PROCLAMATION

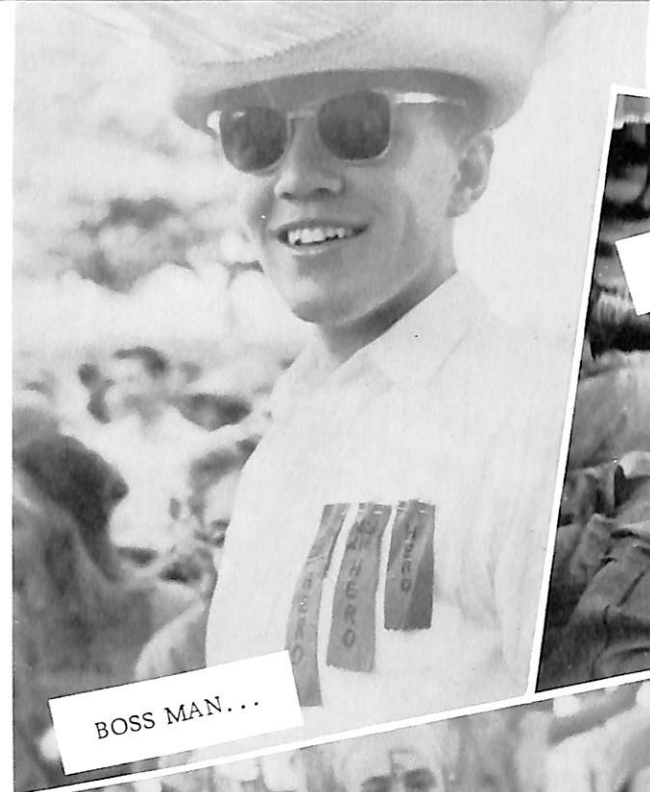
- ARTICLE I: In the best interests of today's sovereign Senior Class, we command this period of invaluable instruction on this day of our Lord, September 26, 1958.

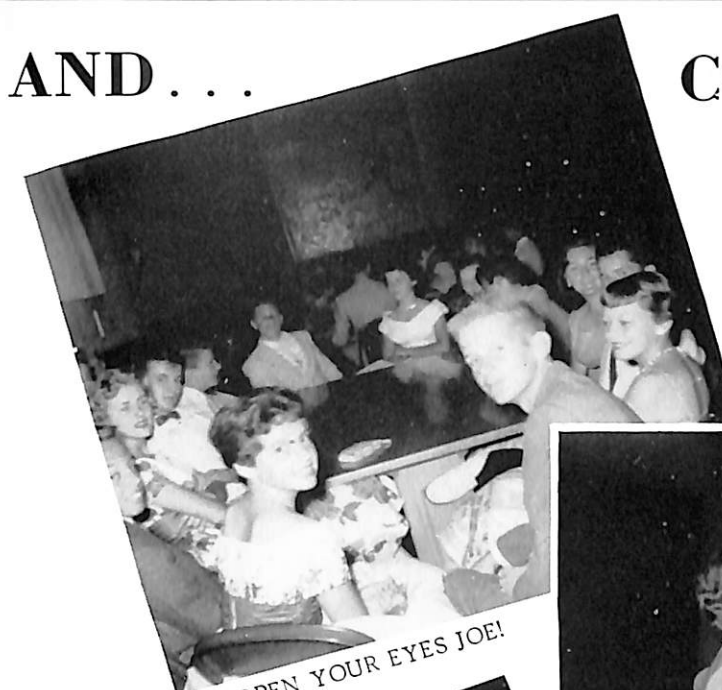
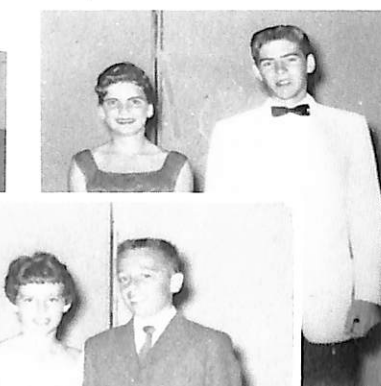
Sweetheart Queen

