
Dedication

As we find ourselves at the climax of our High School days and at the threshold of a new life, we recall old acquaintances and past memories.




Looking back on our Freshman year we have found that it whizzed by while we were becoming used to the routine of high school. We know we worked hard and played hard throughout a memorable first year.















