 It's a lunch that cannot be beat.



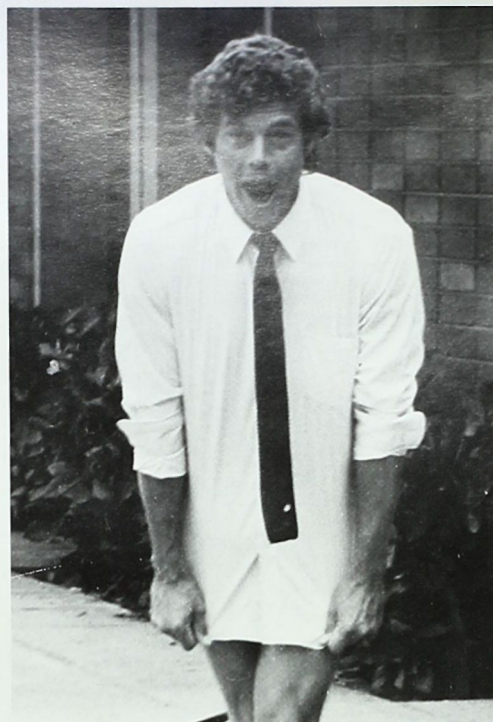