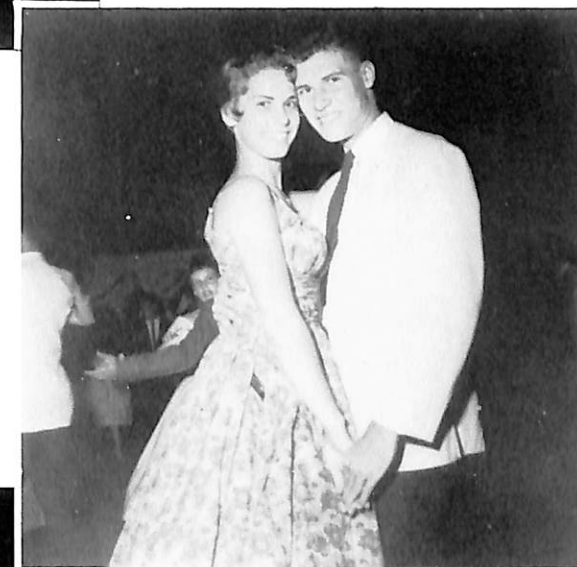

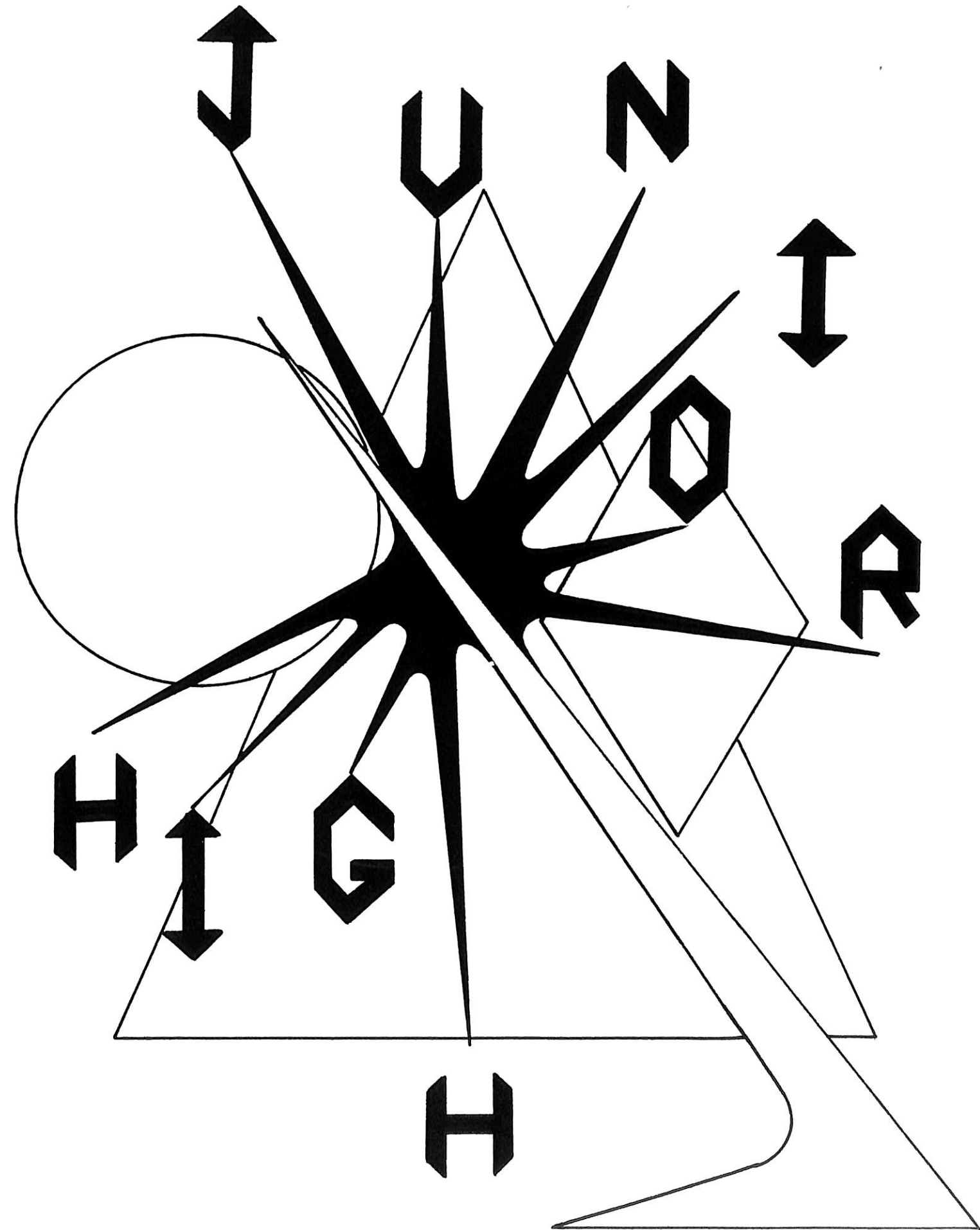


NATIONAL JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY
