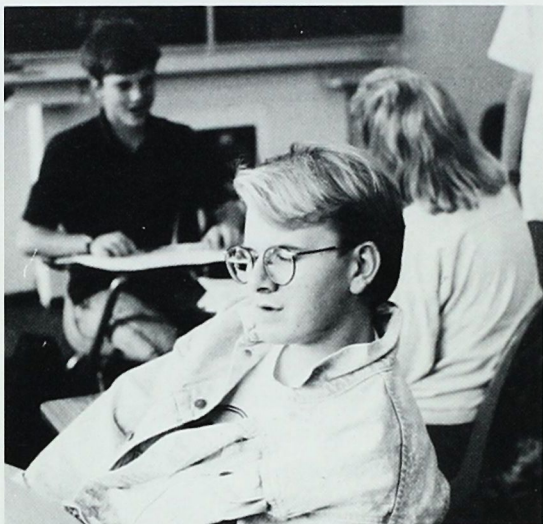

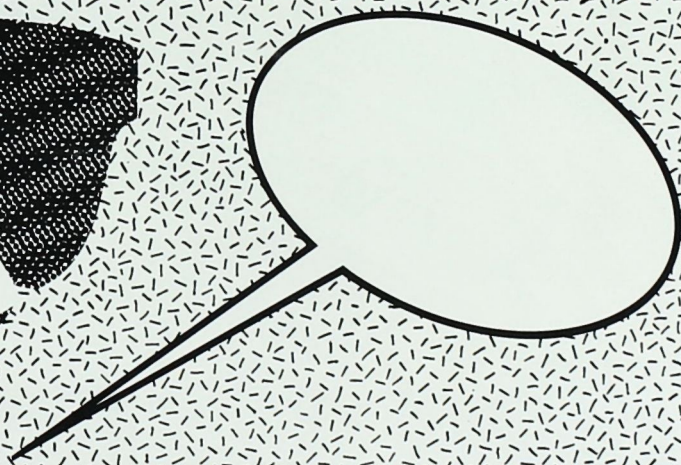

