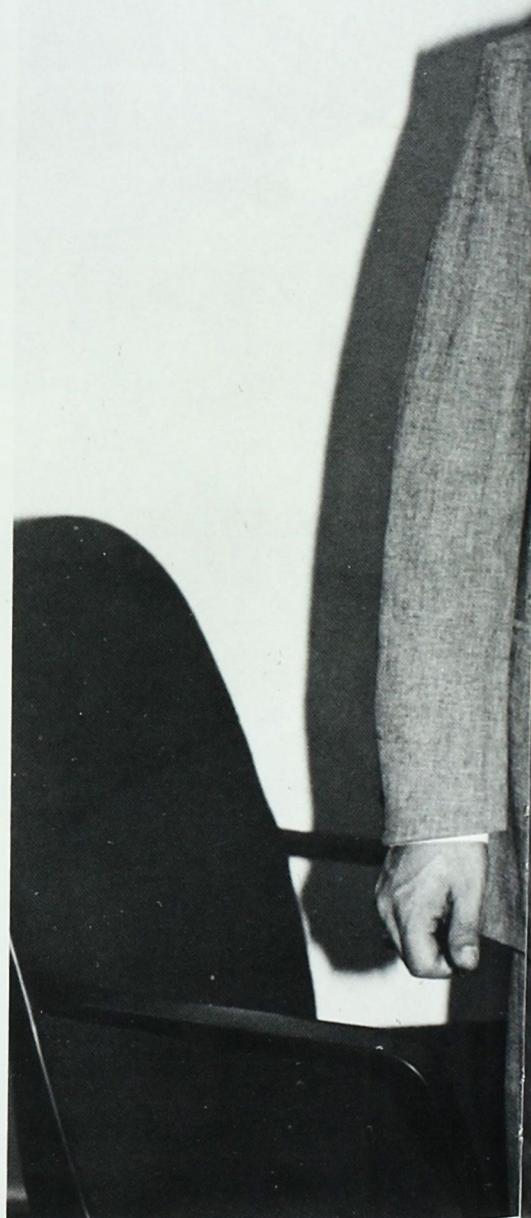

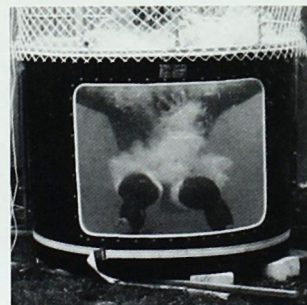
Nuernberg.....

