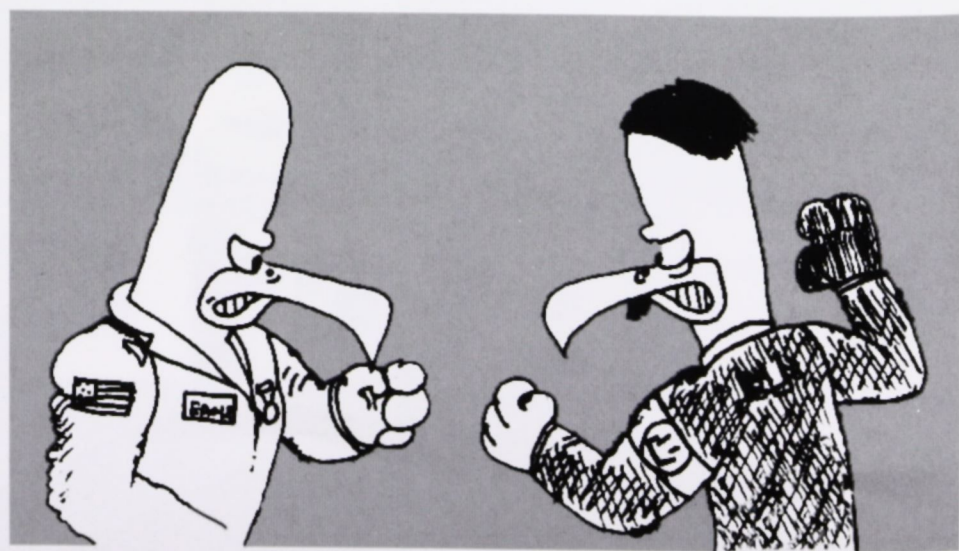
Farewell Nürnberg!

The Old School



The first American dependents to the Nurnberg area arrived in October 1946. The first American school was located in one of the buildings at the University of Erlangen. Students whose parents were stationed over fifty miles away were dorned. The first dorms were vacated German army barracks. There was hot water, but no heating system that worked and the buildings were in a state of disrepair.

For the first few years, the high school averaged fifty to sixty students. The first graduating class, 1947, had eight students. They traveled to Munich for the graduation ceremony, as the Munich school was much larger. At the start of the 1947/48 school year, the senior high and junior high students were merged and the school was located at Tannen Strasse #18 in Fuerth. This was previously a German girls school and a make-shift hospital during the war.

The class of 1948 had four seniors, who again traveled to Munich for the graduation ceremony.

The class of 1949, with twenty-three seniors, was the first class to graduate in Nurnberg / Fuerth.

For some time, the graduating seniors had their diploma



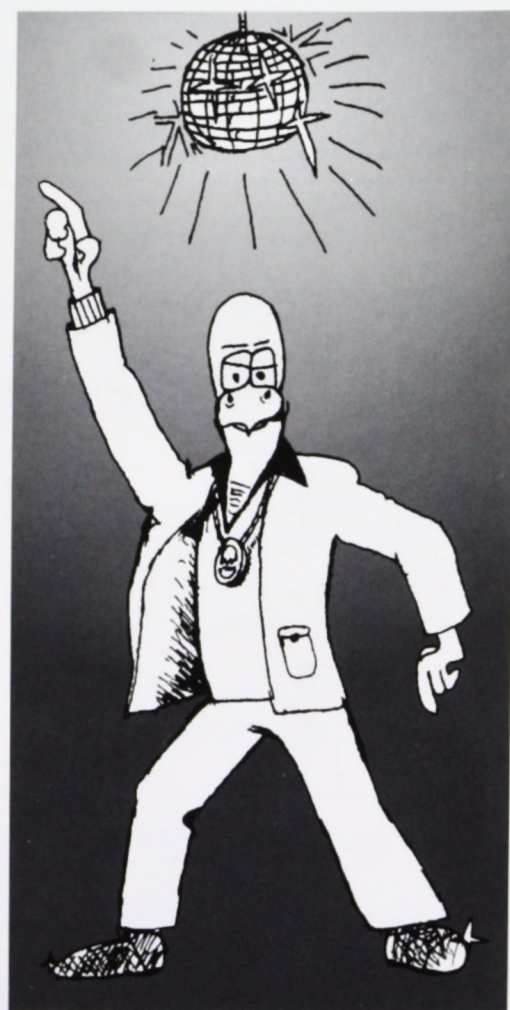
covers made of leather that had been confiscated from a factory that had manufactured German SS officer's coats.