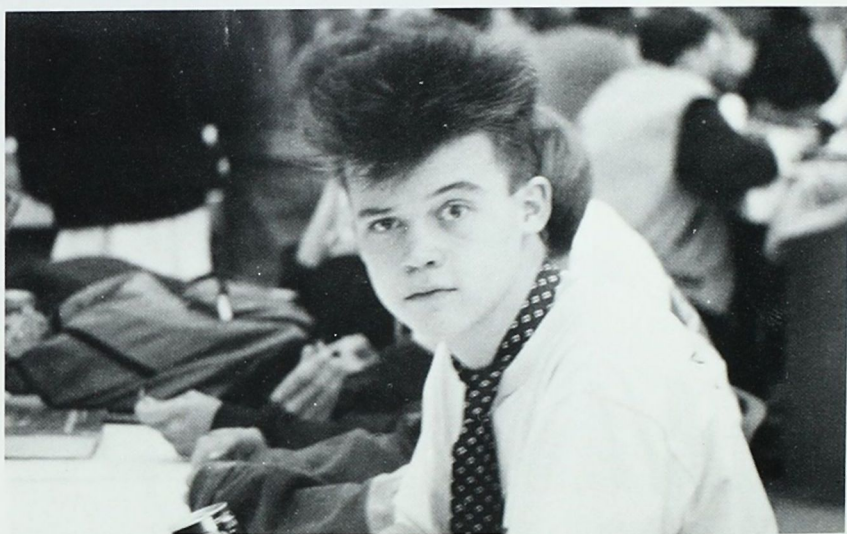

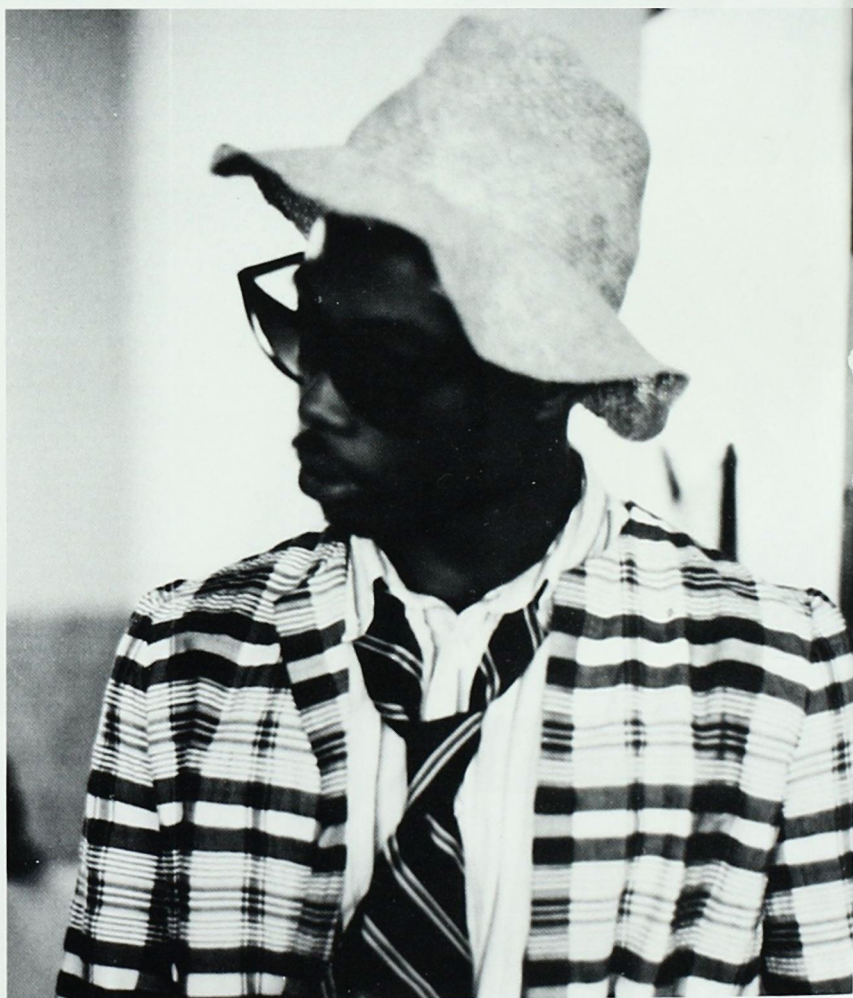

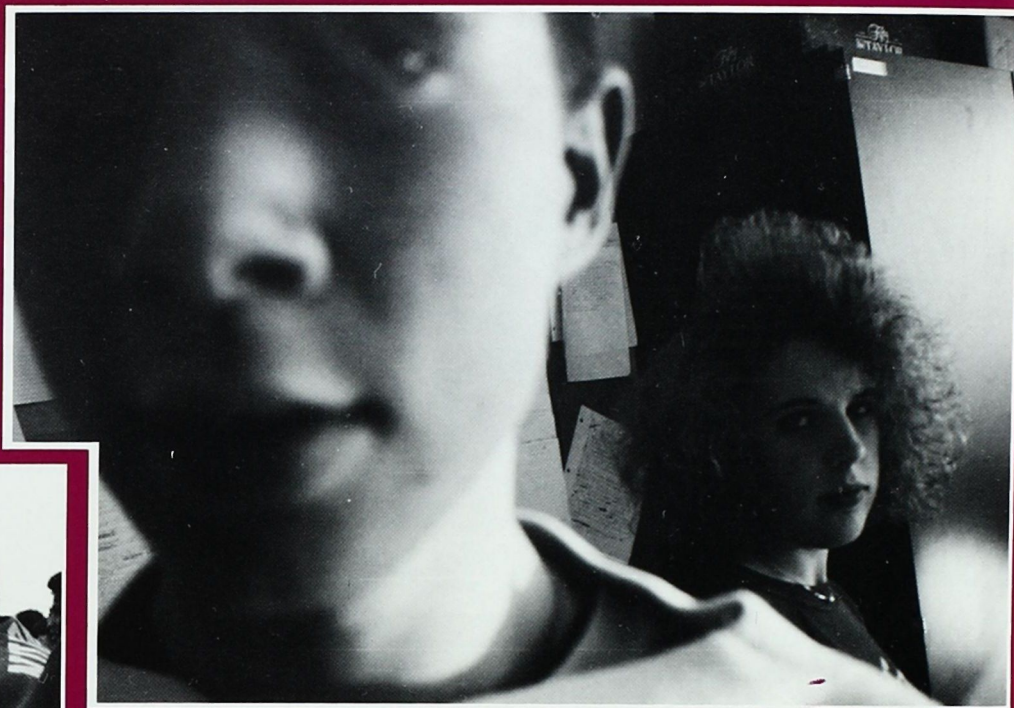