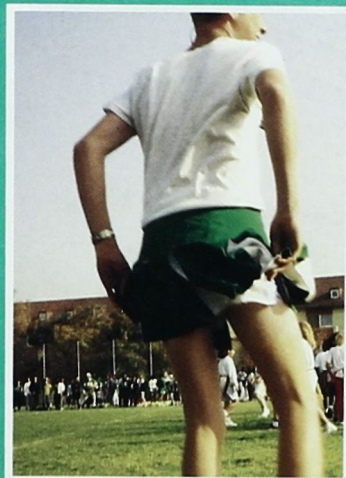

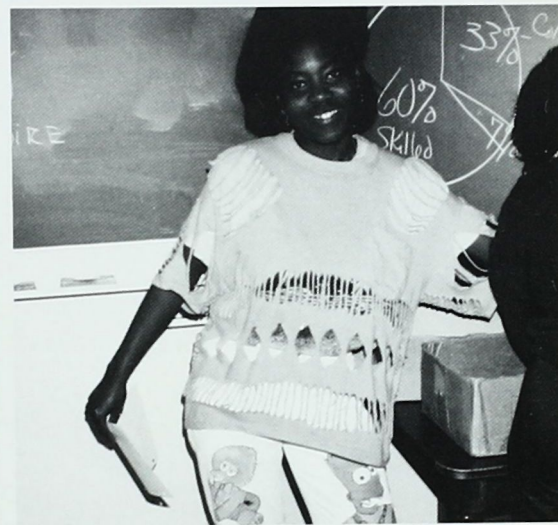

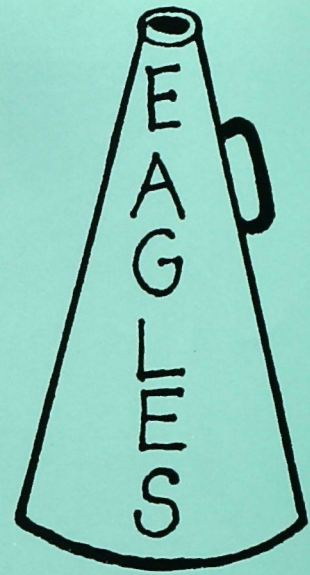

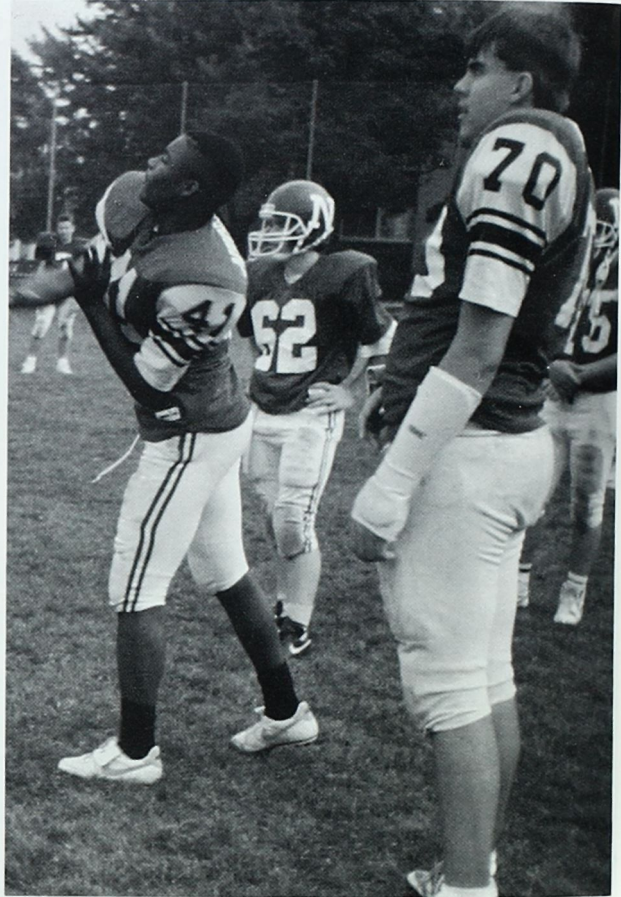

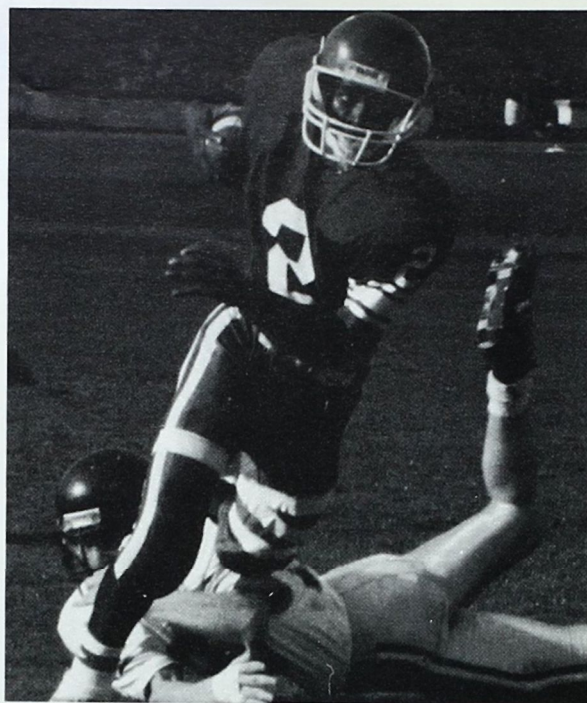

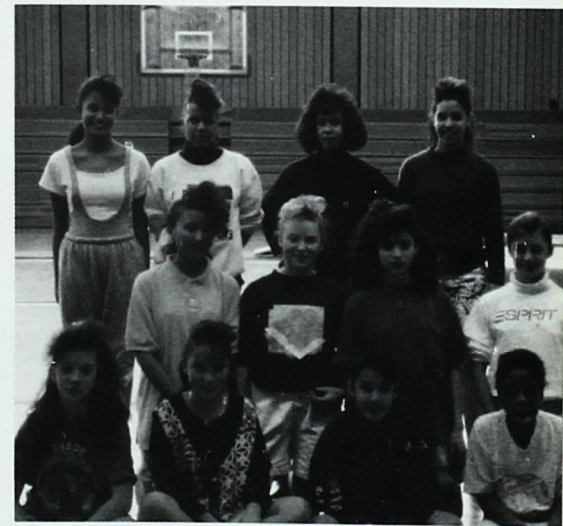

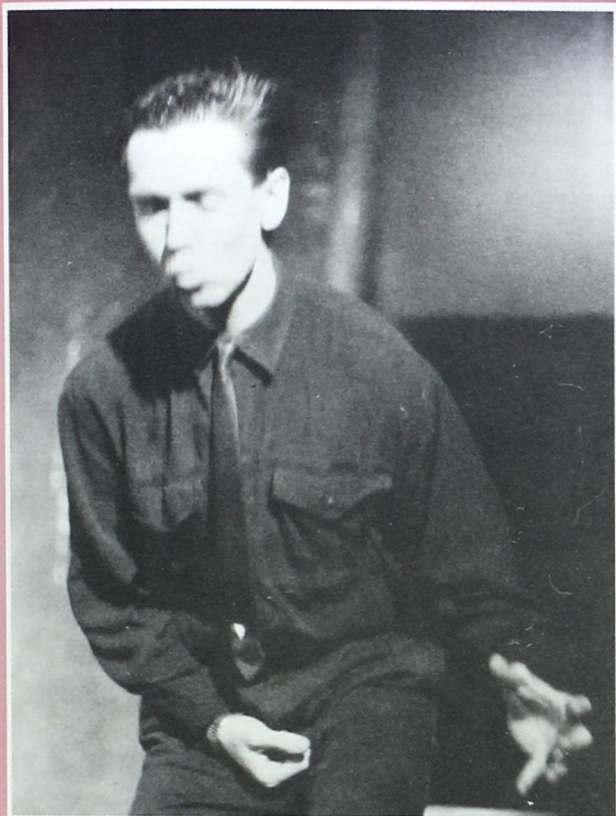

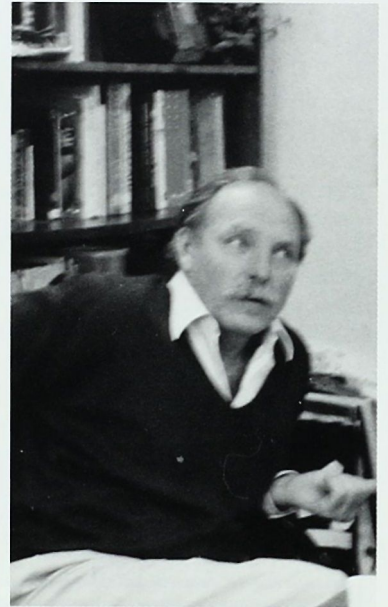

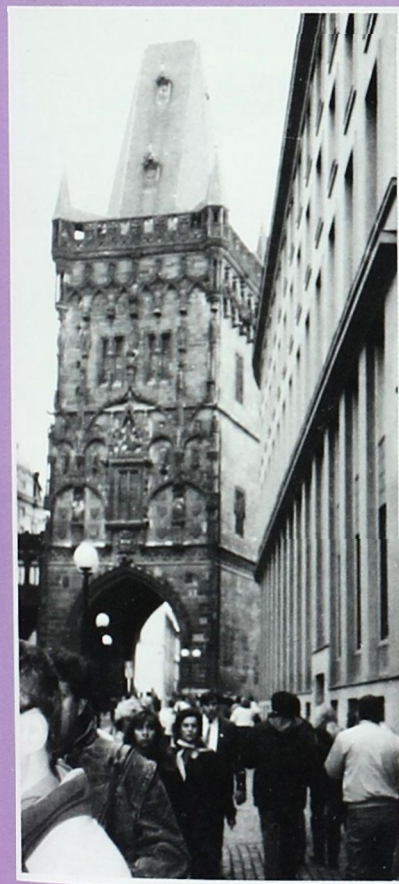
Cultural Exchanges

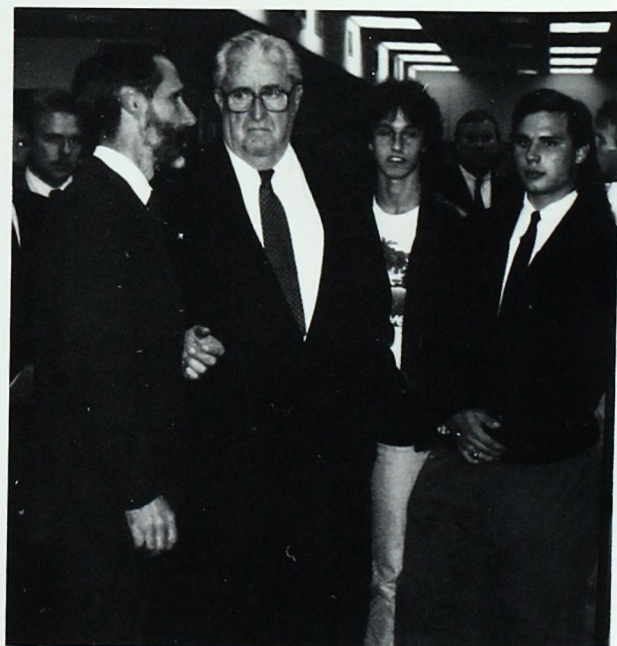

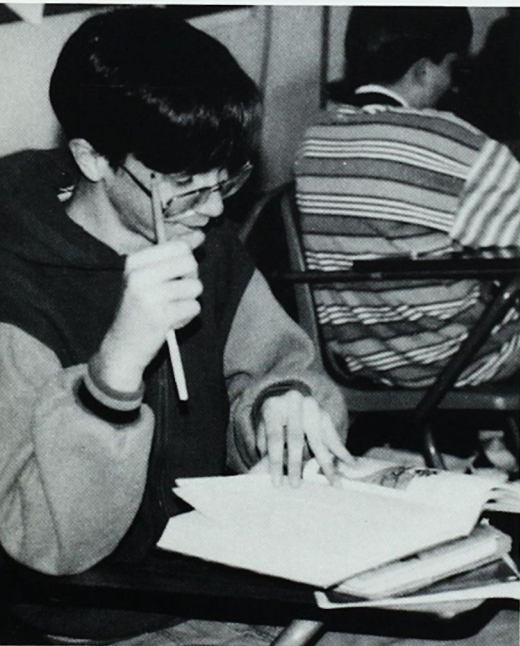


Sophomore Spirit

TRENDS OF 1990-91

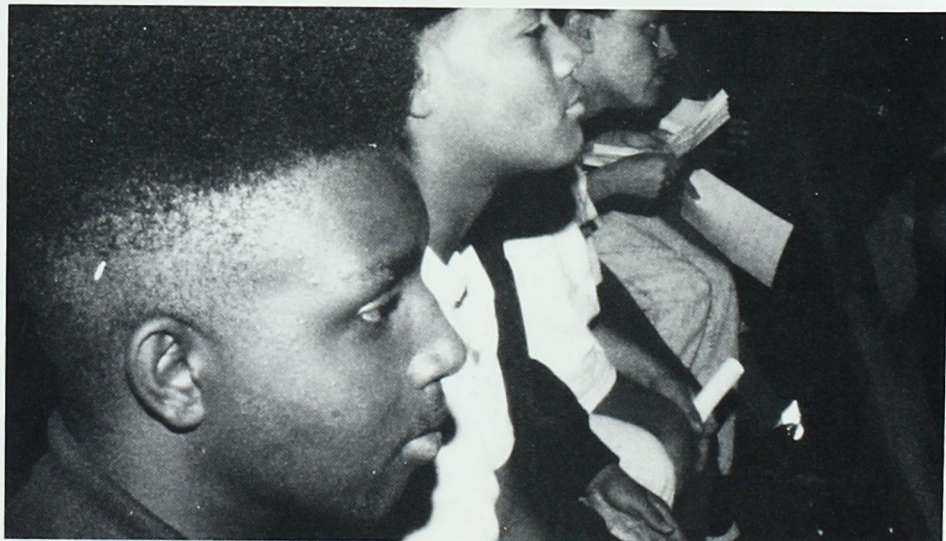

As tensions in the gulf increased things got a little tense around here too. President Bush decided to put troops in Saudi Arabia and so friends and loved ones from the states started to deploy to the Middle East. When November finally rolled around, the Nuernberg military community found out that we were going to send troops to the Middle East. It ended up that over 70% of the troops from Nuernberg were deployed to Operation Desert Shield. When Moms and Dads left to fight the war in the gulf