As the weeks of steady rainstorms turned into months, farmland, cities and towns in the Midwest suffered flooding of historic proportions. The Great Flood of ' 93 is the second-costliest natural disaster on record in the U.S., causing more than $\$ 12$ billion in damage.

It was a difficult year for Southern California residents. In the fall, brush fires swept over 200,000 acres, causing about $\$ 1$ billion damage. In January, an earthquake shook Los Angeles, destroying thousands of homes, closing freeways, and shutting down many schools. The quake, measuring 6.6, caused 57 deaths and an estimated $\$ 30$ billion damage.



Saying, "I have nothing more to prove," Chicago Bulls star Michael Jordan announced his retirement from the NBA. The announcement ended a roller coaster year during which his team captured another league championship, he was accused of having a gambling problem, and his father was murdered.


Toronto Blue Jay Joe Carter hit a three-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning of the sixth game of the World Series to defeat the Philadelphia Phillies. The come-from-behind victory clinched their second straight World Championship, four games to two.


Nelson Mandela and South Africa President F. W. de Klerk shared the 1993 Nobel Peace Prize for their roles in ending apartheid in their country.

## Renaissance is a program

 of recognition and reward for academic performance. It is based on the management principle that "What gets rewarded and recognized, gets accomplished."

The Renaissance program is a system in which a student can earn one of four cards. Gold Cards are awarded students who earn a 4.0 G.P.A. and have no suspensions. Silver Cards are earned by those students who earn a G.P.A. of 3.5 , have no grades of $D$ or $F$ and have no
suspensions. Green Cards go to students who earn a G.P.A. of 3.0, have no D's or F's and no suspensions. Beginning with the end of the second grading period, a fourth card, the White Card will be earned by those students who improve their G.P.A. by .5, have no grades of $F$ and no sus-
pensions for the quarter.
Cards can be used for various privileges in the school. These include time in the media center for study; ZAP (Zeros are not Permitted) cards for one or two homework assignments during the quarter; AAFES coupons; lunch line privileges on Friday; drawings for prizes and academic award letters and pins for repeated awards. The Renaissance program at Nüernberg Middle/High School is managed by Ms. Elaine Hermann.

## AVID



Major Concepts/ Content: AVID is a language arts based curriculum with emphasis on the writing process and writing as a tool of learning. In addition to inquiry and collaboration, AVID also provides students with academic survival skills i.e. time management, note taking, textbook reading, library research, and study skills workshops. The Cornell note-taking system is taught and students are expected to use this system in all classes.

Essential Objectives: The goal of the AVID program is to prepare underrepresented students to enter and be successful in four-year colleges and universities.

The AVID class takes the place of one elective. Pupils meet daily with the AVID teacher Elaine Hermann