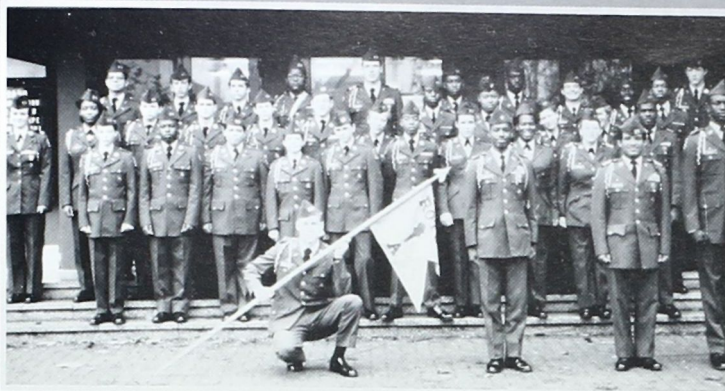


Nuernberg AJORTC

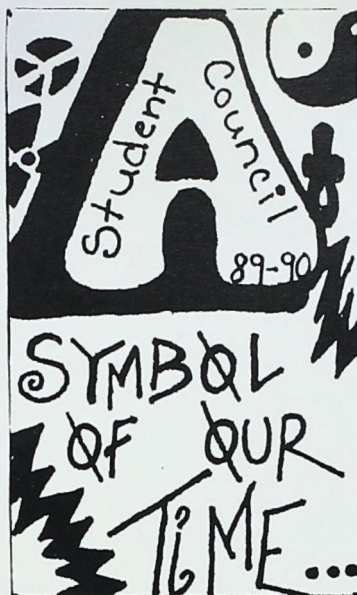

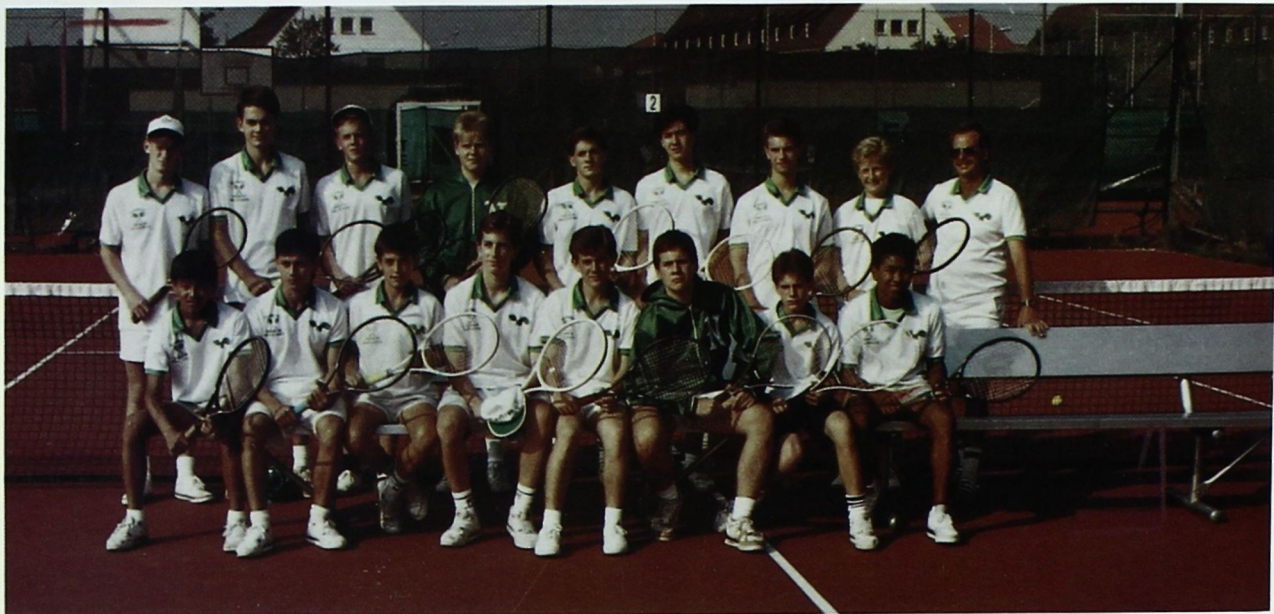

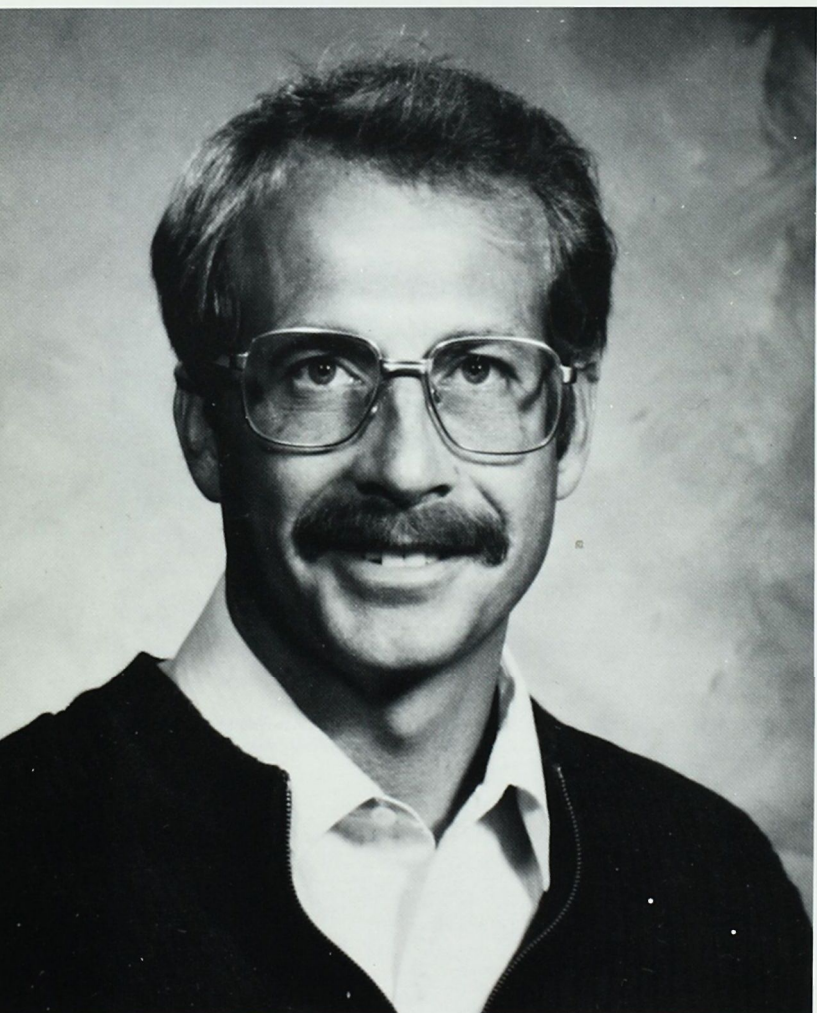