In January 1952 the students moved into the new school at Fronmueller Strasse # 30, where it is still located today.

Numerous additions and modifications have been made to the facility to produce the buildings as they exist today.

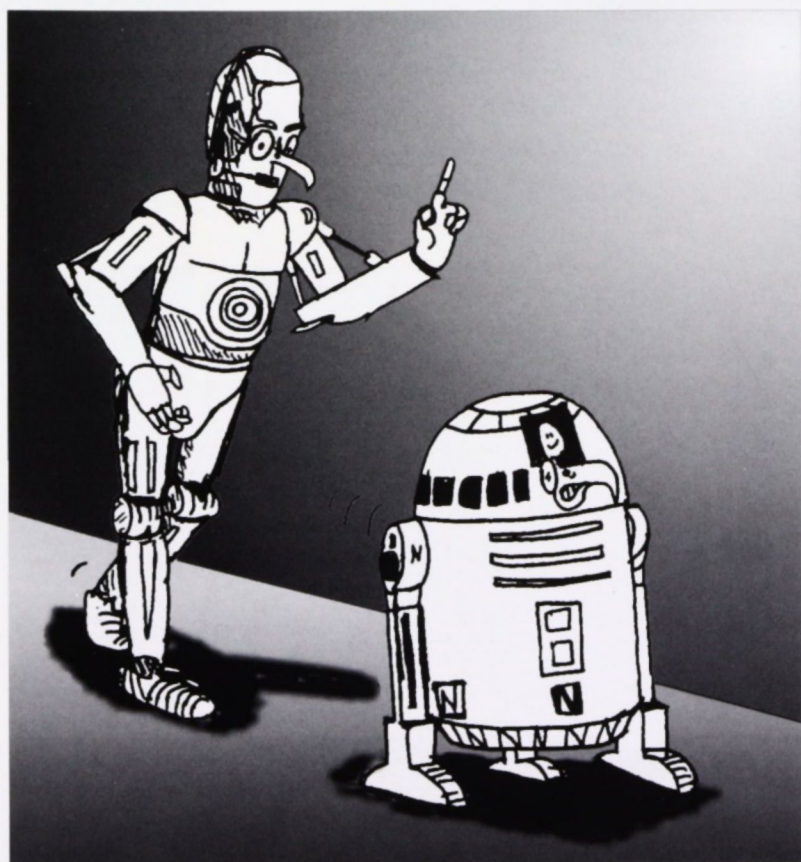

It has been a year to remember. Thank you.

