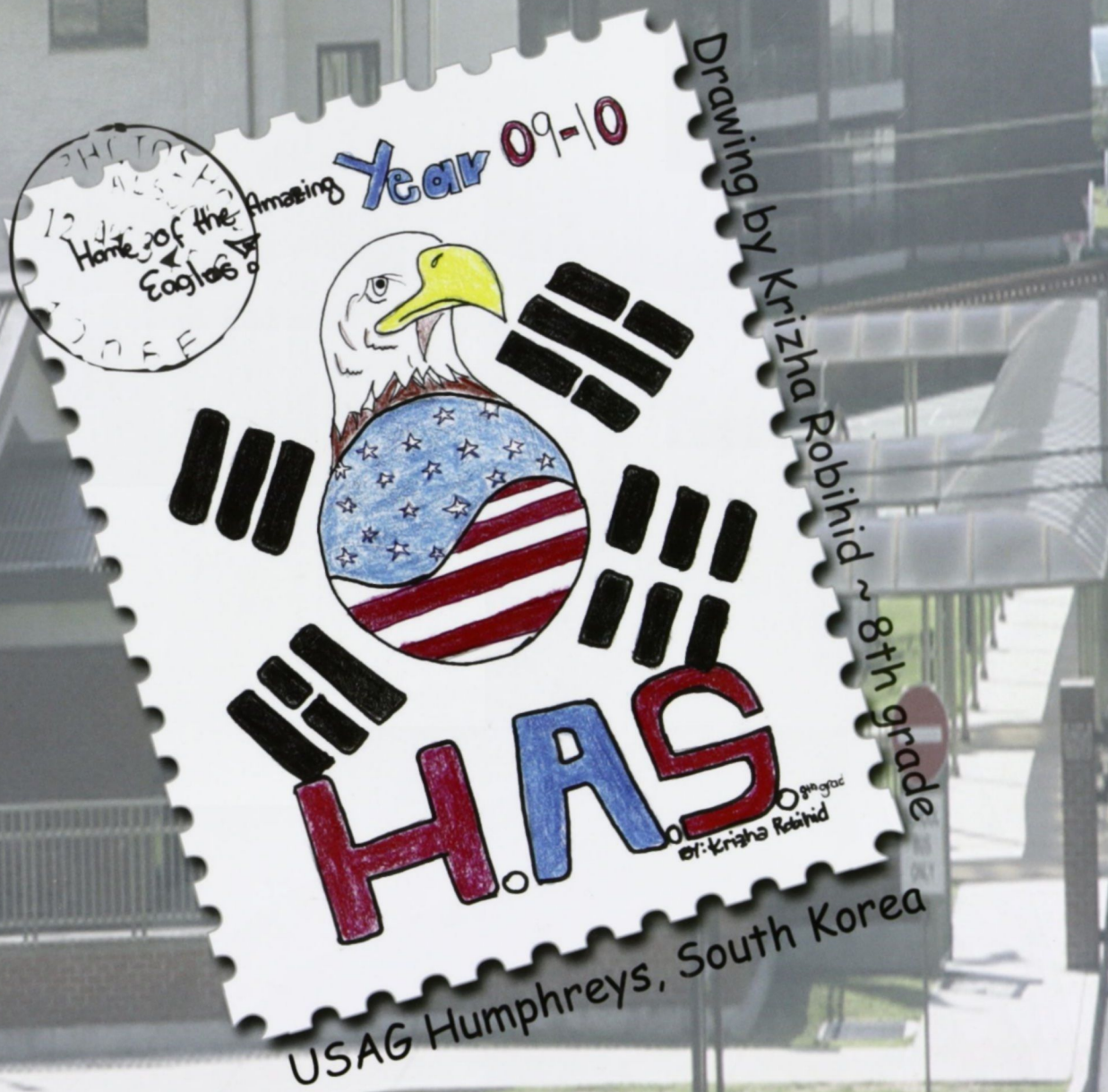

Enrollment has increased to more than three hundred students and a Middle School has emerged ~ housed in the South Campus, the former bowling alley and original elementary school. 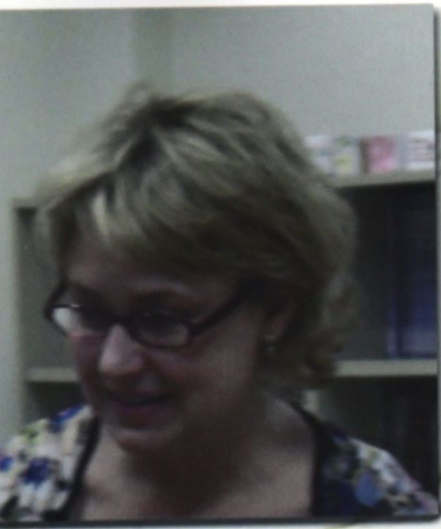






# CSI JUNIORS

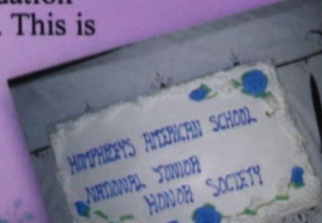




# National Junior Honor Society

# Principal's Tea

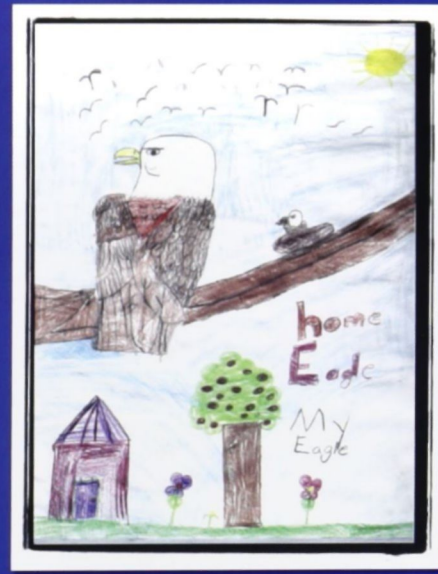