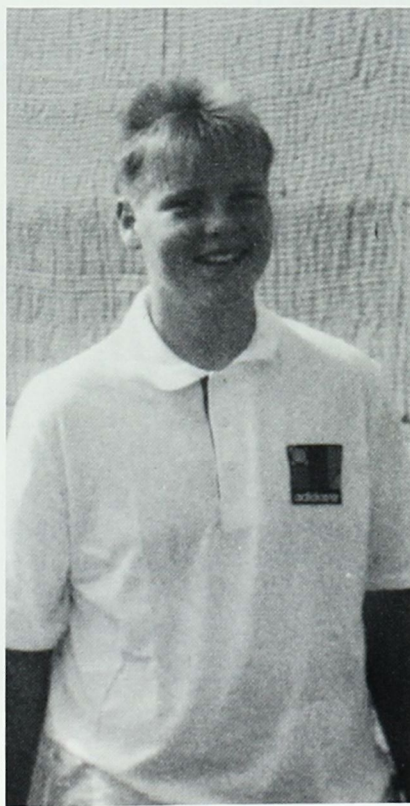
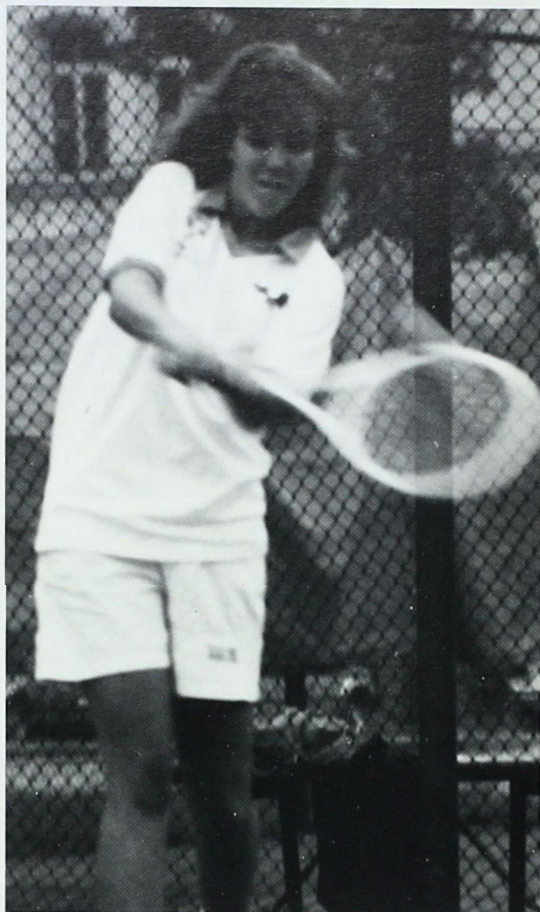