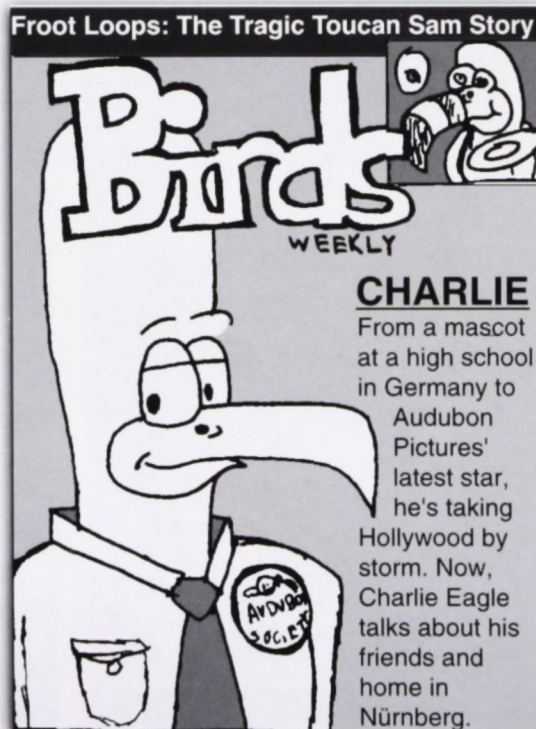

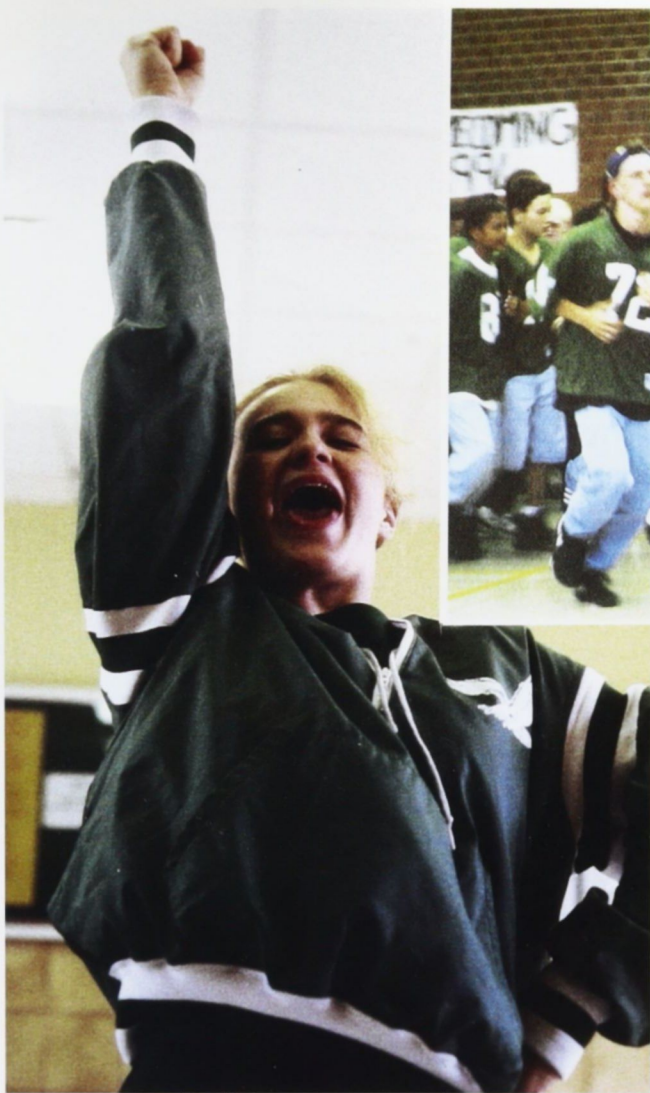

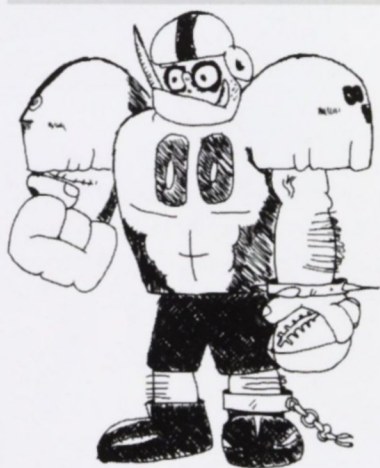

The basketball season produced some all-conference selections from Nürnberg: Kerri Stephensen for the girls and Kristof Robinson for the boys.