the kids and parents left behind pulled together for support. Many families attended support groups weekly and shared their pain with each other. The people of the German communities came to help out as well. Soon letter writing campaigns got underway with people mailing thousands of letters to "Any Soldier." The American people swore to themselves that this war was not going to be another Vietnam. We promised to support our troops wholeheartedly even if some Americans didn't agree with the war. Things such as Kool Aid, chapstick, deodorant, socks, plastic bags, cookies, candy, cassette tapes, batteries, toothpaste, and many other simple items were sent with love to our troops in the Persian Gulf. On January 17, 1991 Operation Desert Shield turned into Operation Desert Storm. General Norman Schwarzkopf sent our troops into an air campaign with a moving speech saying "You are the thunder and the lightning of this storm." Some Nuernberg dependents woke up to phone calls relaying the news that our country was at war. Others woke up to a news report saying that the air campaign had started. The next thirty-eight days were filled with worry as we all clung to our T. V. sets waiting for the news. The air campaign was a complete success. On February 23, 1991 the ground war started. Our troops moved in and liberated Kuwait in 100 hours of ground battle. When a cease fire was called we all felt a great weight had been lifted off of our shoulders. Soldiers guarded our homes, the shopping center and the school, but throughout all of the war we tried to go on with our lives and to keep things as normal as possible. Winter and Spring sports both were started and the participation level in these sports was high. Now our troops are coming home and we all sympathize with the families who lost loved ones during the Gulf crisis. This year will go down in history and we will remember it for the rest of our lives. This yearbook is dedicated to the men and women who served during Operation Desert Shield/Storm. We are all proud to be Americans and we certainly showed our support during this war.