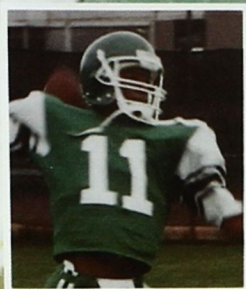

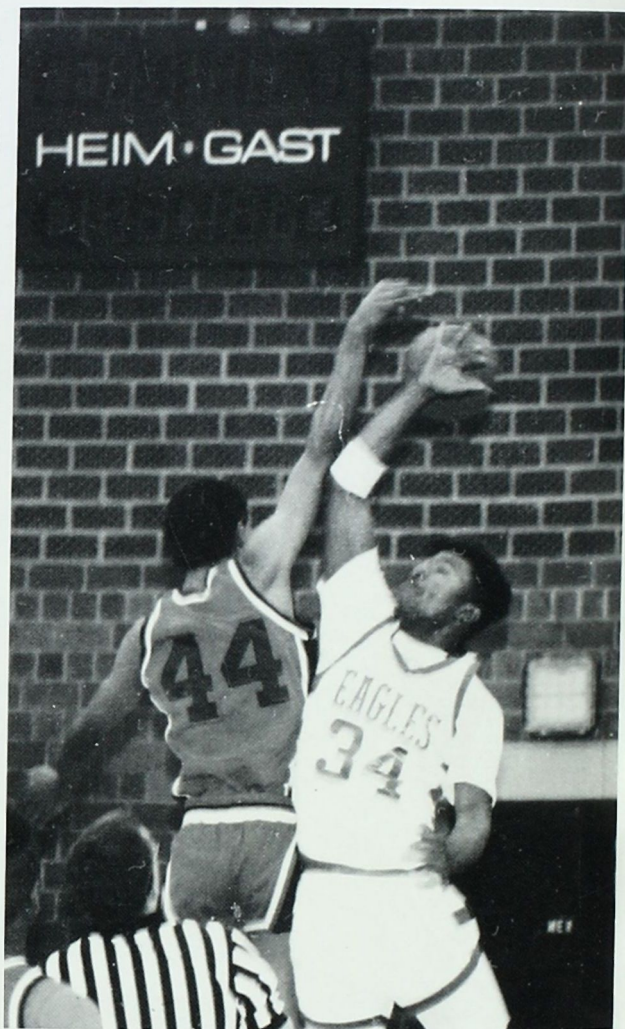

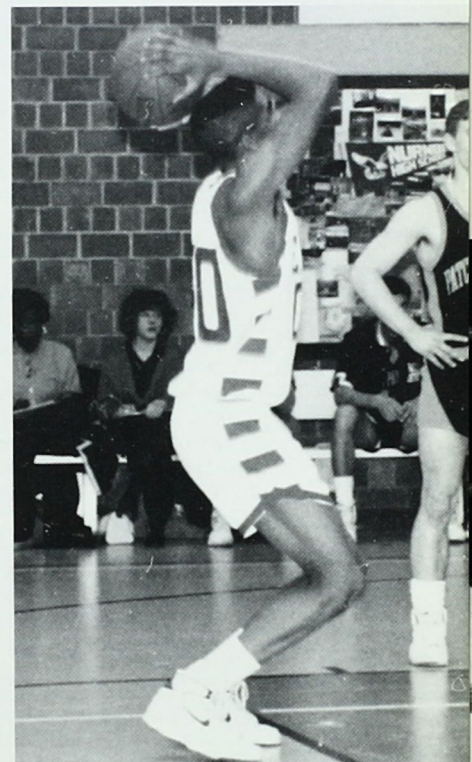

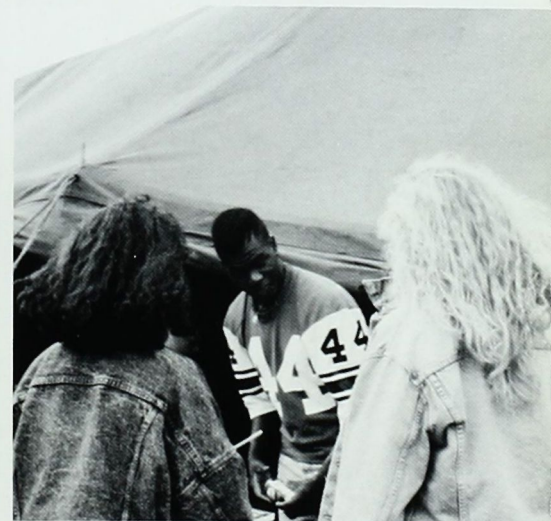