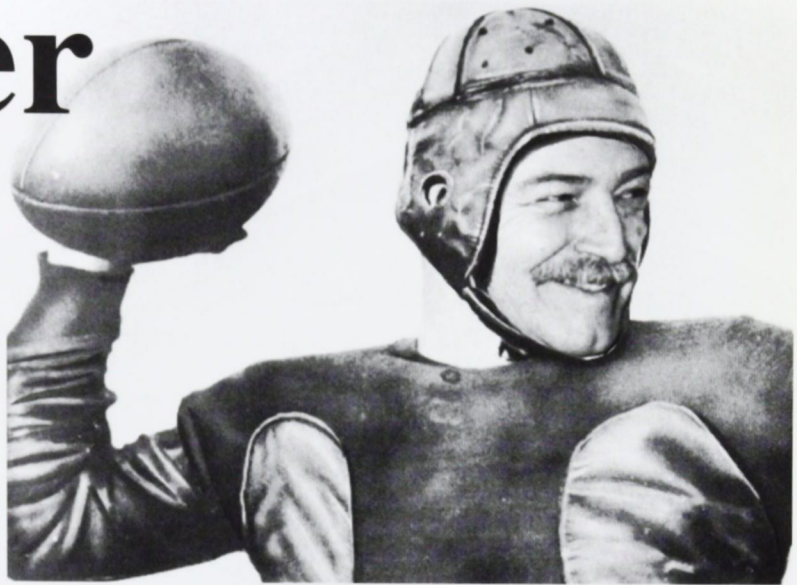
Honorable mentions went to Sara Williams and Carla Tayes for the girls and Dion Whitaker for the boys.

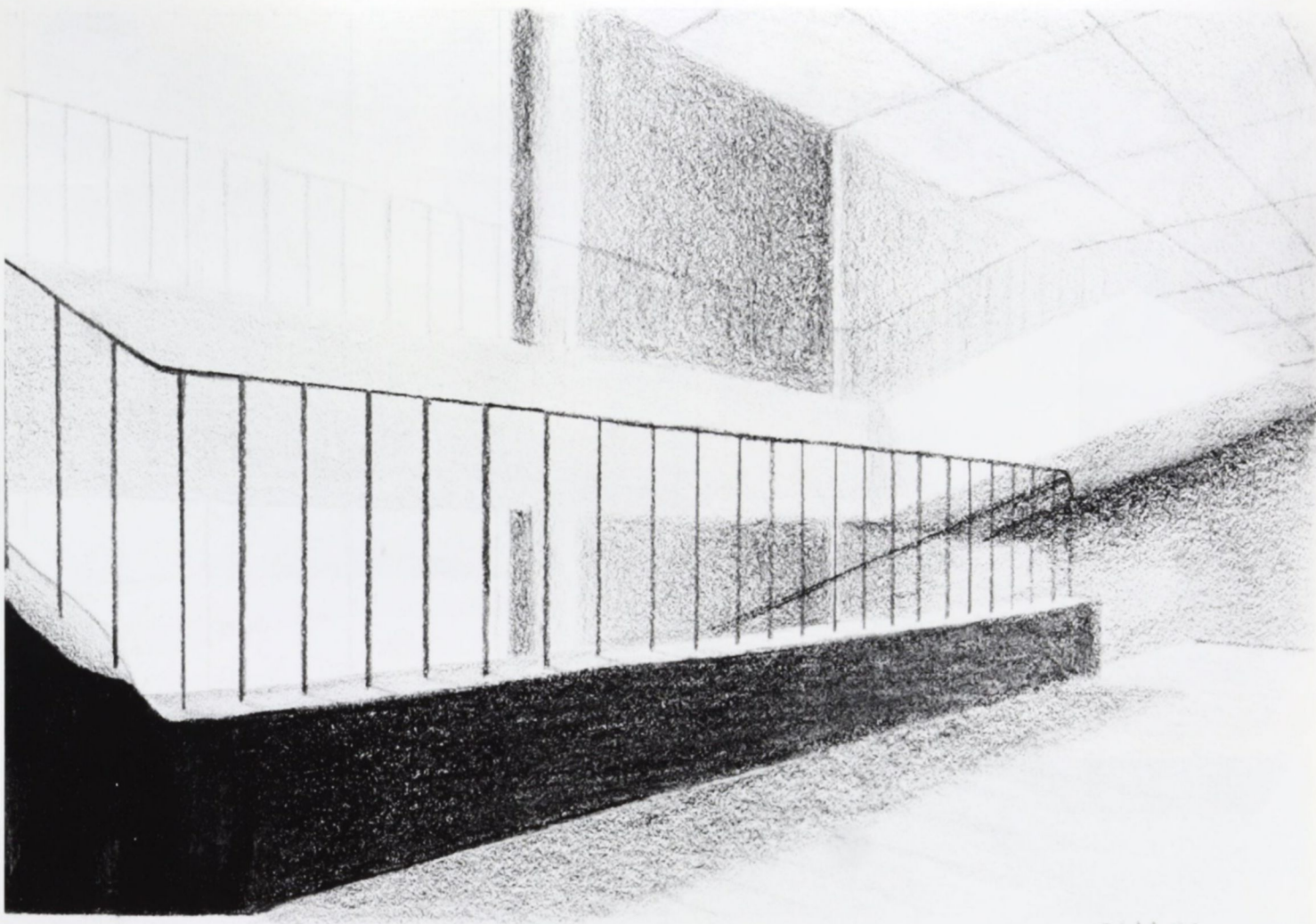

Pencil drawing by Kristof Robinson recreates a scene familiar to Nürnberg students.