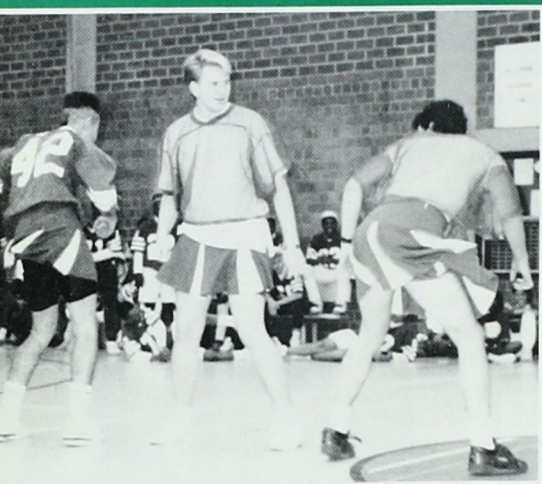

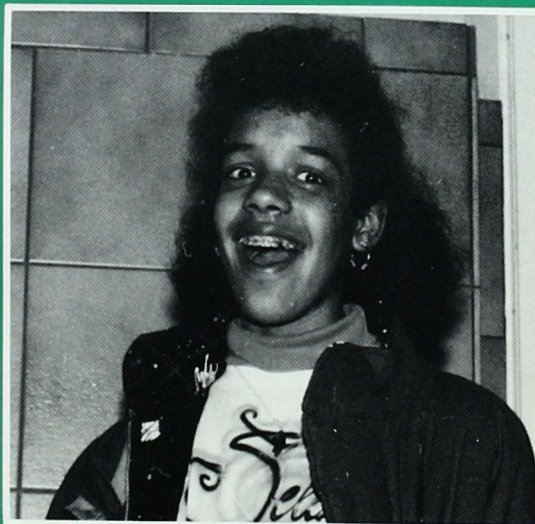

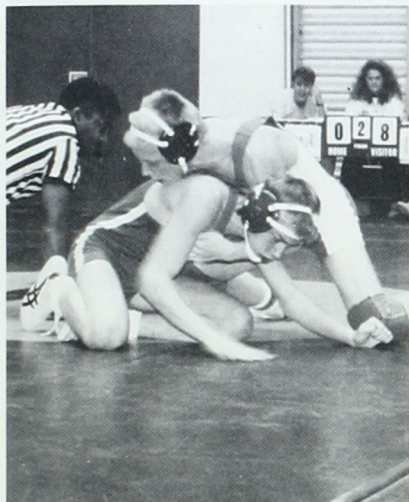

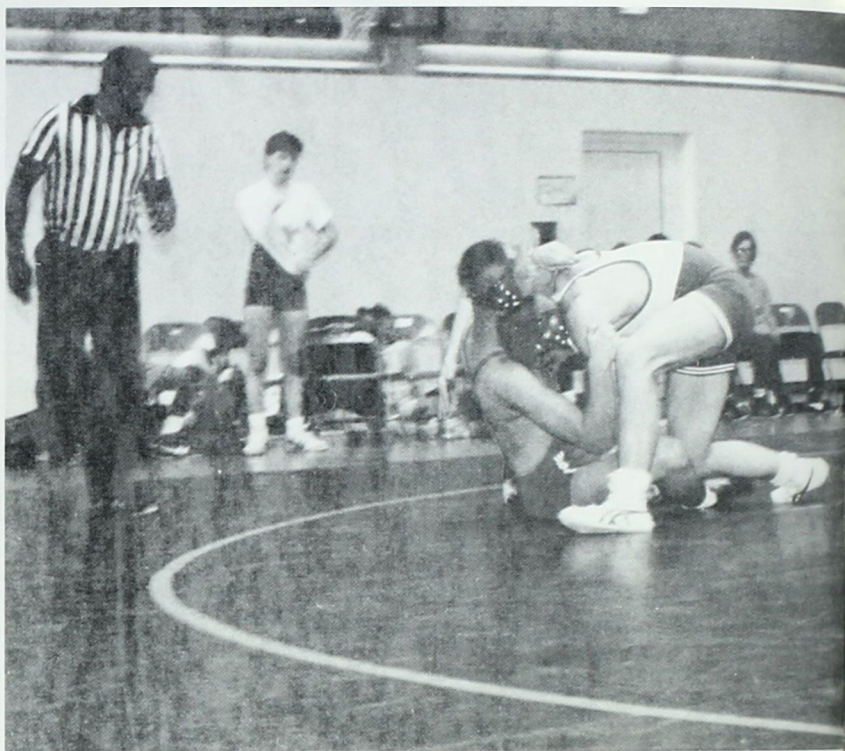