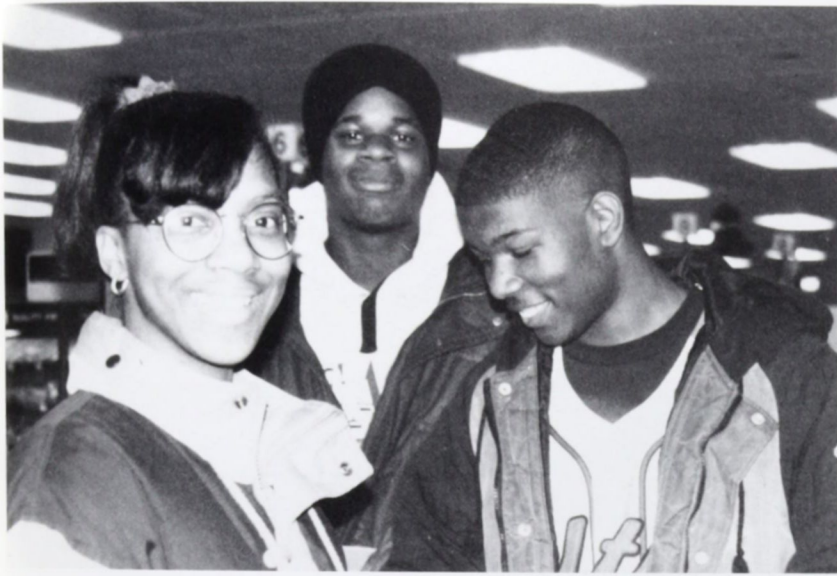

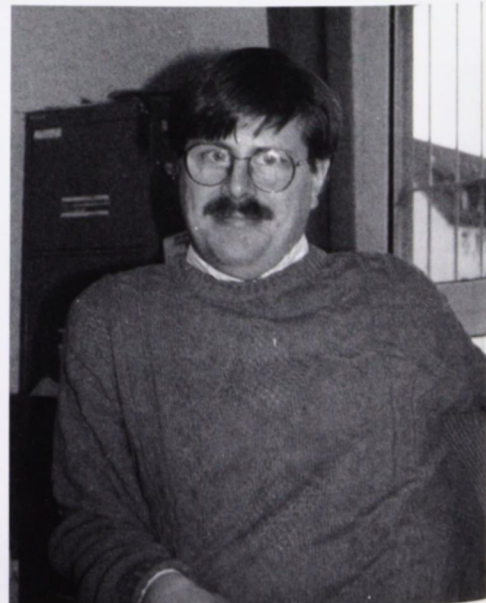

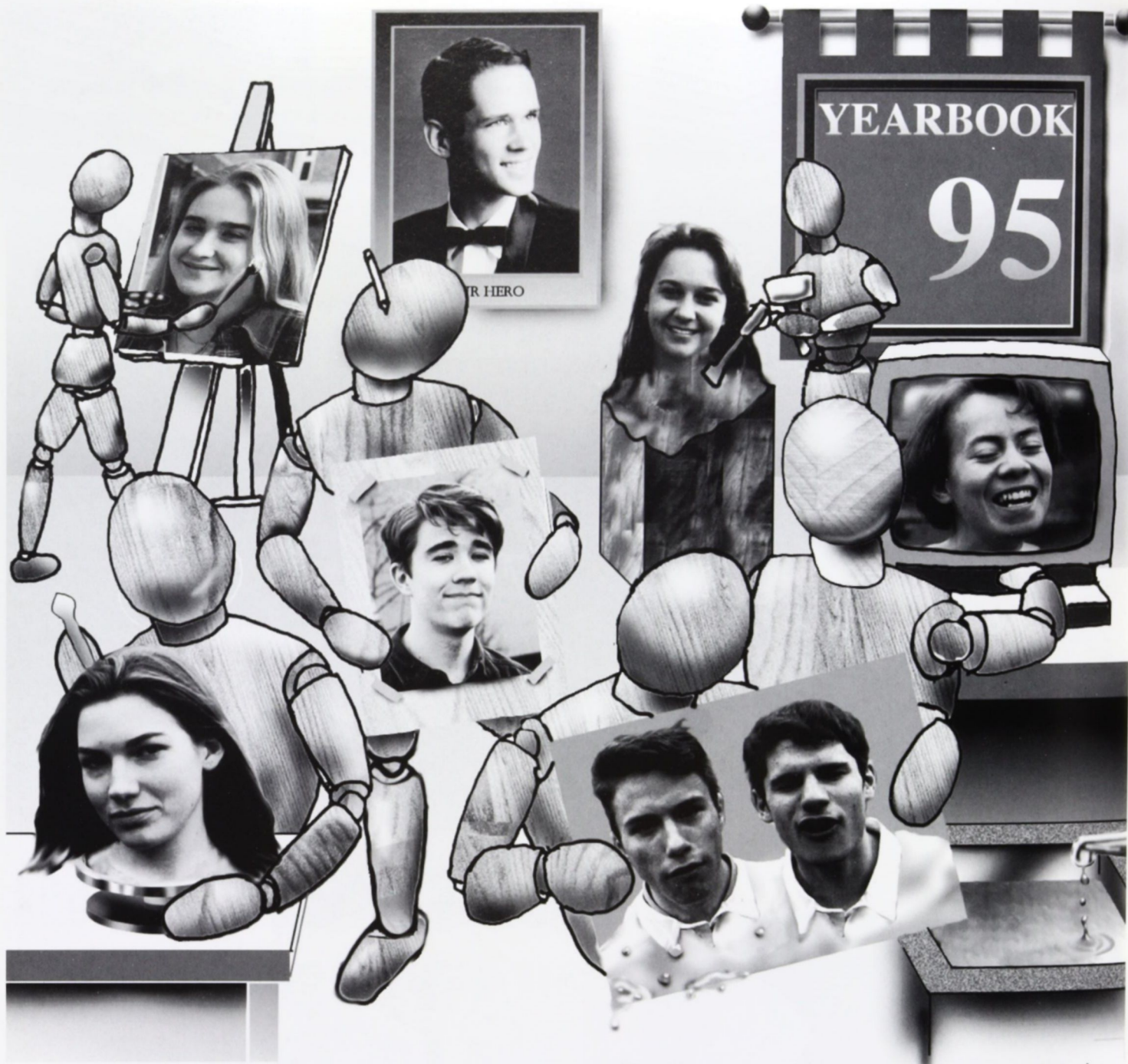