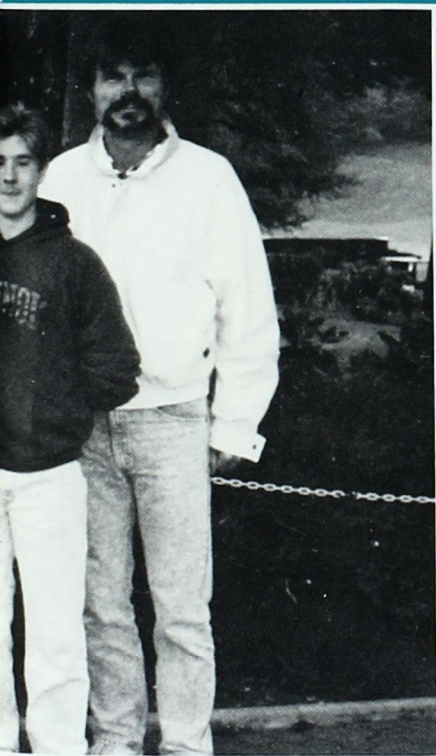

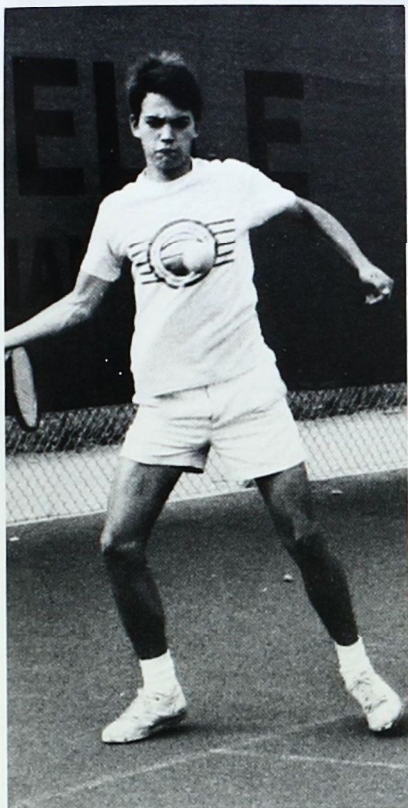

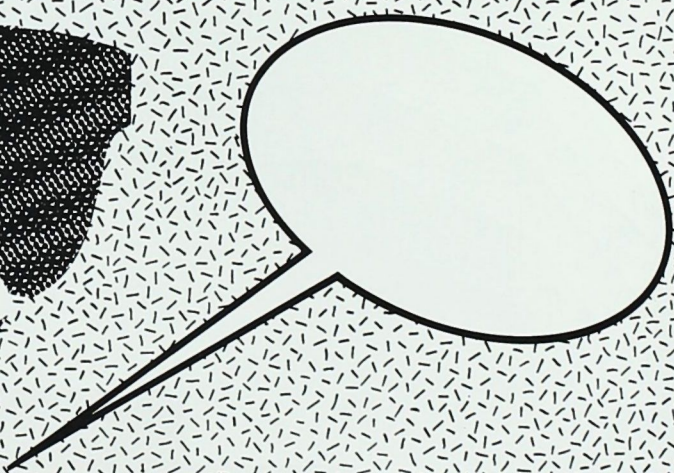
HOMEcoming BONFIRE
